WITHDRAWAL OF UK BAN

No cheers for Biman, in fact

Cargos not going directly to UK as EU ban remains in place; Biman expecting positive results soon

Nearly three weeks after the UK government's withdrawal of the ban on Dhaka-London direct cargo flights, Bangladeshi exporters are yet to reap any benefit from the decision.

National flag carrier Biman, the only airline having direct flights from Dhaka to London, cannot yet operate such flights because of another ban, slapped by the European Union last year.

As for the international airlines, they still

need to rescreen their UK-bound cargos origi nating from Dhaka at a third country's airport, like they have been doing since March 2016, when the UK ban came into effect.

This rescreening process costs Bangladeshi exporters an additional 10 to 20 cents, depending on the airlines, for shipping each kg of goods.

So the lifting of the British ban means little to Bangladeshi exporters as the EU ban remains in place.

BNP SIT-IN Police make it eventful

An uneventful sit-in staged by BNP in front of Jatiya Press Club was foiled when plainclothes policemen swooped on Chhatra Dal leader Mizanur Rahman Raju yesterday.

BNP leaders and activists began to gather well ahead of the programme amid a large presence of law enforcers and riot control vehicles.

They started the sit-in around 11:00am with senior leaders including Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir demanding release of BNP chairperson Khaleda Zia. Traffic crawled to a halt as hundreds of BNP supporters stood on the road.

With slogans and speeches, the programme was about to end around 11:47am when plainclothes policemen attempted to pick up Chhatra Dal Dhaka north President Mizanur Rahman Raju.

To avoid arrest, he held on to Mirza Fakhrul Islam, who was nearby. As policemen swooped on him and grabbed him, he fell to the

'Proof found in CCTV footage'

Police yesterday said they found proof of a college girl being sexually assaulted in Banglamotor area on Wednesday, an incident about which she opened up on Facebook.

"We found two footage of CCTV installed in the area. We have primarily found that she was sexually assaulted," a police official from the Dhaka Metropolitan Police's cyber security and crime division told The Daily Star yesterday, wishing not to be named. Four to five men were seen making the assault, he said.

"Police also collected the dress the girl was wearing that day," he added.

Meanwhile, the father of the girl filed a case with Ramna Police Station under the Women and Children Repression

Act in connection with the sexual assault. According to the case statement, the incident happened


