CCC office moving to building for poor

Ctg city corporation took money from slum people promising cheap flats, now wants to shift office to the block; mayor says it's for time being

The Chittagong City Corporation took Tk 10,000 each from 33 families of a landslideprone slum five years ago promising to relocate them to an apartment building.

The construction of the seven-storey building was completed in 2016, but the flats have yet to be handed over to the families. Instead, the city corporation now wants to move its office to the block.

The building in the port city's Tigerpass area is part of a rehabilitation scheme recommended by experts after a massive landslide claimed at least 127 lives in Lalkhanbazar area in 2007.

"As promised, we will accommodate them in the flat block. It will take a while as

our existing office is going through some renovation. We will shift our office there but this is for the time being. When the renovation is over, we will hand them their flats," said CCC Mayor AJM Nasir Uddin.

To avoid deaths and damages caused by landslides, experts opined the lowerincome group residing at the foot of hill should be moved to safer places.

In the face of pressure from civic bodies, the then mayor Manjur Alam decided to evict the dwellers of Bottol slum of Tiger Pass, and the construction of the apartment building began in 2013.

Assured of safe accommodation, the families were evicted from the slum which would be around 50 years old.

UN to gather evidence on genocide in Myanmar

The UN has planned to amass evidence of genocide on Rohingyas through a judicial investigation, said United Nations Special Adviser on Genocide Prevention Adama Dieng in a meeting with National **Human Rights Commission** (NHRC) Chairman Kazi Reazul Hoque.

Talking to newsmen after the meeting, the NHRC chief said UN was now trying to amass evidence of five "acts of genocide" as Myanmar military carried out the atrocities on ethnic minority community.


President for life

China okays constitutional changes allowing Xi Jinping to remain in office indefinitely

China removed presidential term limits from its constitution yesterday, giving President Xi Jinping the right to remain in office indefinitely, and confirming his status as the country's most powerful leader since Mao Zedong died more than 40 years ago.

China's ruling Communist Party announced the proposed amendment only last month and there was never any doubt it would pass as parliament is packed with loyal party members who would not have opposed the proposal.



The amendments also include inserting Xi's political theory into the constitution, something that was already added to the party charter in October at the end of a party congress, a feat no other leader since Mao had managed while in office. Additionally, clauses were included to give a

legal framework to a new super anticorruption department.

Only two "no" votes were cast, with three abstentions, from almost 3,000 delegates.

Reporters were briefly ushered from the main hall in the Great Hall of the People as
