Ariful, Summa shine on opening day

The Syed Nazrul Islam National Swimming Complex in Mirpur was not as crowded as is the case during age-group swimming championships, but there was cer-

tainly some enthusiasm among the 121 participating swimmers from eight divisions on the first day of the final phase of the inaugural Bangladesh Youth Games yesterday.

These games are believed to be the platform for talented athletes to be picked for future training and yesterday, the alreadytrained swimmers, who were unearthed through the 'search for the best swimmers' initiative, dominated the pool to share eight gold medals among them.

Approximately 20 swimmers from the long-term training under national coach Park Tae Gun are representing their respective divisions in 14 events -- seven for boys and seven for girls. There are also some BKSP students representing their respective divisions. However, the majority of the participants are raw and seemingly incapable of competing against the trained swimmers.

Ariful Islam of Kishorganj, a former BKSP student and national swimmer hogged the limelight on the first day by bagging three gold medals. Summa Akter of Jhenaidah, the younger sister of national swimmer Sonia Akter Tumpa, won two gold medals.

Also among the gold medals were Al Amin, Rupa Khaun and Khadiza Akter Bristy of Kushtia - all of whom are part of the training camp.

Ariful, the national champion in 50m freestyle and 100 breaststroke events.

Both these swimmers are part of the long- and 100m breaststroke events, is currently in training to take part in the upcoming Commonwealth Games in Australia. He easily outshone other participants in 50m breaststroke and 50m and 100m freestyle events. He has a great chance of adding two more gold medals today in the 200m

However, it was Summa Akter, daughter of a betel-leaf vendor in Jhenaidah, who delighted everyone by winning gold in the 50m and 100m freestyle events. Summa, who enrolled in BKSP in 2014 from a village Madrasa, caught the attention of the selectors during the talent hunt programme after winning a gold medal in 50 freestyle. She had received Tk 5 lakh cash-award from the Prime Minister and used it to turn her father's shop into a grocery.

"I want to be a big swimmer and want to take part in the Olympics like my elder sister [Sonia Akter Tumpa]," Summa said, adding that her first target is to get a place in the national team to represent Bangladesh in the South Asian Games.

Though there were no mentionable swimmers outside the trained-up and BKSP swimmers, Ria Akter of Khulna division, Shrabanti Akter of Chittagong division and Rokeya Akter of Rajshahi division had the satisfaction of returning home with at least a medal each.

Khulna division dominated the pool with five gold medals followed by Dhaka division, who rode on Ariful's efforts to win three gold medals.

However, the first gold medal of the fina phase of the games went to shooter Mehdi Hasan Limon of Rajshahi division. He won golf in boys' 0.177 Open Sight Air Rifle event at the Gulshan Shooting Complex.

Out of six events decided yesterday, Khulna division won two while Dhaka, Mymensingh, Rajshahi and Barisal bagged one apiece.

Barcelona ease past Malaga

Lionel Messi was away attending the birth of his son but Barcelona still had more than enough to beat 10-man Malaga 2-0 on Saturday and move 11 points clear at the top of La Liga.

LaLiga Messi was watching the game on a television in hospital as Luis Suarez and Philippe Coutinho put his team two up inside half an hour at La Rosaleda, before Samuel Garcia was sent off in the 30th minute for a dangerous tackle on Jordi Alba.

Down a man and without a win in 12 matches, Malaga might have feared a rout but Barca settled for a straightforward victory, perhaps with one eye on Wednesday's Champions League last-16 clash against Chelsea. On Messi's withdrawal, Barcelona coach Ernesto Valverde

said: "I found out this [Saturday] morning, before leaving home, I had already been called by the delegate of the club and he had told me the circumstances surrounding Leo.

"We already more or less knew when it might happen. It wasn't very difficult to replace him because I had a clear idea of how the game would go."

Messi is expected back against Chelsea at the Camp Nou, where the score is 1-1 from the first leg, but Valverde will have been delighted with how his attackers filled the void, as Suarez, Coutinho and Ousmane Dembele all had excellent displays.

In particular, Dembele's brilliant turn and pass was bettered only by Coutinho's flicked finish for what was a superb second goal.

"He has that ability," Valverde said of Dembele. "Today I think had more success than at other times, but the good thing is that he always goes at the opponent, always challenges them, always tries to dribble, and we need people like that."

scored twice in a win 4-1 at Bournemouth on Sunday. Spurs move above Liverpool into third in the Premier League, but it was a bittersweet victory with concerns over Kane's fitness for

both club and country. Elsewhere, Arsenal were also comfortable 3-0 winners over Watford at the Emirates Stadium to snap a run of three straight

Premier League defeats. Tottenham had endured a hugely disappointing Champions League exit at the hands of Juventus in midweek and still seemed to be reeling as they struggled in the opening 10 minutes.

Junior Stanislas had already hit the bar with a clear chance before he opened the scoring by firing low into the far corner just seven minutes in. Kane did have the ball in the net when he collided with Asmir Begovic just before the half-hour mark, but the offside flag had already been raised.

And much worse was to come for the visitors when Kane failed to return as he limped away to protect the same right ankle that saw him spend two short spells on the sidelines last season.

Spurs didn't wallow for long, though, as just a minute after Erik Lamela replaced Kane, they levelled when Dele Alli steered home Serge Aurier's excellent cross.

Earlier, Arsenal eased the mounting pressure on Arsene Wenger by easing past Watford for a first Premier League win for five weeks.

Former Borussia Dortmund duo Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang and Henrikh Mkhitaryan again showed their fine relationship for the Gunners by teeing each other up to score in the second half after Shkodran Mustafi had headed the hosts into the lead.

Watford could have got back into the game at 2-0, but Troy Deeney saw his penalty saved by Petr Cech. That was a sweet moment for the home fans, as Deeney had questioned Arsenal's heart when the Hornets won the corresponding fixture in October.

It was the first spot-kick the Czech 'keeper had saved in three years with Arsenal and it ensured he also became the first man to register 200 clean sheets in the Premier League.

"It is an unbelievable personal milestone, but the most important thing is to win and so it was defeats that were more frustrating," said Cech.

Hockey team reach semis

The Bangladesh national hockey team came from a goal down to inflict a massive 5-1 defeat on Hong Kong in their second Pool A match of the Asian Games Qualifiers at the Sultan Qaboos Complex in the Omani capital of Palembang Muscat yesterday.

Bangladesh, who came into the match on 2018 the back of a 5-0 demolition of Thailand, were stunned 15 minutes into the game when IU Felix Chi Him converted a penalty corner for Hong Kong, a team Bangladesh had defeated 4-2 in the Hockey World League Round-1 in 2016.

The men in red and green were then made to toil hard as they aimed to circumvent the sturdy defense of Hong Kong-- who themselves came into the match after a jaw-dropping 19-1 win against Afghanistan -- in the second quarter before finally leveling the margin in the third quarter through a penalty stroke which was converted by specialist Ashraful Islam in the 33rd minute.

Two minutes later, Ashraful was on the mark again, giving Bangladesh the lead by converting a penalty corner under floodlights.

Bangladesh continued to press after taking the lead and Roman Sarker made it 3-1 in the 47th minute, converting another penalty corner. Captain Rasel Mahmud Jimmy extended the lead to 4-1 in the 58th minute before Milon Hossain wrapped up the win by scoring in the final minute. A second win from as many matches means Bangladesh

confirmed their berth in the semifinal ahead of their match against lightweights Afghanistan in their third and final pool match tomorrow.

Door is open for Neymar, says Rakitic

Barcelona midfielder Ivan Rakitic would welcome back Neymar to the Nou Camp with open arms as rumours continue to swirl that the Brazilian forward regrets his record transfer to Paris Saint-Germain.

Neymar is recovering from foot surgery in Brazil and missed PSG's 2-1 defeat by Real Madrid which dumped the French side out of the Champions League on Tuesday, after which Spanish media reported the forward was unsettled in Paris and has told former team mates he wants to return to Barca.

"He hasn't said anything to me, but if it were up to me, I'd open the door up to him right now," Rakitic told reporters on Saturday after Barca's 2-0 win at Malaga. "It's not just because I have a good relationship with him, but because of the type of player he is. I would always pick Neymarin my team."

Neymar scored 28 goals for PSG before injuring his metatarsal against Marseille on February 26.
