PAOK PRESIDENT INVADES PITCH WITH A GUN

The Greek top-flight match between PAOK Salonika and AEK Athens on Sunday was abandoned after PAOK's president invaded the pitch with a gun. Ivan Savvidis tried to confront the referee with a gun in a hip holster after his side had an 89th-minute goal ruled offside with the score 0-0. AEK's players left the pitch concerned for their safety and did not return. The match was officially abandoned two hours later and it was reported the referee had reversed his decision. Fifa said it is "aware" of the incident and "fully condemns such behaviour" but added that any disciplinary measures "fall under the jurisdiction of the Greek FA". Greece's deputy culture and sports minister Georgios Vassiliadis said the situation called for "bold decisions". Savvidis, one of Greece's richest men, was born in Georgia of Greek heritage and is a former member of the Russian parliament. He asked his team to leave the pitch following the offside decision then marched towards the referee before being pulled back by bodyguards.

"This is my second time playing in an overseas league. I have played in the

Maldives Football League and Futsal League a few times. But the difference in class in terms of football between the two countries is huge. This will be highly competitive as there will be many foreign footballers there. However, this is our opportunity to showcase our skill and talent. I hope both of us play well and create opportunities for future women footballers from Bangladesh to feature in such leagues," the veteran striker, who scored 22 goals in the Maldives Women's Football League in 2015 apart from scoring plenty in the two editions of Futsal Leagues there, said during a press conference at the BFF House yesterday.

"Both players are very good and they are physically very fit. National women's team coach Golam Rabbani Choton said. "I hope they will prove their worth and pave the way for more women footballers from Bangladesh."

The press conference was attended, among others, by BFF Women's Wing chairman and FIFA member Mahfuza Akter Kiron, BFF general secretary Abu Nayeem Shohag and the federation's strategic director Paul Smalley.

FIDE chief urges more

The chief executive officer of the World Chess Federation (FIDE), Geoffrey Borg, has urged Bangladesh's govern-

ment and chess federation to take the sport to a new height by investing in schools. The FIDE official, who arrived in

Bangladesh on Saturday for a four-day tour, made this request before the media after having met with the sports minister, sports secretary and other high-ups of the Bangladesh Chess Federation.

Though Bangladesh produced the first Grand Master of the sub-continent, Niaz Murshed, the nation has fallen behind neighbouring India, who boasts nearly 47 Grand Masters as opposed to Bangladesh's five.

"This is an opportunity to evaluate chess in Bangladesh. I have actually been involved in this area and that's why we evaluate scope for development as there have been where Bangladesh is today. Bangladesh have no investment at school level yet and since five Grand Masters and technically they play they will work together with the FIDE.

"Following the meeting with the minister and secretary of the sports ministry, the secretary general of the Bangladesh Olympic Association and the president of the Bangladesh Chess Federation, we all agreed that we should begin long-term training in chess, not only to create new players but to also develop the future citizens of Bangladesh," said Borg, who is also the president of the Malta Chess Federation.

"We need to particularly invest in development of chess at schools. All that's left is to involve the ministry of education, which is also ready to work with us, and to encourage the federation to make the programme solid," Borg continued. "However, we know that this requires a significant investment at the grassroots level."

Borg believes that Bangladesh is technically capable enough to reach a higher level of the sport. He added that there is a wide

Badminton, table tennis conclude

Though the going had been tough for budding athletes participating in their respective events of the inaugural Bangladesh Youth Games at the Shaheed Tajuddin Ahmed Indoor Stadium, the shuttlers and table tennis players enjoyed every moment of yesterday, despite all the air-conditioners

being switched off.

The wooden floor was divided into two parts -- one side for table tennis and the other for badminton - and the athletes could be seen sweating profusely during their respective matches. However, none of them seemed hindered by the heat as they fought till the last to show their talents.

Just like the swimming events, trained and experienced players dominated across all the table tennis and badminton fixtures, save a couple of games where those players lacked the experience to play at the top level.

Out of 32 boys there were nine promising players, trained at the BKSP, representing their respective districts while a good number of boys and girls who were unearthed through the talent hunt programme, conducted by the National Sports Council last year, were also participating.

In the boy's single table tennis encounter between two national junior champions -- Hridoy of Rangpur division and Sabbir of Khulna division -- Hridoy won the gold 3-0 while national senior championship semifinalist Sadia Rahman Mou of Khulna division beat Tushi, who is from the same division, 3-1 to win gold in the girl's single event.

All the medals across six events -- three each for boys and girls - went to athletes who have already been playing in the youth and national championships as well as the leagues in Dhaka. Therefore, there was no one to pick out in particular from these games.

"Table tennis is a game where an unidentified player can't upset trained players because players improve step by step," said table tennis coach-cum-judge Hafizur Rahman yesterday.

However, he added that there are a few promising players such as Emon, Rahim Leon, Hridoy, Mou, Tushi and Asha, who can improve significantly if provided better training in the future.

Likewise, trained shuttlers dominated the badminton scene as Sylhet's national under-18champion Lokman and Chittagong's national U-15 champion Sibgat moved into the boy's single final. U-18 champion Urmi Akter of Khulna and U-15 champion Jerin also moved into the girl's single

However, Bangladesh Badminton Federation joint secretary Zahidul Haque Kochi was not happy with the results from badminton as the recognised juniors dominated the

show. "The Bangladesh Olympic Association (BOA) should make an idea of how to bring up the talent from grass-root levels but they did not consult with us. Badminton has some pockets from where a lot shuttlers are coming but the BOA has allowed only the divisional champions to take part in the badminton event, thus paving the way for a one-sided affair. If the divisional runners-up were also allowed, then the competition would have been more competitive and we would have gotten some new players," said Kochi, adding that the difference between the trained and raw players is huge during competitions.
