#### Danny Boyle working on "Bond 25"

"Slumdog Millionaire" director Danny Boyle has confirmed that he's working on the next James Bond movie.

The filmmaker made the admission to Metro New York on Wednesday night at a special screening in New York of his new FX series "Trust".



"We are working on a script right now," he said when asked if he's directing the next film in the franchise. "And it all depends on that, really. I am working on a Richard Curtis script at the moment. We hope to start shooting that in six or seven weeks. Then Bond would be right at the end of the year. But we are working on them both right now."

Boyle has long been in MGM and Eon's sights to board a Bond movie, dating back to 2012's "Skyfall" and 2015's "Spectre", reports Variety.

He also said he does not yet know the details of when and where "Bond 25" will shoot. Daniel Craig is set to return to star in the new Bond movie. MGM and Eon announced in July that the film would open on Nov. 8, 2019.

### **Kanthashilon's Waheedul** Haq Fest ends today

As a tribute to cultural luminary and Tagore exponent Waheedul Haque, reputed cultural organization Kanthashilon has arranged a twoday (March 16-17) festival titled 'Waheedul Haq Memorial Festival-2018', marking the iconic figure's 85th birth anniversary. The festival is being held at the Shawkat Osman Memorial auditorium of Central Public Library, Shahbagh in the capital.

Apart from various cultural performances by the artistes of Kanthashilon, different cultural organisations and solo artistes presented poems, songs, dances, instrumental recitals, Brotochari dance, jarigaan, palagaan, puNthipaath and more.

The festival began yesterday morning with hoisting of National Flag together with the rendition of National Anthem and inaugural song by the artistes of Surotirtha.

Rameshwar led his troupe playing pulsating beats of dhak-dhol while noted dancer Tamanna Rahman and her troupe performed Manipuri dance. The inauguration ceremony took place at

the auditorium. Eminent cultural personality and journalist Kamal Lohani graced the occasion as chief guest while thespian Ataur Rahman, Shadhin Bangla Betar Kendra artiste veteran Ashraful Alam and noted poet Tarik Sujat attended the event as special guests. Waheedul Haq (March 16, 1933-January 27, 2007) is one of the pioneers of the 20th century cultural movement of the Banglaees. A Tagore expert, musicologist and journalist, he founded a number of significant cultural organisations including Chhayanaut, Kanthashilon, Nalonda, Fulki and the Jatiyo Rabindra Sangeet Sammelan Parishad. In his journalistic career, he went through the Morning News, the Bangladesh Observer, the New Nation and, finally, The Daily Star.

Star Cineplex Chairman Mahbub Rahman, who handed over the awards to the winners, said, "This is for the third time that we are arranging this kind of contest and we have different themes every time. It is the youth who are to come up with solutions of big problems, which is why we are involving them to make films on crucial subjects such as road accident, drug abuse etc.," he added. He also said that the champion will get an opportunity to make a film to be screened internationally.

ued through a number of DC comic book series over the past four decades, as well as forming the basis for storylines in animated series and DC's recent live-action movies; the villain Steppenwolf and the Mother Box from last year's "Justice League" are both Kirby creations from the Fourth World Saga.

DuVernay has considered jumping into the world of comic books before, having passed on directing Marvel's "Black Panther", based on the character Kirby created with Stan Lee in 1966.
