'I THINK MY **TEACHER WILL UNDERSTAND**'

There's a new 'New Neymar' in town and his name is Rodrygo Goes, the prodigious teenage sensation currently causing an uproar at Santos. At just 17 years, two months and six days old, Rodrygo became the youngest ever player to score in the Copa Libertadores after finding the net in Santos' 3-1 win over Nacional of Uruguay on Thursday evening. The goal itself was actually rather reminiscent of the young Neymar, with Rodrygo picking the ball up on the half-way line, burning a defender for pace and then poking a shot through the Nacional goalkeeper's legs from a tight angle. In scoring, Rodrygo broke the record held by former Werder Bremen midfielder Diego (set in 2003) to become the youngest goalscorer in the 58-year history of the Copa Libertadores. However, speaking at a press conference after the match, the precocious Santos forward still had an apology to make: "I'm happy to be the youngest to score. It's a dream coming true. About skipping school [to play], I think the teachers will understand."

Chelsea take Messi shines in Bilbao win

Lionel Messi delivered another masterful performance as Barcelona sailed past Athletic Bilbao 2-0 on Sunday to take an 11point lead over nearest rivals Atletico Madrid in La Liga.

After putting Chelsea to the sword in the Champions League midweek, Messi scored for the sixth game in a row against Athletic at the Camp Nou to propel Barca closer to the domestic title. "Every day he discovers something

new, something different, he's very aware of what he has to do, what the team needs from him at each moment," Barca coach Erneste Valverde said of Messi, the Spanish league's leading scorer this season with 25 goals.

"Many times it seems that the coach has to teach the players, but what the coach really does is learn alongside them as things go on. We hope to keep on learning together."

A dominant start from Barca yielded the opening goal after just eight minutes as Messi found Jordi can lose, win or draw the next game," this season.

Alba out on the left, his pull back neatly side-footed into the far corner by Paco Alcacer, filling in for the suspended Luis Suarez.

The hosts looked a constant threat early on and Philippe Coutinho was denied a second when he rattled the woodwork, while Ousmane Dembele should have done much better with just Kepa Arrizabalaga to beat. Valverde said. "We're not going to tempt fate. The next match in Seville will be a very difficult trip."

Second-placed Atletico effectively surrendered their hopes of overhauling Barca at the top, as two late goals from 20-year-old Turkey striker Enes Unal handed Villarreal a 2-1 victory over Diego Simeone's side.

Antoine Griezmann converted a first-half penalty after he was impeded by Jaume Costa, before Koke hit the post. But Unal headed in an 82ndminute equaliser for the hosts and turned home a stoppage-time winner as Villarreal climbed up to fifth.

Real Madrid can reclaim third place from Valencia at home to Girona later on Sunday.

Earlier, Sevilla crashed to a 2-1 league defeat to Leganes just days after pulling off the surprise elimination of Manchester United in the Champions League.

The loss means Sevilla are increasingly unlikely to qualify for the Champions League through La Liga

Booters fly for Thailand today

The national football team will fly out for Thailand today for the final preparation phase before taking on Laos in a FIFA friendly match, the

first international match for Bangladesh since their shock 3-1 defeat against Bhutan in the Asian Cup playoffs in October, 2016.

The booters have been in preparation since early February and have already passed two phases -- BKSP and Qatar -ahead of the final phase in Thailand where they will play two warm-up matches against Ratchaburi Mitr Phol FC and Bangkok Glass FC on March 21 and 23 respectively before heading to Laos for the FIFA friendly on March 27.

Head coach Andrew Ord picked his 23member squad after yesterday's training session.

Ord, who is going to guide the team for the first time since his appointment in June last year, believes the third-phase of training is going to be the toughest one for

"After good preparation in BKSP and Qatar, the hardest part of training is in Thailand with the players coming in from Abahani. They can help improve the quality and improve the depth of the squad. The real challenge is for everybody to get the same pace quickly as we will get two fantastic games in Thailand.

"It is a really good test for the players. I believe Thai football would be better than that of Laos. So the style of play from the Thai premier league teams is going to be the same that we are going to face in Laos" Ord

said at a press conference at the BFF House yesterday.

The Australian did not make any promises for victory against Laos, rather he wants to see Bangladesh as a team, with strong mentality and availing the opportunities that they would get.

"The expectation [from the Laos match] is to perform like a national team and we have got to look like a football team which was missing in past. We have to go to the pitch with a strong mentality; we have to show the physical capability and confidence and have to try to play according to our strength. The key is to keep possession to press on the opponents and avail the chances we will create. We need to explore everything to win the game. So I am looking forward," said the 38-year-old.

Scoring has been a big concern for the Bangladesh team and there is hardly any recognised striker in the ranks. However, Ord is optimistic with Abahani forward Nabib Newaj Jibon.

"I am more excited with Jibon than any other Abahani player. I am a not a negative coach. Jibon is a player I am looking forward to work with. Abahani won the league and Jibon played matches every week. I think he can help the team in the attacking third," said Ord.

Even though the coach did not make any promises, winger Faisal Mahmud seemed confident about winning.

"All the preparation has been designed keeping the match against Laos in mind. If we don't concede any goals and avail the opportunities we can create, I am hopeful we will win the match against Laos," said the veteran.

'Mo can succeed Messi'



Liverpool manager Premier Jurgen Klopp League believes comparisons between

Mohamed Salah and Barcelona's five-time Ballon d'Or winner Lionel Messi are premature, but that the Egyptian is on his way to one day becoming the best player in the world.

Salah's stunning season continued with a four-goal haul in a 5-0 thrashing of Watford to take his tally for the season to 36 on Saturday -- the most goals ever scored by a Liverpool player in their debut year at the club.

Klopp believes Salah, 25, has time on his side to succeed Messi and Real Madrid rival Cristiano Ronaldo, both now in their thirties, as the world's best player.

"I think Mo is on the way (to being the best in the world)," said Klopp. "I don't think Mo or anybody else wants to be compared with Lionel Messi. He is the one who is doing what he's doing for what feels like 20 years or so."

And Klopp challenged Salah to maintain the standards he has set this season. "As it always is in life, if you have the

skills, you have to show that constantly, and consistently he is very good and he helps us a lot."

'No personality, no class, no desire'

Mourinho lays into his players after win

Jose Mourinho launched an astonishing verbal tirade against his Manchester United players after they reached the FA Cup semifinals, accusing them of "a lack of personality, lack of class and lack of desire."

Just 24 hours after the United manager had made a memorable defence of his own record in the pre-match press conference, Mourinho turned his attention to his players after a comfortable 2-0 quarter-final victory over Brighton.

Only Nemanja Matic, who set up the opening goal for Romelu Lukaku before scoring a late second himself, and youngster Scott McTominay were spared massive criticism.

And after Mourinho claimed he was looking for a response to the midweek Champions League exit to Sevilla, the Portuguese veteran even claimed some of his players lacked the personality and desire to play for the famous Premier League club.

"I didn't like the game," said Mourinho. "I think we deserved to win but I didn't have the reaction from all of them.

"I had the reaction from some of them. Some of them were mentally strong enough with the football quality to play -- that was the reason we won.

"But a team of 11, when you have a minimum of six or seven players performing and wanting to play, who want the responsibility to have the ball, who have the desire really to play -- it is difficult to have a good performance. So I am not happy with the performance all all. But I am happy with the result."

England full-back Luke Shaw was the one player named by Mourinho as having failed to follow his game plan and was, accordingly, substituted at half-time. That made Shaw an obvious target for Mourinho to be questioned about although the United manager clearly had other players in mind when issuing his widespread critique.

"I wanted more personality in the team because many, many times I felt that Matic was an island of personality, desire and control surrounded by lack of personality, lack of class and lack of desire.

"I have to say that for example McTominay lost more passes today in all the matches he played put together but he was a Manchester United player.

"And for me a Manchester United player is one who when he plays badly still gives to the team. That is a question of personality, that is a Manchester United player for me. And that is what some of the others did not have."
