Colossal loss

Buet study finds traffic jam eats up 5 million working hours a day in Dhaka

Traffic congestion in Dhaka eats up around 5 million working hours every day and the average speed of vehicles during rush hours has come down to 5kmph, according to the Accident Research Institute of Buet.

The congestion causes an annual loss of between Tk 20,000 crore and Tk 55,000 crore, says ARI, citing findings of organisations working on the issue.

"However, about 50 to 70 percent of the losses can be avoided through proper actions," ARI Director Prof Moazzem Hossain told a roundtable yesterday.

"Sixty percent of Tk 37,000 crore [half way between Tk 20,000 crore and Tk 55,000 crore] can be saved by those actions," he said,

Talking to The Daily Star later, Moazzem, a teacher at Buet's Civil Engineering department, said the ARI came up with the estimates analysing available data, including that of Government's Revised Strategic Transport Plan (RSTP) and Dhaka Urban Transport Network Development Study. ARI and Road Safety Foundation, an organisation work-

ing for safe roads and driving, organised the roundtable titled "Traffic Congestion in Dhaka City: Economic and Health Problems" at the ARI building. In July last year, a World Bank analysis had said in the last

10 years, average traffic speed in Dhaka dropped from 21kmph (kilometres per hour) to 7kmph, which was slightly above the average walking speed. The speed may drop to 4kmph by 2035, slower than the

walking speed, it added. "Congestion in Dhaka eats up 3.2 million work hours



NY man faces life term in jail

A New York City man was convicted Friday of first-degree murder for the broad daylight killings of a Bangladeshi Muslim cleric and his assistant.

A state supreme

court jury convicted Oscar Morel, 37, in the fatal shootings of Imam Maulana Akonjee and Thara Uddin, his friend and assistant. The men were shot as they walked home following prayers on August 13, 2016.

Richard A Brown, district attorney of the borough of Queens, called the killings "a senseless act of gun violence in the middle of the afternoon and carried out in a close-knit neighborhood filled with families and children."

Brown said in a statement that he hopes

Saudi Arabia opens airspace to Israel

Air India flight lands in Tel Aviv flying over Saudi airspace

Air India has launched the first scheduled service to Israel to be allowed to cross Saudi airspace, a sign of a behind-the-scenes improvement in ties between the Arab kingdom and the Jewish state.

Flight AI 139 landed at Tel Aviv's Ben Gurion airport about 30 minutes after its scheduled arrival time of 1945 GMT Thursday.

"This is a historic moment," Israeli Transport Minister Yisrael Katz told AFP on the tarmac as the Boeing Dreamliner rolled to a halt.

"It is the first time that there is an official connection between the state of

Israel and Saudi Arabia," he said in Hebrew. Tourism Minister Yariv Levin was also there to welcome the flight.

"A new era has begun," he said.

There will now be three flights weekly in each direction, ending a decades-long Saudi ban on the use of its airspace for commercial flights to

Israel's national carrier El Al currently operates an India service to Mumbai that takes a detour over the Red Sea to avoid flying over Saudi

Unknown people abducted two college teachers in Rajshahi's Charghat upazila yesterday.

One of the teachers, Bazrul Islam, returned hours after the incident. The other teacher, Shafiqur Rahman, remained traceless.

Bazrul teaches Political Science and Shafiq English at Dakra Degree College in the upazila.

Quoting Bazrul, Charghat Police Station Officer-in-Charge Nazrul Islam said two unidentified men came in a motorcycle and intercepted Bazrul and Shafiq in Anupompur village around 11:00am while the two teachers were on their way home in another motorcycle.
