ACC issues notice to former chairman of Farmers Bank's executive body Chisty, family members and 11 others

The Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) yesterday issued a notice asking ex-chairman of the Farmers Bank's executive committee Mahabubul Haque Chisty, his family members and 11 others not to leave the country.

ACC issued the notice as the commission is inquiring a recent scam of the bank.

ACC sent copies of the notice to senior secretary of home ministry and additional commissioner of police (special branch), said ACC's Public Relations Officer (PRO) Pranab Kumar Bhattacharya.

Family members are Chisty's wife Rozi Chisty, sons Rashedul Haque Chisty and Majedul Haque Chisty, daughter Rimi Chisty and daughter-in-law Farhana Ahmed.

Others are Farmer Bank's former managing director AKM Shamim, current Deputy Managing Director (DMD) Abdul Motaleb Patwary, Senior Executive Vice President Gazi Salahuddin, Executive Vice President Mohammed Zahangir Alam Mozumder, Senior Vice President Zia Uddin Ahmed, Vice President Lutful Hoque, Vice President Manirul Haque, First Vice President Tafazzal Hossain, Assistant Vice President Mohammad Shamsul Hasan Bhuiyan,

First freight train from India reaches Bangladesh

The first freight train from India reached Darshana International Railway Station in Chuadanga yesterday.

Starting from Kolkata, the train carrying 60 containers arrived at Darshana around 6:00pm, said Liakat Ali, station master of the railway station.

He said the train will stay there during night and will start for Dhaka today morning.

Bangladeshi high officials will receive the train at the Bangabandhu Bridge West Railway Station in Sirajganj on its way to Dhaka, Liakat said.

This is pursuant to the signing of a MoU between the Container Corporation of India Limited (CONCOR) and Container Company of Bangladesh Limited (CCBL) for starting the container services between the two countries during the visit of the prime

WAR CRIMES 16 Cox's Bazar men indicted

The International Crimes Tribunal-1 yesterday framed 10 charges against 16 Cox's Bazar men in a case filed for allegedly committing crimes during the Liberation War in 1971.

The 3-member tribunal led by Justice Md Shahinur Islam also fixed May 13 for starting trial with recording testimony of prosecution witnesses, Prosecutor Tapash Kanti Baul said.

The prosecution on March 15, 2016 pressed 12 charges against 19 men including the 16 people.

But, names of two accused were dropped as they already died while name another accused was removed as prosecution could not give his required particulars.

Among the 16 accused, Salamat Ullah Khan, Nurul Islam, Badshah Mia and Osman Gani are now in jail.

Twelve others -- Moulavi Zakaria Sikder, Oli Ahmed, Md Jalal Uddin, Md Saiful alias Sabul, Momtaj Ahmed, Habibur Rahman, Amzad Ali, Moulavi Ramiz Hasan, Abdul Shukkur, Md Zakaria, Moulavi Jalal and Abdul Aziz -- are on the run.

All the accused are from Maheshkhali upazila in Cox's Bazar.
