Hernandez sinks Blues



Premier Chelsea's faint hopes of a top-four finish in the Premier League suffered a potentially fatal blow as Javier Hernandez's late equaliser gave struggling West Ham a 1-1 draw on Sunday.

Antonio Conte's side went ahead through Cesar Azpilicueta's first-half strike at Stamford Bridge. But Chelsea missed a host of chances to increase their advantage and were made to pay when Hernandez came off the bench to snatch the leveller with 17 minutes left.

Conte had admitted losing at home to Tottenham for the first time in 28 years last weekend was a huge setback in Chelsea's bid to salvage a dismal campaign by qualifying for the Champions League. With fifth-placed Chelsea lagging 10 points behind fourth-placed Tottenham with only six games remaining, this result could end their top-four challenge.

West Ham, now six points clear of the relegation zone, were ecstatic to escape with a point despite a largely limp display.

Earlier, Danny Welbeck inspired Arsenal to a sixth straight victory with two goals and an assist in a hottempered 3-2 home win over Southampton, to leave the Saints still rooted to the relegation zone.

Griezmann matches CR7

Messi hits hattrick as Barca equal record unbeaten run

Cristiano Ronaldo's 24th goal in 15 games for Real Madrid this year was not enough to earn his side a LaLiga derby victory on Sunday as an Antoine Griezmann equaliser secured Atletico a 1-1 draw.

Ronaldo followed up last week's brilliant bicycle kick against Juventus with a poacher's finish at the Santiago Bernabeu but Griezmann's strike keeps Atletico in pole position to

finish second in La Liga. They retain their four-point cushion over Real while this was perhaps the perfect result for leaders Barcelona, who are now 11 points clear at the top.

"We deserved more today clearly, it's a shame," Real coach Zinedine Zidane said afterwards. "We had many chances, but in the end we could have lost the game as well."

Griezmann's goal came on his 200th appearance for Atleti while Ronaldo's was the 500th in the 161 league matches played between these two city rivals.

On Griezmann, Atletico coach Diego Simeone said: "He is a great player, he did not have a good start to the season and he knows it and it is not easy to reinvent himself in the way he

did in November, December. "I think the presence of (Diego) Costa has helped him a lot, having strength around him which allows him to be free."

Gareth Bale was given 90 minutes, perhaps not the most positive indicator for his chances of a start in midweek. The Welshman supplied the cross for

Ronaldo's equaliser but, in truth, he was quiet for long periods here, a pale shadow of his confident, marauding best.

On Saturday, Barcelona equalled the record longest unbeaten run in La Liga history as a Lionel Messi hattrick inspired the runaway leaders to a 3-1 win over Leganes on Saturday to make it 38 league games unbeaten.

The Catalan giants will look to break the record that Real Sociedad set in 1979-80 when they host Valencia next weekend, with Ernesto Valverde's side now just seven matches from becoming because of the fact it's an old record that the first La Liga side to go through a

campaign without tasting defeat. Messi was the star of the show at the Camp Nou with a magnificent treble, as Barca stretched their lead at the top to 12 points ahead of second-placed Atletico Madrid's derby against Real Madrid on Sunday.

"This unbeaten record has not only been achieved this season, but also last year under [former coach] Luis Enrique," said Barca coach Valverde. "It's a shared record, because it crossed over between seasons. It has been quite difficult, hasn't been broken for a long time."

Nadal's 6-1, 6-4, 6-4 win in Valencia draws the tie level at 2-2, with Spanish world number 33 David Ferrer up against Germany's Philipp Kohlschreiber in the fifth and decisive match.

Two breaks in each set were enough for Nadal to seal an impressively comfortable victory over Zverev in what was only the

31-year-old's second outing since returning from a hip injury.


