The government should formulate a comprehensive coastal zone-specific building code as the country's maritime areas witness massive development activities, experts said yesterday.

The existing building code, adopted in 1993, has no specific rules about constructions in coastal zones. As a result, different

agencies and individuals have been setting up infrastructures haphazardly in those areas, they said.

According to them, infrastructures in coastal zones must be designed specially and should be built with special kinds of rods and cements as there is a possibility of corrosion and decay of the structures due to adverse factors like wind, salinity and flood. SEE PAGE 2 COL 1

Repatriation 'very soon'

Myanmar minister says in Dhaka

UNB, Dhaka

Myanmar Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement Minister Win Myat Aye yesterday hinted at taking actions against senior Myanmar military officials if they had violated laws to avoid recurrence of atrocities in Rakhine State.

"We are emphasising having a rule of law. According to the rule of law, we can take actions if they break the law," he told reporters at a joint briefing at the State Guest House Padma in the evening.

The Myanmar minister said their new president has declared that the country must have a rule of law.

About starting the repatriation of Rohingyas, Myat Aye said, "I am very sure that we can start the repatriation process as soon as possible."

Asked about a specific date, he said it would happen "very soon".


Communication inconsistencies found in probe

The committee probing the US-Bangla plane crash found that there were communication inconsistencies between the pilot and the Air Traffic Control at Tribhuvan International Airport for a few moments.

"The aircraft [pilot] was saying something, but, may be due to overlapping disturbances, the control tower did not respond," said Capt Salahuddin M Rahmatullah, member of the probe body, while briefing journalists on the preliminary investigation report.
