Realise revenues from Google, Facebook: HC

The High Court yesterday ordered the government to realise appropriate tax, VAT and other charges from the revenues earned by different digital platforms including Google, Facebook, Amazon, Yahoo and YouTube.

In response to a writ petition, the court also asked the government to form a special committee to assess the amount of their financial transactions in the last 10 years and to submit a report to it by June 25. It also fixed June 28 for passing a further order on this

The HC also issued a rule asking the respondents to explain in four weeks why they should not be directed to realise appropriate tax and revenue on the financial transactions of the domain sales, licence fees and advertisements of digital platforms in Bangladesh.

Govt bowed down to fundamentalists

By limiting the Pahela Baishakh celebrations, the govern-· ment is encouraging those trying to legitimise torture and sexual harassment against women, said rights activist Sultana Kamal yesterday.

The state was supposed to ensure round-the-clock security for its citizens but the announcement proved that it had bowed down to fundamentalist groups, she added. "We are constantly experiencing a shrinking space for women outside home," she said. She demanded withdrawal

· of the time restriction on the day so people can celebrate uninterruptedly. Sultana was addressing a press briefing at the capital's Jatiya Press Club. "Nari Nirapotta Jote" and "We · Can" organised the event with a call to "not to restrict women during New Year celebrations this year". Nari Nirapotta Jote, a platform of rights groups, was formed

· following the incidents of sexual assault on women on Dhaka University campus during Pahela Baishakh celebrations in 2015. We Can is a platform of civil society members and organisations, : aiming to end domestic violence against women.

Pahela Baishakh, the first day of the Bangla calendar, is celebrated on April 14. On April 2, the government instructed all cultural and other organisations to conclude Pahela Baishakh celebrations at open places by 5:00pm.

'Unhealthy competition' to blame for accidents

With people reeling from the shock of recent road accidents in the capital, leaders of transport owners and workers yesterday blamed the unhealthy competition among the buses as one of the main reasons behind the accidents in Dhaka.

They said due to the reduction of trips caused by severe traffic congestion in the city, bus owners often rent out their vehicles to the drivers who indulge in reckless driving just to maximise profit by operating as many trips as possible.

They made the observations at a meeting

of transport owners and workers at the Institute of Engineers, Bangladesh in the capital to discuss how to bring discipline in transport sector and prevent road accidents.

Dhaka Road Transport Owners' Association (DRTOA), a platform of transport owners, organised the meeting amid recent incidents of road accidents in the capital.

On April 3, Rajib Hossain, a third-year student of Government Titumir College, lost his right hand after it got stuck between two speeding buses trying to overtake each other in the capital's Bangla Motor area.


