Her award winning artwork titled "Fragments of Life" (A series of works) takes up the challenge of looking life in fragments -spaces of circumstances linked only by their proximity on the display. Dinar's every works has their introspective personal connection to her very own experiences.

Shubho Saha is a Dhaka-based interdisciplinary artist, a founding member of Back Art Foundation and the director of the Dhaka Live Art Biennale. The artist completed both his BFA and MFA from the Faculty of Fine Art, University of Dhaka. Shubho's award winning work titled "Drawing in the Air: Native Myth" sheds light on rural Bangladeshi people's keen belief in the supernatural and the magical power exists in the nature. He works with the popular belief of rebirth, soul reformation and supernatural activities of unsatisfied soul.

On behalf of Rabab Fatima, Ambassador of Bangladesh to Japan, Mohammad Jobayed Hosen, First Secretary and Head of the Embassy and noted Bangladeshi artist and curator Wakilur Rahman inaugurated the exhibition on April 14.
