Rivers routes in the Sundarbans should be Rivers routes in the Sundarbans should be off-limits to all types of cargo vessels carrying coal, oil, chemical, cement and hazardous materials, for preserving the world's largest mangrower forest, said speakers at a roundrable yesterday.

They also recommended imposing a ban on such vessels plying through the Sundarbans and conducting surveys on ecology and bio-diversity after a ship capsizes.

They said the authorities' negligence and mismanagement were the reasons behind the recent capsizal of a vessel in the

Sundarbans.

At the same time, negligence and mismanagement were also behind the recent
train accidents in the country.

The speakers demanded modernisation of the railway, increase of its manpower, locomotives and continuous
monitoring and maintenance of the

rail lines.
"Accidents are taking place due to a lack of accountability of the government and its associate bodies. They have to be brought associate bounds. They nave to be brought under accountability to stop recurrence of such accidents," said Abdus Sobhan, gen-eral secretary of Poribesh Bachao Andolon

In most cases, accidents occurred due to a fault in the vessels' design and negligence of the authorities concerned, he said.

He said such frequent accidents are harming the flora and fauna and putting the entire ecosystem at stake as well as breaking the food-cycle for the lives of the world's largest mangrowe forest, also the largest harbor of Iraboti Dolphin, reports INIR. He said the eastern side of the forest has

been declared as a world heritage site and the frequent incidents of fire and ship cap-size are putting the heritage site in a great

Partha also feared that the river routes of the Sundarbans will be busier with the start of Rampal power plant project's work, and the incidents of capsize might

Four persons fell victim to doping agangs, commonly known as "Ogyan Patry", in three separate areas of the capital yesterday.

The incidents took place in Gulistan, Kakrail and Mohakhali areas in the capital within several hours in the affermoon.

The victims were identified as Shah Alam, 35, his brother-in-law Fazlu Mia, 40, Suman, 30, and Shahidul Haque, 55.

They were all rescued and taken to Dhaka Medical College and Hospital (DMCH) unconscious, the hospital authorities said.
