



Monirul Islam honoured at Chandpur Press Club

Internationally-renowned Bangladeshi artist Monirul Islam was honoured with "Gunijon Shongbordhona" at his hometown Chandpur on Saturday. Chandpur Press Club conferred him the ovation marking the initiation of the 2018 executive committee of the press club. At the event, the organisers also honoured Zainal Abedin Majumder, who was bestowed with CIP award twice for exporting leather goods to international market.

Gracing the occasion as chief guest, President of National Press Club Muhammad Shafiqur Rahman handed over crests to the honoured personalities.

Apart from the chief guest and the honoured personalities, dignitaries including director general of Power Cell Mohammad Hossain, Chandpur Zila Parishad Chairman Osman Gani Patwary, founding general secretary of Chandpur Press Club Professor Mohammad Hossain Khan, Additional deputy Commissioner (Revenue) Md. Masudur Rahman, Additional

Superintendent of Police Md. Mizanur Rahman and others spoke at the event. President of Chandpur Press Club Iqbal Hossain Patwary presided over the programme.

Going down memory lane, Ekushey Padak winning artist Monirul Islam said, "When I was a young teacher at Dacca Art College (now Faculty of Fine Art, University of Dhaka), I came to my hometown, at the confluence of three mighty rivers -- Padma, Meghna and Dakatia, to accompany my art guru Shilpacharya Zainul Abedin at a fourday outdoor works on a boat. I also depicted many paintings on the banks of the rivers. Chandpur appeared to me as the floating city of Venice. But Chandpur no longer remains the idyll I used to know. Empty spaces have been engulfed by new buildings, structures and the expansion of the city has taken place over the years. Encroachers have taken over many ponds and parts of rivers, distorting beautiful landscapes, nature and environment."

A cultural programme followed where local artistes performed folk songs.

Shironamhin release "E Raate"

Lyric video for film soundtrack on YouTube

Popular rock band Shironamhin has released a new song on their YouTube channel, an old but obscure number by the band only the most hardcore of fans have heard before. The song is part of the film "Amra Ekta Cinema Banabo" that has been in the making for the better part of a decade.

Titled "E Raate", the song was released as a lyrics video, set to a collage of black and white photos of the band members in studio and performing live. The song, written and composed by the band's founder and bassist Ziaur Rahman, is strongly reminiscent both lyrically and compositionally of the old

Shironamhin, despite the voice of new vocalist Sheikh Ishtiaq cutting through it. Beginning with a somber, acoustic guitarplucked intro, the song builds up to the first chorus, followed by a gorgeous flute solo by guest musician Zubayer Reza, and guitar solo by Diat Khan brings the song full circle. The song's initial line is reportedly taken

from Ashraf Shishir, the director of "Amra Ekta cinema Banabo", an ambitious project of a 21-hour long film. The black-andwhite film produced by Impress Telefilm took about eight years to make, and will reportedly be released in eight separate installments.

The song was announced, along with parts

of its lyric - "Nirghum Kichu Lamppost, Kichu Poster Buuke Raatjaga Shohore, Bhenge Jay, Kichu Soye Jay, Kichu Khhoye Jay Priyotomo Swopner Opare" - was shared by Zia on February 6, 2010 on his Facebook page, which added that along with the song by the band, Zia would produce the entire film's audio album. The band had also performed this song, albeit very few times, in concerts over a short period of time.

This is Shironamhin's second song for a film, following the title track of the 2015 historical romantic drama "Poddo Pata'r Jol", and their fourth song with the new vocalist after "Jadukor", "Bohemian" and "Barud Somudro".

Aranyak chalks two-day programmes marking May Day






"Bhalobasha Kare Koy" on ntv


