









Two found dead

Two people were found dead in Pabna and Thakurgaon yesterday.

Our Pabna correspondent reported that a 50-yearold man was found dead in Atghoria upazila yesterday.

The deceased, Rejaul Khan, was a farmer of Trimohony village.

Rejaul went out of his house on Wednesday night and remained missing since then, Officer-in-Charge (OC) of Atghoria Police Station Anwarul Islam said.

Villagers spotted Rejaul's body in a banana orchard near his house and informed police.

Police were not confirmed whether he was strangled to death or committed suicide, he said.

Away in Thakurgaon, police recovered the body of a youth in Baliadangi upazila yesterday.

The victim, Noimul

Islam, 34, was son of late Bashir Uddin of Boyaldhar village. OC Sajedul Islam of

Baliadangi Police Station said Noimul went out of his house on Wednesday afternoon and did not return home.

Locals found Noimul's body in a bamboo cluster and informed the police.

Commuters suffer for potholed roads

Potholed roads and highways in different areas across the country add to the woe of commuters, especially at the onset of the rains.

An important road in Basail upazila of Tangail has been in very bad shape for the last three years due to lack of repair.

The seven-kilometre-long road under Local Government Engineering Department (LGED) stretches from Basail graveyard intersection on Basail-Sakhipur Road to Kawaljani village. Of this, around 1.5 kilometres from graveyard intersection to Basail Uttarpara area is situated in Basail municipal area.

The road has become almost unusable for vehicles as well as pedestrians as big potholes have developed on many points of the road due to movement of over-loaded trucks and also heavy rain, passengers and transport workers said.

There are around 50 small and large potholes at different places on the road from Basail to Kawaljani and they appear like ponds after rain, said Ekabbar Hossain, driver of a battery-run auto-rickshaw.

Accidents happen regularly and people sustain only four minutes a month ago," he said. injuries when three-wheelers turn turtle on the potholes, he added.

Around one lakh people of Sadar, Kawaljani and Fulki unions, and adjacent Basail Uttarpara, Suinya, Kalia, Badiajan, Gilabari Dumlibari, Kalyanpur, Bartha and Molianpur villages use the road every day, he said.

Upazila Engineer Azmat Hossain said, "We will check the condition of the road and send a proposal to the higher authorities immediately for carrying out repair work of the road as soon as possible."

Knee-deep potholes have developed on the Lalmonirhat-Burimari highway in Burimari Bazar area under Patgram upazila of Lalmonirhat in the last one and a half months, much to the suffering of commuters and transport workers.

Truck driver Nabirul Islam, 45, of Burimari land port, said at least 12 knee-deep potholes developed on the road within a 300-metre area on Lalmonirhat-Burimari highway near the Burimari land port over one month ago, but the authorities concerned are yet to take steps to repair it. "We spend 35 to 40 minutes to cross the area due to the potholes, while it took

Jam is a common phenomenon here.

"If the potholes are not repaired immediately, The road is the only way of communication they will become deeper, snapping communication with the land port," said another truck driver

Awlad Hossain, 48, president of Burimari land port unit of Truck and Tank-lorry Sramik Union, said local transport workers dump sand mixed earth in the potholes only for keeping connection with the land port open.

District Roads and Highways Department Executive Engineer Md Alo Noorayen said the road was repaired six months ago, but it got damaged due to movement of overloaded vehicles round the clock.

The 30-km-long Kalapara upazila town to Kuakata alternative road via Baliatoli is in very bad shape due to lack of repair for the last six months.

The only ferry service at Baliatoli point on the Andhamanik river has remained stopped for four years, creating more pressure on the road. LGED built the Kalapara-Kuakata alternative

road via Baliatoli and Dhulashar bazar in 2006 to

ease communication between Kalapara town and Kuakata beach. Many tourists use the alternative road as they can easily go to Gongamoti area, about 6-km from Kuakata zero-point. Tourists also use the road to visit

the country, and Gongamoti reserve forest. People of Baliatoli, Dhulashar, Mithaganj and Lalua unions use the road to go to Kalapara upazila headquarters and Kuakata sea beach. Some Dhakabound passenger buses also ply the road.

About 9-km of the road from Dhulashar bazar to Alipur bazar is in an awful condition as the seal coat (top of a carpeted road) has worn away and many potholes have developed, he added.

Kalapara Upazila Engineer Md Abdul Mannan said they are preparing an estimate for repairing the road and it will be sent to the higher authorities for approval. Away in Pabna, local people staged a demonstra-

tion in Ishwardi upazila on Wednesday, protesting damage of a newly built road, a day after its construction was completed. Although locals blamed its poor construction

with substandard materials, the officials concerned

claimed that plying of loaded trucks during the

construction work caused the sudden damage. LGED constructed the four-kilometre road, stretching from Asna GPS to Chanmari

Intersection of the upazila, at a cost of Tk 82 lakh. Locals said the construction firm concerned completed the work on Monday, but a portion of the upper surface of the road was eroded the next day due to use of substandard materials.

"We have already issued a letter to the constructhe Misreepara Buddho temple, the largest temple in tion firm concerned asking it to repair the damaged portion before officially handing over the road,"

BOGRA 4 MURDER Police find no clue yet

Police are yet to find any clue to the murder of four men in Shibganj upazila three days into the incident. Police recovered throat-

slit bodies of the four from a

paddy field near Duboier Beel area in the upazila on Monday. The deceased were Jakaria, 35, Shahabul, 30,

and Md Helal, 32, and Mohammad Khabir, 35. The four were known in the area as Yaba addicts. Their families suspect that they might have been killed

over Yaba money. Police detained six people for interrogation in this connection, said Shibganj police.

They are yet to find any clue to the murder, said Additional Superintendent of Police Sonaton Chakrabarty.

Female cop commits suicide in barracks

A female member of police allegedly committed suicide in the female police personnel barracks in Brahmanbaria Police Lines.

Brahmanbaria Superintendent of Police (SP) Md Anwar Hossain Khan confirmed the news. The reason behind her suicide was not known.

The deceased was Taslima Akter, 23, wife of an NGO employee Md Wasim and daughter of Md Rafiqul Islam of Brahmanpara upazila of Comilla. Her constable number is 682.

She was a constable in Brahmanbaria district police, the SP said.

5 policemen among Outlaw dies in 'gunfight' 15 injured in clash

At least 15 people, including five policemen, were injured in a clash between locals and the law enforcers over a school committee polls in Galachipa upazila town yesterday.

The injured include Md Saidul Islam, officer-in-charge (inquiry) of Galachipa Police Station, Sub-inspector Mahbubur Rahman, ASI Bishwajit Roy, constables Md Asad and Mehnum.

Upazila Education Officer Md Golam Mostafa, also presiding officer for managing committee polls of Galachipa Model High School, said voting for four posts of guardians' representatives in the committee started around 8:00am.

Four candidates for Awami League backed panel and three BNP-backed candidates took part in the polls. Shahin Shah, organising secretary of upazila unit AL, entered

the polling centre around 12:00 noon and influenced voters. BNP supporters challenged the matter. Later, police held Shahin. At this, supporters of Shahin started throwing brick bats on police to snatch him. Police then fired at least 14 rubber bullets to bring the situation under control.

A top outlawed leader was killed in a 'gunfight' with police at Gobindohuda village in Damurhuda upazila of Chuadanga early yesterday.

The deceased, Mirajul Islam alias Mira Mondol 42, son of late Hafiz Mondol of Hatibhanga in the upazila, was a leader of outlawed PBCP Red Flag faction, said police.

He was accused in 11 cases -- three for murder, three for abduction, three for extortion and two for robbery filed with different police stations in

Chuadanga, said Akram Hossain, officer-in-charge (OC) of Damurhuda Police Station. "A team from the police station arrested Mira with a firearm at his village home on

Wednesday evening. Following information

them in a raid to recover a cache of arms at a hideout of Gobindohuda of the upazila," he

"His cohorts fired at the police near Gobindohuda Eidgah ground around 2:00am, prompting police to retaliate.

"At one stage of the gunfight, Mira's cohorts fled, leaving his body behind. Police recovered one pistol, three crude bombs, three machetes and four sets of

sandals from the spot. "Mira had been involved with outlawed gangs for 15 years and unleashed a reign of terror in vast areas of Chuadanga. Recently he became leader of criminal gang Jamu-Akram Bahini and involved in extortion and

Jamu and Akram were top leaders of outlawed groups in Chuadanga and killed in a similar gunfight with law obtained from him, police took him with enforcers earlier.

robbery," the OC said.
