251 Jamaat-Shibir men charged for vandalism

A Dhaka court yesterday accepted charges against 251 leaders and activists of Jamaat-e-Islami and its student wing Islami Chhatra Shibir in connection with a case filed over hurling petrol bombs and torching vehicles in Dhaka on November 2012.

Jamaat leaders Dr Md Shafiqur Rahman and Rafiqul Islam are now on bail, while 40 others were shown fugitives and arrest warrants were issued against them.

Judge Kamrul Hossain Mollah of Metropolitan Sessions Judge's Court of Dhaka passed the order after scrutinising the case documents and relevant evidences.


The court also directed officers-in-charge (OCs) of different police stations to submit reports on execution of arrest warrants by July 10.

According to the case statement, a group of Jamaat men and activists of its student wing Islami Chhatra Shibir allegedly brought out a procession in the capital's Motijheel area on November 5, 2012 demanding immediate release of its leaders, including nine arrested on war crimes charges.

They vandalised some 50 vehicles, torched three motorbikes, a police vehicle and several roadside shops. When police intercepted them, they launched an attack leaving 100 people, including 14 policemen, wounded.

A case was filed against 72 Jamaat and Shibir men and around 300 unnamed persons in this connection.

After an investigation, on November 12 last year Motijheel police pressed charges against 251 people for committing the offences.

CLASH WITH LOCALS

Kazi Nazrul univ students' agitation continues

Road communication on Dhaka-Mymensingh highway remained suspended for around two hours yesterday, as students of Jatiya Kabi Kazi Nazrul Islam University (JKKNU) once again blocked the road in Churkhali Beltoli area of Sadar upazila.

They were demanding that the authorities concerned arrest those who attacked their fellows on Sunday. On that day, locals in the area allegedly attacked some university students around 4:30pm, leaving 20 of them and a university teacher injured.

Following that, students had blocked the road at two points on the highway -- Churkhali Beltoli and zero-point in Trishal upazila -- for two hours. They withdrew their programme around 6:30pm after assurance from the authorities that measures would be taken to arrest the attackers.

In a twist of events, the same day, transport workers blocked the highway for two hours from 7:00pm, alleging that the students vandalised around 40 vehicles during their protest.

Yesterday, students once again took to the streets around 11:00am, demanding immediate arrest of the attackers.

They, however, withdrew their agitation programme after being assured by the administration that the attackers would be brought to book soon, said SA Newazi, additional superintendent of police (crime) of Mymensingh.

Meanwhile, local journalists alleged that a group of students attacked two of their colleagues -- Shah Alam Ujjol, local correspondent of ATN Bangla, and Delwar Hossain, cameraperson of Jamuna Television -- as they were covering the protest.

Protesting the assault, journalists working in the district formed a human chain in the town yesterday afternoon.

They urged the administration to take actions against the students, and said they would continue their movements until the attackers are punished.

The university authorities formed a five-member probe body, headed by Student Affairs Adviser Prof Md Shahabuddin to investigate the incident, said Prof AHM Mustafizur Rahman, vice-chancellor of the university.

The committee was asked to submit its report within 10 working days, said the VC.

He said they had taken the matter seriously and the attackers would not be spared.

Missing NGO official's body recovered in Dhaka

Law enforcers yesterday recovered the body of a missing NGO official from Balu river in Dhaka's Khilgaon area.

The victim, Billal Hossain, 29, was a junior loan officer of microfinance institution ASA's Reazbagh office in Khilgaon, family sources informed.

Locals found the body floating in the river around 10:00am and informed police, said Moshiure Rahman, officer-in-charge of Khilgaon Police Station.

Police recovered the body, the OC said, adding that family members identified the body later in the day.


Police suspect that Billal was murdered by strangulation, and his body was dumped in the river by tying bricks to his limbs.

The victim's family members said Billal gathered around Tk 1.30 lakh on Saturday, and was in Badda area till 3:45pm on the day when he last spoke to them, adding that he has been missing since then.

The body of the victim has been kept at Dhaka Medical College morgue for autopsy, while filing of a case in this connection was underway.

A source in the morgue said that the dead body had a stab mark on the abdomen.

ANANTA MURDER CASE



Charge framing deferred, court shifted

A Sylhet court yesterday deferred the charge framing date of science writer and blogger Ananta murder case to June 30, and ordered to change the court.

Ananta Bijoy Das, an organiser of 'Biggan and Juktibadi Council' and Gonojagor Mancha in Sylhet, was brutally hacked to death in broad daylight at Subidbazar area in Sylhet city on May 12, 2015 by a group of 'radical Islamists'. After three years, charges against the accused are yet to be framed.

Sylhet Metropolitan Sessions Judge Md. Akbar Hossain Mridha ordered to shift the case to Additional Metropolitan Sessions Judge's Court, and set the new charge framing date to June 30, said Advocate Mofur Ali, public prosecutor of the court.

On May 9 last year, Criminal Investigation Department (CID) pressed a supplementary charge

sheet to a Sylhet court, accusing six persons and acquitting ten others in a case filed over the murder.

Two of the accused Mannan Rahi and Abul Khaer, are students of Shahjalil University of Science and Technology (Sust). Mannan confessed before a court on September 2, 2015 that he along with Khaer and three others hacked the blogger with a machete for his write-ups "promoting freethinking".

Three other accused are on the run.

Ananta's brother Ratneswar Das had filed a murder case the day after Ananta was killed, accusing some unnamed persons with the airport police station.

The investigation was later handed over to CID, who pressed a charge sheet and October 18, 2016. The court rejected the charge sheet and ordered CID to reinvestigate the case and file a supplementary charge sheet, which was filed on May 9 last year.

Bar Council election held

The election to Bangladesh Bar Council, a statutory body regulating the country's lawyers, was held yesterday to elect its 14 executive members.

A total of 59 lawyers contested in the election.

Votes were cast at 78 centres across the country and at least three to four days will be needed for compiling the results, Attorney General Mahbubul Alam, the ex-officio chairman of Bangladesh Bar Council, told The Daily Star.

He also said the election took place in a peaceful manner as no complaint was filed with his office.

The voting took place at the Supreme Court Bar Association (SCBA) and all civil courts in the districts, and at Bagtupur, Ishawganj, Durgapur, Bhanganga, Chikandi, Patia, Satkania, Fatikchhari, Sandwip, Hatia, Nabinagar and Paikgachha police stations.
