She has received an array of prestigious awards including Bangla Academy Literary Award, Jessore Sahitya Parishad Puraskar, Bangladesh Lekhika Sangha Shwarna Padak, Qamar Mushtari Shwarna Padak, Ananya Sahitya Puraskar, Humayun Kadir Sriti Puraskar, Jasimuddin Shwarna Padak and Shawgat Shwarna Padak. Rizia Rahman will be cherished forever for her tireless contributions in the literary arena of Bangladesh.

INSPIRATION

My inspiration was probably transmitted through gene. My parents are my first source of inspiration. Since childhood, I felt that writing is the art which I was born for.
