'SHOOTOUTS' WITH LAW ENFORCERS

Nine killed in a single day

All were 'drug peddlers'; rights activists back tough stance against narcotics but worried at sudden surge in so-called gunfights

The tally of alleged drug peddlers killed in "shootouts" stood at 22 in the last one week with nine of them shot to death yesterday alone amid antinarcotic drives of law enforcers across the country.

The incidents made rights activists and former top police officials worried as they believe killings cannot be the way of tackling the drug menace that has gripped every strata of the society.

Yesterday, six people were killed in "gunfights" with law enforcers during raids in five districts while three others were shot dead in Jessore due to "internal feud of their racket", officials said.

Family members and neighbours of at least four of the dead, including the three in Jessore, alleged that they were picked up by plainclothes officials hours before they died.

Wasa aims to tackle city's waterlogging

Tk 550cr canal dev project on the cards REJAUL KARIM BYRON and TAWFIQUE ALI

The Dhaka Wasa is taking up a Tk-550 crore project for canal development to solve the capital's water-logging problem.

However, the project, scheduled to complete by June 2021, will bring no respite for city residents this monsoon. It is expected to benefit five million resi-

dents when completed. Shahid Uddin, a Wasa director, said that the project work would start after the funds are released.

Excavating the old canals and protecting them with retaining walls are two main components of the project, Shahid, also a former Wasa chief engineer, said.

The project on drainage extension and canal digging will be placed at the Executive Committee of the National Economic Council (Ecnec) meeting today for approval.

EXPANSION OF DHAKA-SYLHET HIGHWAY

Govt opts to use own resources

Negotiations with Chinese company fail

The roads authority is going to expand the 214-kilometre Dhaka-Sylhet Highway into four lanes using their own resources following failed negotiations with a Chinese company.

Road Transport and Highways Division (RTHD) sent a proposal to the planning ministry in the first week of this month in this regard without notifying Beijing or even the Economic Relations Division (ERD), a government organ which worked to arrange the funds from China. The Dhaka-Sylhet four-lane highway project is one of the 26 projects

for which China had committed to provide a \$21.5 billion soft loan. A memorandum of understanding (MoU) between Dhaka and Beijing was signed during the Chinese president's visit to Dhaka in 2016. The road authority's recent decision would be considered a violation

of the MoU as they had not settled the issue diplomatically with Beijing It might also have adverse affect on several other deals Dhaka had signed with Beijing, ERD officials said.

Earlier, Chinese firm China Harbor Engineering Company Limited sought Tk 17,000 crore in construction cost of the highway. The amount was exclusive of other costs, including of land acquisition.

Mauro Icardi, the joint top goalscorer in Italy's Serie A this season, was left out of Argentina's World Cup squad yesterday as coach Jorge Sampaoli named his 23 players for next month's tournament in Russia.

Sampaoli named just four forwards in his squad with Lionel Messi, Paulo Dybala, Sergio Aguero and Gonzalo Higuain all selected. That meant there was no

place for Icardi, who scored 29 league goals for Inter Milan this season.

'Unsafe' Pasteurised Milk

HC asks govt to form expert committee

The High Court yesterday directed the government to form an expert committee to test the pasteurised milk available in the market and submit a report before it in a month.

The expert committee would include representatives from the food and health ministries, Bangladesh Standards and

Testing Institution (BSTI), and other experts and researchers concerned, the court said.

The HC also issued a rule asking the authorities concerned why their failure to ensure the safety of pasteurised milk should not be declared illegal.
