Bangladeshi peacekeepers build roads, provide education, medical aid to locals

Seven years into its independence, the youngest country in the world still remains one of the most violent.

South Sudan's civil war, provoked by ethnic divide, has so far killed as many as 300,000 people and displaced almost a

quarter of its 12 million people. In the South Sudanese capital, Juba, Bangladeshi peacekeepers have been stationed since as early as 2005. They were the first UN Bangladeshi contingent to arrive, and at that time the runway was barely a strip of concrete surrounded by motley tents.

"When we first arrived here on a UN flight, the father of the nation of South Sudan Dr John Garang de Mabior welcomed us at the airport," said Major

Muhammad Shoeb Shafiq, who was in the first Bangladeshi peacekeeping mission in South Sudan in 2005.

Bangladeshi peacekeepers have been working in the country since then. When they were asked to construct

roads, they soon found roadside mines. "But there were no signs or marks," the expeacekeeper remembered.

Even today, only a few kilometres of the roads in the capital city is functional.

"Bangladesh sent the first contingent in 2005. Since then we started working together and we are still working together," Juma Jada, state minister for health in South Sudan, told The Daily Star. "It has been a

Take concrete steps to ensure Rohingya rights

USAID chief urges Myanmar after visting Rakhine State

The US government's aid chief urged Myanmar on Sunday to take "concrete steps" to guarantee the rights of Rohingya Muslims and to show sincerity in that endeavour in order to encourage hundreds of thousands who have fled the country to return.

Mark Green, administrator of the United States Agency for International Development (USAID), ended his three-day visit to Myanmar touring Rohingya and Rakhine communities in western

Rakhine State, including a camp for displaced Rohingya people.

Green said the refugees, whom he met during the previous leg of the trip in camps in Bangladesh, are fearful and while they want to return, they are asking for their rights and security to be guaranteed before making the decision to come back.

"That reinforces the importance here of clear signs of sincerity of the government's stated position of welcoming back Rohingya in a safe, secure SEE PAGE 10 COL 6

Italian artist sculpts Fiat out of marble

A young Turin-based artist has spent months sculpting a life-size Fiat 500 car out of a 15-tonne block of white Carrara marble in a work he sees as a critique of today's consumerist, throw-away society.

Armed with his circular saw and a face mask to keep away the dust, Nazareno Biondo began work on the piece last year, slowly and meticulously hewing out of stone a copy of the iconic "Topolino", the original small two-door rearengined city car that still symbolises, 60 years after its launch, Italy's post-war economic boom.
