A combination of diet plans, herbal massages, and detox programmes are used to tackle stress or handle weight related issues.

Furthermore, ARHC has a variety of beauty treatments consisting of scrubs, polishes, and facials. What makes these

beauty treatments so unique is because there are no artificial chemicals, and instead rely on the use of natural herbs, fruits and vegetables. Starting from Tk 2,500 all the way up to Tk 7,000, these beauty treatments are designed to relax the body. There also have bridal packages that give individuals a beautiful rejuvenating look for the big day, leaving their skin glowing and fresh.

The centre also has a shop from which customers can buy herbal products manufactured by ARHC.
