On May 28, Clay Station, a pottery studio in Dhaka, began a 4-day summer camp where children can learn different techniques of hand building with clay using pottery tools, know about different types of ceramics, and receive a certificate. At the camp, the children made dinner wares for their families as well as pizzas and burgers for themselves. In addition, they made animals out of clay to represent their own zoos and aquariums. On the last day, they will paint flags for themselves on tiles. Children tend to not focus on a

"Pottery making has calming effects and it also improves a child's creativity and focus, which is necessary in a world where everyone is drawn to electronic gadgets," says Musharrat Murshed, a parent of one of the children. She further

You are known for choosing quite uncommon and unpredictable roles. Is there any particular reason why?


