

Youth arrested for violating challenged woman

A young man was arrested on charge of raping a physically challenged woman in Kharol upazila of the district on Tuesday night.

The arrestee is Abdul Maleque, 30, son of Abdul Zabbar of Dweepnagar village in the upazila.

Police arrested him from Koreya area in the upazila.

Ayub Ali, officer-in-charge of Kharol Police Station, said Maleque forcibly took the 26-year-old physically challenged woman to a maize field at his village and raped her.

Hearing screams, villagers rushed to the spot and rescued the victim. Later, Maleque was arrested in this connection.

The victim's family member later filed a rape case with Kharol Police Station.

Canal land grabbing brings tragic consequences

A market fire in Bhola district headquarters gutted fifty shops last Saturday. First detected at 1:00am, it took fire fighters four hours to douse the blaze. For shopkeepers, residents and fire fighters alike, the disaster is all the more frustrating since it occurred just fifteen feet from the Bhola canal, which could've been a convenient water source for both fire fighters and the dozens of locals who arrived with buckets to help extinguish the blaze. But due to uncontrolled land grabbing, the canal is all but dry.

"With this disaster we see the dire consequences of canal land being grabbed," observes an associate professor at the disas-

the local station master of Bangladesh Fire Service and Civil Defence. "Most of the shops could've been saved. As we had to collect water from further away it took longer and the property damage was much more severe. Canals and other water bodies in urban areas are essential for disaster management. I have already written to the deputy commissioner's office to take action to restore this canal."

"The canal lost its water flow due to continuous encroachment and a lack of maintenance," explains one resident, Hasibur Rahman. "On both sides of the canal many structures protrude onto canal land which, along with the excess of garbage in the canal, obstructs water flow."

It's not the first time the issue of the

ter management department of Barisal University, Md Hafiz Ashraf Haque. "It's a common scenario in cities and towns across Barisal. Similar fires are at risk of occurring in many locations. These urban canals should be saved as soon as possible in order to protect lives and property."

Bhola's deputy commissioner, Masud Alom Siddik, says that alongside the Superintendent of Police he witnessed the fire and saw first-hand the anguish of shopkeepers exacerbated by the lack of water in the canal. "The Bhola canal is the soul of Bhola city," says the deputy commissioner, who recently joined the post. "We will recover this canal and ensure a natural water flow within six months, to save the city."

Work in progress for Saidpur Int'l Airport

Saidpur Airport in the district will be upgraded soon to an international one.

As part of the upgrading process, civil aviation authorities have already completed the feasibility study and land acquisition procedure is also in progress.

Three other international airports in the country are Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport in Dhaka, Shah Amanat International Airport in Chittagong and Osmani International Airport in Sylhet.

Saidpur Airport Manager Shahin Ahmed said the authorities concerned started the upgrading work after Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina made the announcement in parliament to upgrade the airport into an international one last year.

Following the prime minister's announcement, the Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh (CAAB) appointed a North Korean firm last year that conducted massive studies on different aspects and provided necessary suggestions in this regard.

Besides appointing the foreign company, the CAAB conducted separate surveys with relevant experts and prepared a coordinated report, Shahin added.

Accordingly, an additional 912 acres of

land covering areas in Nilphamari and Dinajpur is needed to construct a 12,000 feet approach runway in place of the existing 6,000 feet runway for operating large and modern aircraft from home and abroad, Shahin said.

The other major works, alongside the land acquisition, are modernising the terminal structure, setting up night landing system and construction of a giant boundary wall.

Meanwhile, CAAB Chairman Air Vice Marshal M Naim Hassan and Member (Operations and Planning) Air Commodore M Mostafizur Rahman visited the airport site on March 31.

Former president of Nilphamari Chamber of Commerce and Industries Shafiqul Alam Dablu Shah said upgrading the airport into an international airport will boost the country's trade and tourism with India, Bhutan, Nepal and even China for its convenient location.

Meanwhile, a delegation of Bhutanese government led by its civil aviation and tourism minister visited the Saidpur Airport site in 2012.

Nilphamari Deputy Commissioner Khaled Rahim said land acquisition process for converting the Saidpur Airport as an international one is already in progress.

Kid killed, cousin held

A 10-year-old boy was found murdered at a maize field in Nawabganj upazila of the district yesterday.

The victim was Minhajul Islam, son of Delwar Hossain of Jotbani village in Birampur upazila.

Police arrested his cousin Azizur Rahman, 22, son of Rashidul Islam, in connection with the killing.

Police and family members said Azizur came out of the house with his cousin Minhajul on Tuesday afternoon to visit their relatives.

But, Azizur returned home alone in the evening. Asked about Minhajul's whereabouts, Azizur said he killed him.

Later, family members handed over Azizur to Birampur police.

Based on his information, police recovered Minhajul's body from the maize field the following day and sent it to M Abdur Rahim Medical College Hospital morgue for autopsy, said Subrata Sarkar, officer-in-charge of Nawabganj Police Station.

The reason behind the killing could not be known immediately, said the OC.

A SCHOOL without academic activities!

The local government has constructed a beautiful building with all facilities for a primary school in Dumki upazila before its academic activities started.

Local Government Engineering Department (LGED) constructed the building in the fiscal year 2015-2016 at Pangashia village on 30 decimals of land donated by a local family.

Md Zakir Hossain Badsha and his mother Nurjan Begum donated the land to set up a primary school in the name of Badshah's father Rafiqul Islam as there is no school within four kilometres of their village.

"My father was a non-government primary school teacher who died in 2016. He had a dream of setting up a school at the village to spread light of education in the area, but he died before fulfilment of his dream. We have built a school here in his name," Badsha said.

"We heard that the government has a programme to set up primary schools in areas that do not have schools. As per instruction of the local education office, we donated the land on which a nice looking building has already been built," he said.

"We are happy that the school building has been built, but we will be happier if academic activities start there," Badsha said.

Mosharraf Hossain said they are very happy as the school building has been constructed at their village. There

is no school in the area and their children had to go about four kilometres away to attend school, he added.

Now, their children will be able to get education from the school, he hoped.

Dumki Upazila Education Officer KM Nazrul Islam Khan said the school building was built under a special project, titled Establishment of 1,500 Primary School in Unschooled Areas, taken up by the Primary and Mass Education Ministry.

The contractor has handed over the building to them with furniture, ceiling fans and arsenic-free deep tube-

wells and separate sanitary facilities for boys and girls, he said.

They hope academic activities will start from next academic year, he added.

Dumki Upazila LGED Engineer Bipul Kumar Biswas said they constructed the building at a cost of about Tk 60 lakh with fund from the primary education authorities.

Patuakhali district Primary Education Officer Md Shahidul Islam said they are taking steps to start academic activities from the next academic session (January).
