The Bangladesh women's team clinched a dramatic last-ball win over Ireland by four wickets in the first of the three match T20I

series after Jahanara Alam created history by bagging the first five-wicket haul for the Tigresses in international cricket at the YMCA Ground in Dublin yesterday.

The result is a continuation of their good form which saw them win the recent Women's T20 Asia Cup in Malaysia.

Needing four runs to win in the last 15 for two. over in chase of 135, the game went

down to the wire with the visitors needing one run in the last ball of the innings, which Fahima Khatun achieved to register the memorable win.

Fahima was unbeaten on 26 off 18

balls with three fours while Nigar Sultana top-scored with 46 off 38 balls, hitting six boundaries. The duo turned things around from a point where Bangladesh needed 52 runs from the last six overs.

Earlier, it was Jahanara who started set the game up for the visitors after the chose to field first. The right-arm seamer bagged two wickets in her first two overs to leave Ireland struggling on

death to hurt the home side in her second spell, dismissing Kim Garth (20), Eimear Richardson (2) and bowling top-scorer Isobel Joyce (41) with a yorker in her last over to complete the five-wicket haul and restricting Ireland to 134 for 8.

Jahanara ended with figures of five for 28 from four overs, surpassing Salma Khatun's previous best T20 bowling figures of four for six against Sri Lanka during the 2012 Asia Cup. SCORES IN BRIEF

Sabbir, Mosaddek keep SL A at bay

Bangladesh A replied strongly through twin centuries from skipper Mosaddek Hossain and Sabbir Rahman as the home side posted 360 for four

at the end of the third days' play yesterday. The hosts are still trailing Sri Lanka A by 89 runs, but barring some dramatic cricket today the four-day game seems to be heading for a draw at the Zahur Ahmed Chowdhury Stadium in Chittagong.

Mosaddek hit nine fours and three sixes in his 243-ball 135, but was dismissed in the final session when he was bowled by left-arm spinner Prabath Jayasuriya. Sabbir remained unbeaten on his career-best first-class score and will resume the fourth day on 144.

Resuming the third day on 44 for two, the second-string Bangladesh side were facing a tough challenge and things only became tougher when the experienced Tushar Imran was trapped leg-before on 25 by a Lakshan Sandakan delivery to leave the home side struggling on 74 for three.

It was then that overnight batsman Mosaddek, who resumed the day on eight,

was joined by Sabbir and the pair added 209 runs for the fourth wicket to bring the hosts back into the game.

Since being dropped from the national team despite playing a crucial knock in the Chittagong Test against Sri Lanka in February this year, the right-handed Mosaddek has struck consecutive first-class centuries - the first being an unbeaten ton in the Bangladesh Cricket League earlier this year.

Sabbir struggled early in his innings and at one point the right hander faced 70 balls to score just 15 runs, but later found his rhythm. The 26-year-old, who is often criticised for

his lack of temperament, displayed a great amount of patience in his 257-ball 144 -which included 13 fours and two sixes -- to register his fourth first class hundred in 48 games. He also went past his previous best score of 136 runs while wicketkeeper-batsman Zakir Hasan also remained unbeaten on 27.

Tigers' only warm-up game against a CWI President's XI at the Coolidge Cricket Ground in Antigua yesterday. When this report was filed,

Bangladesh had reached 291 for five in the third session of the first day of the two-day practice match, with Mahmudullah Riyad on 62 and Mehedi Hasan Miraz at the crease after Tamim retired during the tea break.

Bangladesh skipper Shakib Al Hasan chose to bat first at the toss, and Bangladesh were soon in early trouble, falling to 22 for three after Liton Das (2), Mominul Haque (7) and Nazmul Hossain Shanto (4) departed cheaply. The wrecker-in-chief for the home side was fast bowler Alzarri Joseph, a bowler the Tigers are likely to be confronted with in the upcoming two-Test series against the West Indies starting from July 4.

The early damage was repaired by contrasting innings from Shakib and

disaster but we have talked about a team for the World Cup and the Ashes and I think we have unlocked a few answers, but it hurts when you get beaten -- particularly in England," Langer told reporters
