A superstar in the making sent a superstar out of the World Cup as France prevailed over Argentina 4-3 in the first blockbuster World Cup round of 16 game at the Kazan Arena yesterday.

Kylian Mbappe, the 19-year-old French forward, set up the first goal and then struck

twice in space of four minutes after the break to effectively dash Argentina's hopes of their third World Cup title, and more importantly superstar Lionel Messi's dream of win-



ning the biggest prize at his fourth attempt. It looked like Messi was heading for victory when Gabriel Mercado deflected his shot into the net, giving Argentina a 2-1 lead three minutes after resumption. But after Benjamin Pavard made it 2-2 in the 57th minute, it was once again the
