People suffer for collapsed bridge

The bridge in remote Matiranga UZ needs early rebuilding to restore road link

Thousands of people of 15 villages are badly suffering since the concrete bridge on Dhalia canal in Matiranga upazila of the district collapsed on June 12.

People living in those villages are now crossing the canal by rafts made of banana trees.

Thousands of people use the bridge that connects 15 villages of two wards under Matiranga union to the upazila headquarters.

Local people urged the authorities concerned to rebuild the bridge on emergency basis otherwise it will seriously hamper livelihood of the villagers.

Sources said Khagrachhari Hill District Council built the 120-feet-long bridge in 2001.

During a visit to the area a few days ago, this correspondent saw the bridge, struct a concrete bridge, upazila admin-PHOTO: STAR lapsed on June 12.

Meanwhile, villagers who need to go to the upazila headquarters or other places were crossing the canal by raft.

Amrita Tripura, a ward member under Matiranga union, said road communication with upazila headquarters has been completely snapped due to the

collapsed bridge. Dino Mohan Tripura, headman (village chief) of Doldoli mouza, said people living in the area are mostly dependent on Jum cultivation and fruit gardening.

Matiranga Upazila Nirbahi Officer (UNO) Bivishan Kanti Das said he heard about the collapsed bridge and informed the deputy commissioner of the matter.

4 get life term for killing teenage boy

A court here yesterday sentenced four people to rigorous imprisonment for life for killing a teenage boy in Shivalay upazila on May 23 in 2014.

The court also fined the convicts Tk 10,000 each, in default, to serve two more years of rigorous imprisonment.

Senior Judge of the District and Sessions Judge's Court Md Mizanur Rahman Khan delivered the verdict.

The convicts are Mohammad Sujon, 22, Mohammad Abu Taleb, 45, Mohammad Suruj, 19, and Mohammad Muktar Hossain, 32. Md Sujon and Mohammad Abu Taleb were present in the court, while the other two are absconding.

Two other accused, Md Liton, 30, and Md Raju Hossain, 35, were acquitted as the charges brought against them could not be proved.

According to the prosecution, the convicts killed Md Tutul, 13, son of Arman Ali of Teota village in Shibalaya upazila and dumped his body into the well of Teota Jamindar Bari on May 23 in 2014.

Informed by locals, police recovered the body from there after seven days.

'Punish attackers on Ishwardi Govt College teachers'

Two accused BCL men sent to jail

Teachers of all government colleges in the district yesterday staged demonstration protesting Wednesday's attack on the principal and other teachers of Ishwardi Government College by Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) activists.

They also demanded immediate arrest and exemplary punishment of the attackers.

Meanwhile, Rakibul Hasan Rony, president of Ishwardi upazila unit BCL, and its activist Md Shishir yesterday appeared before Pabna Senior Judicial Magistrate's Court, seeking bail in a case for assaulting the principal and other teachers of Ishwardi Government College.

But Senior Judicial Magistrate Md Abu Baset rejected their bail prayers and sent them to jail, said Abdul Ahad, lawyer to the key accused.

As part of the countrywide programme announced by BCS General Education Association on Saturday, teachers of different government colleges in the district yesterday held protest rallies and formed human chains at their own institutions to

realise the demand, said Dr Shawkat Ali, secretary of the association in Pabna.

On June 27, unruly BCL men swooped on Ishwardi Government College and vandalised office room, computers and CC cameras when the HSC admission was going on. The attackers, led by Rony and college unit

president Arman Hossain and secretary Sabbir Rahman, also assaulted the principal and other teachers, said speakers at the programme at Ishwardi Government College. The attackers asked the teachers of the

college to sell a prospectus of BCL for Tk 150 each to the admission seekers.

As they refused to do it, the BCL men carried out the attack, said Md. Abdul Jalil, vice principal of the college. "Arrest and punish the attackers for the

sake of justice," said Dr Sawkat. Principal of the college Abdus Sabur Khan filed a case with Ishwardi Police

Station on Friday, accusing 35 people,

including 11 named BCL leaders. The leaders include Rony, Shishir, Arman and Sabbir. OC of Ishwardi Police Station Md Azim Uddin said they are trying to arrest the accused.

Abul Bashar Miah said the K-8W training plane, being operated by two pilots -- squadron leaders Sirajul Islam and Enayet Kabir Polash -- took off from Motiur Rahman Air Base in Jessore at around 8:30 pm.

Sometime later, the plane crash landed in the Bukbhora Baor.

ISPR said inclement weather was the cause of the crash. An investigation committee has been formed to probe the incident.

Alamgir Pathan, manager of Jessore Airport, said the pilots lost connection with the control tower sometime after taking off. Bashar said police and fire service went to

the spot upon information and began the rescue operation at 10:30pm. It was suspended at around 4:00am on Monday. The operations resumed after divers of the navy and fire service from

Khulna arrived in the morning. Witness Shyamol Kumar of Chandutia Bazar said he heard a big bang at around 9:00pm and rushed to Bukbhora Baor, which is adjacent to Arichpur Bazar. From a distance, he could make out a portion of the plane floating in the water.

Nothing was clearly visible due to rain and darkness. The stench of petrol hung heavy in the air, he said.

Our Jamalpur correspondent reports, Jamalpur locals were shocked at the sudden

demise of pilot Enayet Kabir Polash. Enayet Kabir, 36, son of Dr Shafi Uddin

and Rokeya Begum, hailed from Krishnapur village in Doail Union under Sarishabari upazila. He joined the Bangladesh Air Force in 2000 and was commissioned as a flight lieutenant in 2002, said the deceased's maternal uncle Dr Abu Taher.

Water lily cultivation turns a profit in Kurigram

December 10 in 2014.

Six years ago, when Mahiuddin Shohel, 28, collected his first red water lilies from a local pond to plant in a ditch, little could he have imagined it was the start of a small business. The Imam and Muezzin of Kurigram staff-quarters mosque sold the flowers for Tk 20 per piece that year. Since then his nursery has grown to include more than 800 plants and, testament to the enduring popularity of the water lily, sales are brisk.

"I've been a plant-lover since my student days," says Shohel. "I have no training in horticulture but in 2012 I was able to lease forty decimals of land from the mosque committee. Eight decimals were submerged and suitable for water lilies."

"Two years later I was able to visit nurseries in Dhaka's Agargaon," he continues. "I saw that red or violet water lilies planted in a tub were being sold for up to Tk 3,000 each."

At around that time, one of his customers, the



civil surgeon then posted in Kurigram, Dr Taufiqul Islam, donated a violet variety collected from his native Dinajpur. Shohel cultivated the flower and sold twelve offshoots for Tk 2,000 each. The business looked promising.

"The following year I had more than enough new plants to sell so I reduced the price," Shohel

narrates. "This year I have sown more than 500 of the red variety in another pond."

From Tk 6,000 as an initial investment, Shohel's nursery is now an asset worth around Tk 4 lakhs. Last year he sold around Tk 55,000 worth of water lily plants, and he hopes to expand the nursery by 15 decimals this year.

"Water lilies are popular with people with rooftop gardens," Shohel says. "They are also used in herbal cures. They flower in every season and don't require much care."

"Growing water lilies in unused water bodies helps to maintain biodiversity," says the agriculture officer for Kurigram Sadar upazila, Sasty Chandra Roy. "Due to the expansion of agriculture, lilies are less common than they used to be. Mahiuddin Shohel's contribution is appreciated."

Forever the plant-lover, Shohel has his sights set upon a new milestone. "I am trying to collect

a yellow water-lily from India," he says. Challenged

the soil science division at the Bangladesh Agricultural Resource Institute. "There should be about five percent organic matter in soil but recent testing in Shivalaya upazila found just one percent." Rich in carbon, biochar lasts in the soil for

thousands of years. Not only does it rejuvenate soil with improved fertility, it also acts as a natural carbon sink, storing carbon that would otherwise be released into the atmosphere as global warming contributing carbon dioxide. "The good thing is that biochar is resistant to

decomposition," explains Jayanta Adhikari, executive director of the non-government organisation involved. "It can enhance soil quality and ensure better crop yields for many years." In the kitchen meanwhile, the Akha stove

reduces the health risk of smoke inhalation. "Our kitchen was always smoky, the walls were caked in oil and black stains," says household manager Monkhusi Halder, 35, from
