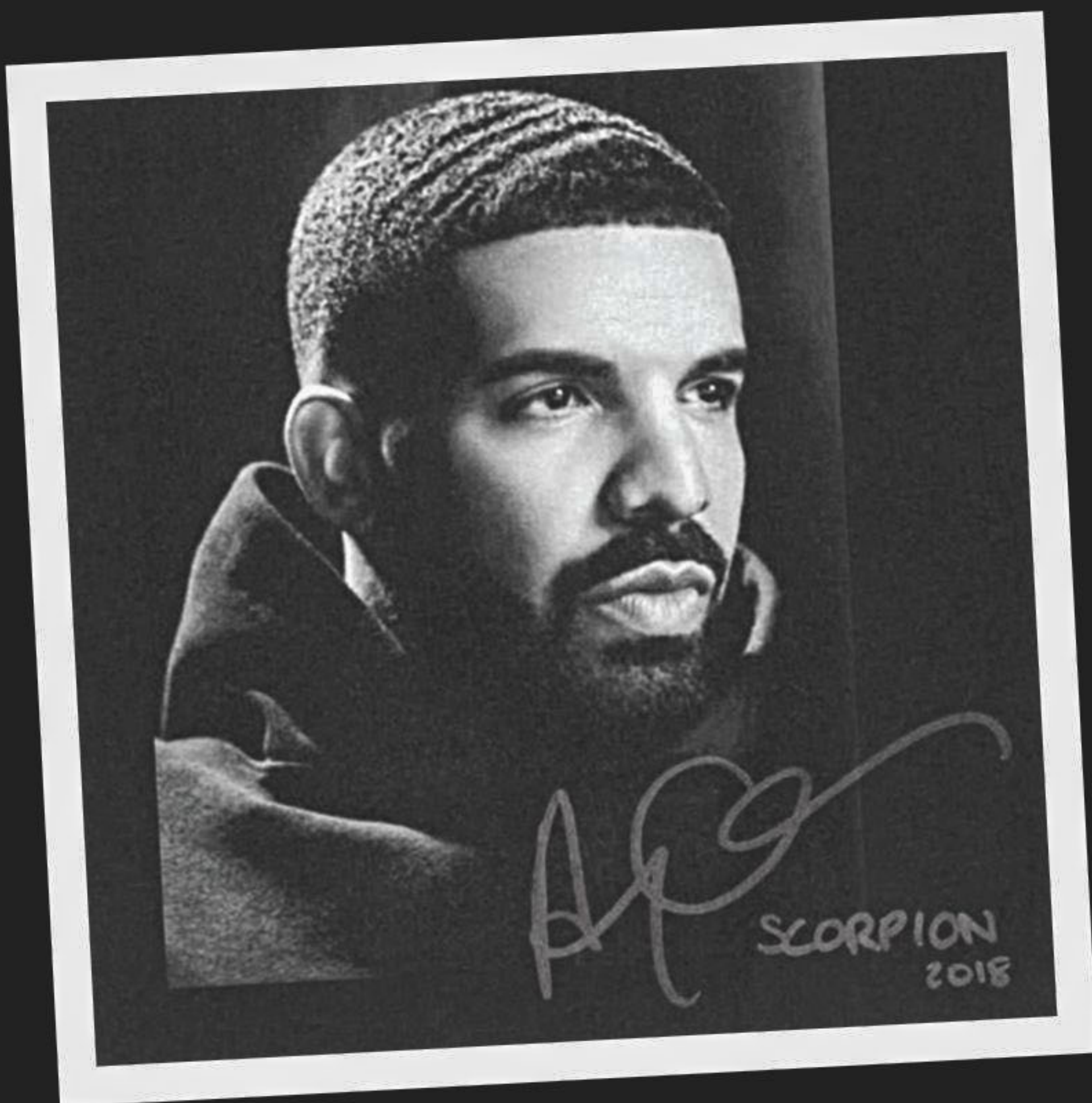


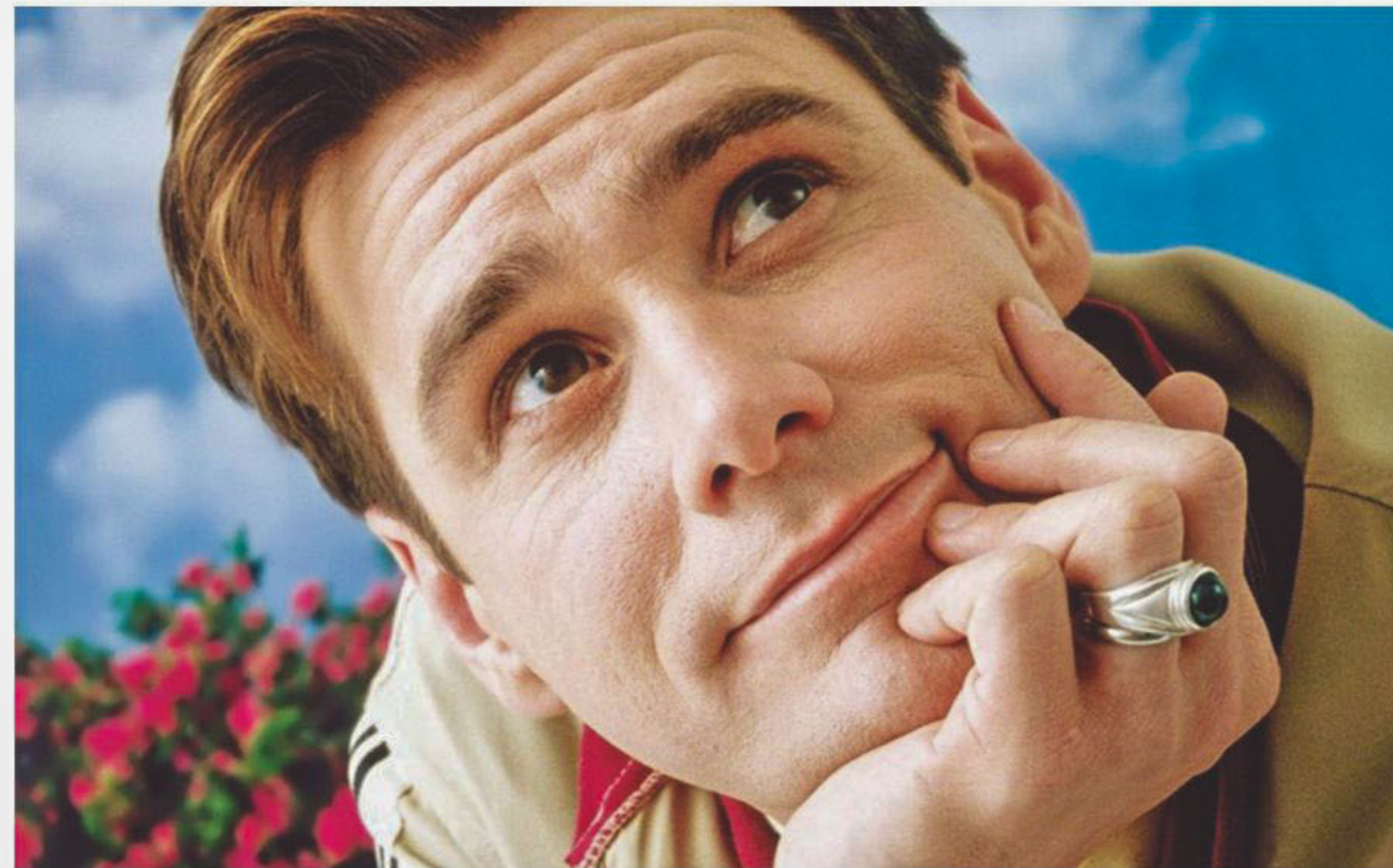
# RAPPER DRAKE
