

DID YOU KNOW THESE

Incorrect: Both did not come. Correct: Neither came.

Incorrect: Both of them did not pass the test. Correct: Neither of them passed the test.

In negative clauses, we use 'neither' not both.

Incorrect: Each of these girls sing very well. Correct: Each of these girls sings very well.

After each and every, we use a singular verb.

Incorrect: We all did not go. Correct: None of us went.

Incorrect: We all had not been invited. Correct: None of us had been invited.

Incorrect: One should love his country.

Correct: One should love one's country. Incorrect: 'Have you got a pencil?' 'No, I haven't got.' Le Correct: 'Have you got a pencil?' 'No, I haven't got

one.' / 'No, I don't have one'. Have is a transitive verb. It needs an object to complete its meaning.

Incorrect: 'Is he at home?' 'Yes, I think.'

Correct: 'Is he at home?' 'Yes, I think so.'

Incorrect: We enjoyed during the holidays. Correct: We enjoyed ourselves during the holidays. Enjoy is a transitive verb. It requires an object.

Incorrect: The boy who works hard he will get the

Correct: The boy who works hard will get the prize. Correct: Whoever works hard will get the prize.

Letters to friends and family should be written in a conversational style. They are a bit like a friendly chat. They should be spontaneous compositions and as such they should be unpremeditated. Compared with essays, social letters have a free style. When we engage in a friendly conversation, we touch on many topics. In the same way, you can write about just about any topic in a friendly letter. You can also present them in whatever order you like.

SOME OF THE BASICS OF LETTER WRITING:

In letters to members of your family, the salutation should be:

My dear Father / My dear Friend / My Dear Sister etc.

Note that My Dear is more intimate and affectionate than Dear.

In letters to friends, the salutation should be:

Dear Peter / My dear Peter

If you are writing to an older person, you should address him as Dear Mr Peter or Dear Ms Alice.

In letters to strangers, the salutation should be Dear Sir or Dear Madam.

Avoid phrases like 'Honoured Sir' and 'Respected Sir'. Native English speakers don't use expressions like these.

After the opening salutation, Americans may put a colon or a comma. In British English, a comma is more common.

There is no apostrophe in yours, either before or after the s. Write

Yours sincerely (NOT Your's sincerely)

Before the leave-taking phrase most people write an expression like With kind regards, With every good wish or Hoping to hear from you soon.

is not usually used by one man to another.

Informal letters may finish, for example, Yours, See you or Love. Note that Love

Letters which begin Dear Sir or Dear Madam usually finish Yours faithfully. Formal letters which begin with the person's name usually finish Yours sincerely. In American English, Yours faithfully is not used.
