

'We'll turn every village into a township'

Hasina tells Pabna rally

UNB, Pabna

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said the Awami League government will ensure civic amenities and improved lifestyle for people of every village in the country if her party is voted to power again.

"If you cast vote for boat [AL's electoral symbol] and if Awami League returns to power, we'll make sure that each community of every village will get urban facilities and can lead a decent life. We'll turn every village into a township," she told a rally held at Pabna Police Lines field.

The premier said her government wants to build a poverty, militancy and drug-free Bangladesh. She urged people to help the government successfully carry on drives against terrorism, militancy and narcotics. She also called upon parents, freedom

fighters, teachers, imams (clerics) and other religious leaders to work unitedly against these social diseases.

Hasina, also president of Awami League, said, "Awami League always works for the wellbeing of people. We know how a country can be developed and we continue to work in such a way."

"Since you voted us to power, we got the chance to work for you. If you cast vote for boat, we'll be able to return to power and get a chance to serve you again," she said.

Mentioning that BNP-Jamaat clique had unleashed violence and arson attacks in 2013 and 2014, the PM said, "They only know how to destroy ... "

She said the country saw massive development as people gave the mandate in favour of the boat in the last two national elections. Regarding safety net programmes, she

said the government provides allowances to some 40 lakh widows, 14 lakh women abandoned by their husbands, 40 lakh elderly people and 10 lakh physicallychallenged people, as well as stipend to 80,000 physically-challenged students.

Hasina said the government is setting up 100 economic zones. She said the government continues to build roads, schools

Khaleda unwell, relatives fail to meet her

Says BNP chief's sister UNB, Dhaka

Though they had permission from the jail authorities, relatives of BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia could not meet her yesterday due to her illness, said her sister.

"We've come to know that Khaleda Zia is suffering from fever and body aches. She couldn't meet us as she was unable to come down to the guestroom from the 1st floor," Khaleda's sister Selina Islam told journalists at the gate of Old Dhaka Central Jail.

Selina and four other relatives entered the jail around 4:00pm and came out about 45 minutes later.

Earlier on Wednesday, BNP secretary general Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir at a press conference alleged that the jail authorities were not allowing Khaleda's relatives and party leaders to meet her with an ulterior motive.

No govt jobs for those involved with Jamaat, war crimes

Platform of freedom fighters announces 46-day programme

A platform of freedom fighters yesterday announced a series of programmes to press home their six-point demand including denial of government jobs to family members of Jamaat-Shibir politicians, war criminals and antiliberation "elements".

The programmes will start on July 19 and continue for 46 days.

Shipping Minister Shajahan Khan, also president of Muktijuddher Chetona Bastobayan Mancha, made the announcement during a rally at Mahanagar Natya Mancha in Dhaka.

Awami League General Secretary Obaidul Quader, Liberation War Affairs Minister AKM Mozammel Haque, and Information Minister Hasanul Haq Inu were present at the programme and extended their support to the six-point demand.

The Liberation War affairs minister said the government will prepare a list of war criminals, razakars and antiliberation forces and their family members so that they can be treated as "class three" citizens of the country.

Speaking as chief guest, Obaidul Quader said that if BNP returns to power, the whole country will turn into a valley of death. "The situation will be more dreadful than 2001."

The other demands include removing family members of Jamaat-Shibir politicians and anti-liberation elements from public service, confiscating the properties of war criminals and banks, educational institutions, and hospitals run by Jamaat-e-Islami.

The platform also demanded formulation of a new law in light of the Holocaust Act or genocide denial act to punish those involved in defaming freedom fighters, Liberation War, martyrs, and Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman.

Moreover, the platform demanded exemplary punishment for the arson attack at the residence of the Dhaka University vice chancellor during the quota reform movement.

According to the announcement, they will organise processions, street rallies, signature collection campaign, and opinion sharing meetings with leaders and workers of professional bodies in all upazilas including in Dhaka. The programmes will end on September 2 through submission of a memorandum to Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina.
