### UGC chairman receives death threat

The chairman of the University Grants Commission (UGC) received a death threat on Tuesday.

Prof Abdul Mannan, also former vice-chancellor of Chittagong University, received the threat via a letter from one Nur Hossain, said the commission in a press statement yesterday.

It further mentioned that the man who wrote the letter claimed to be a resident of Savar, and the letter was sent to the chairman's office by Guaranteed Express Post (GEP) service.

UGC, however, did not say what might be the reason behind the threat.

UGC Security Officer Syed Ashrafuzzaman filed a general diary with Sher-e-Bangla Nagar Police Station yesterday, seeking security measures for the chairman.

**SARWAR ANNOUNCES MANIFESTO**  
BNP-led 20-party alliance's candidate Mojibor Rahman Sarwar yesterday announced a 28-point election manifesto at BNP office on Sadar Road.

In the manifesto, he promised to make the rivers and canals navigable and mitigate waterlogging problem.

The manifesto also contains some popular citizen demands including water and sewerage system development, expansion of city roads, construction of embankment, bridge and beautifying the city.

He also promised to construct an export

processing zone, rehabilitate the hawkers, and improve facilities for women, children and senior citizens.

### SERNIABAT FOR DEVELOPMENT

AL-backed candidate Serniabat Sadiq Abdullah visited different city areas yesterday and spoke to locals about their problems. He assured the voters that if elected mayor he would work relentlessly for the city's development.

He said he too wants a peaceful and fair election. "I don't want a questionable election. I want to become mayor by getting your votes."

"You [voters] can choose any mayoral candidate, it's your freedom of choice," he added. "I want your love and affection first, and then vote. I will always be with you [people] even if I'm not elected."

### CAMPAIGNING CONTINUES

Meanwhile, all mayoral candidates spent a busy day yesterday campaigning.

Manisha Chakrabarty of Bangladesh Shramajitnik Dal and Abul Kalam Azad of CPB met locals in different areas. They pledged to give highest importance to people's rights and rid the administration of corruption.

Iqbal Hossain Taposh of Jatiya Party and Obaidur Rahaman Mahabub of IAB also sought support from voters in different areas.

of the electoral code by AL and intimidation to party leaders and activists.

Ali Ahmed, general secretary of Sylhet district unit of BNP, and a member of the party's election management committee, submitted two complaints to the EC's regional office in Sylhet yesterday.

According to the complaints, law enforcers are intimidating BNP men by visiting their house without any warrant, while a large lighted replica, made of fabric and bamboo, of AL's electoral symbol "boat" was placed in Shahi Eidgah area. It was a violation as any sort of lighting is prohibited during campaigning, said the complaint.

The day before, one complaint mentioned of similar intimidation, while the other said a government office was used for campaigning for the ruling party. On Tuesday, the MAG Osmani Medical College chapter of Bangladesh Nurses Association organised a rally on the college premises, voicing their support for Kamran.

Assistant Returning Officer Proloy Kumar Saha said the EC would look into the complaints.

### 'BNP OUT TO MAKE POLL QUESTIONABLE'

Responding to the complaints, AL's Kamran said BNP was trying to make the election appear questionable. "It is the nature of BNP to raise different issues and make good things appear questionable," he told The Daily Star.

### 'BNP UNSTOPPABLE'

Regarding the chances of their candidate, BNP vice-chairman Mohammad Shahjahan yesterday said no "conspiracy" could stop party candidate Ariful Haque Chowdhury from winning.

"If the election is fair, he will be elected mayor," he said when he, along with the central leaders of BNP, launched the campaign for their candidate yesterday.

On a campaign trail, Ariful Haque said, "The voters need not worry because together we can protect our right to vote and achieve the goal of fair elections."

To ensure continuity of the success, the government will prioritise conservation of jatka (small hilsa), protection of natural fish-breeding grounds, extension of shrimp cultivation, and collection of marine fish at a tolerant level, he said in a written statement. The government will also bring all fishing trawlers and vessels under licence within 2030, and establish 20 marine surveillance check-posts in coastal areas within 2020.

"Approximately 60 percent of animal protein that we consume every day comes from fish. And the fisheries sector contributes 3.57 percent to the country's GDP," the minister said.

The minister also said the fisheries week will be observed across the country through several programmes, like fair, seminar and rally. Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina will wrap up the observance of the week by releasing fish fry in Gono Bhaban lake, he said.

Fisheries and Livestock Ministry Secretary Raisul Alam Mondal and Director General at the Department of Fisheries Goljar Hossain, among others, were also present at the press conference.

### THE FAO REPORT

In getting the third position, Bangladesh produced a total of 10,48,242 tonnes of fish from inland water bodies in 2016, about 2.4 percent higher than 2015, according to the FAO's fisheries and aquaculture report.

China topped the list with 23,18,046 tonnes, while India was in second place with 14,62,063 tonnes, found the report which was made public on July 9. Myanmar and Cambodia secured fourth and fifth positions.

In overall aquaculture production, Bangladesh was placed fifth by producing 22 lakh tonnes in 2016, said the report. China topped that list with a production of 4.92 crore tonnes.

The report also said Bangladesh produced 1,13,200 tonnes of fish from marine and costal sources, and ranked 11th in the list.

Independent candidate Murad Morshed demanded security of polling agents on the election day.

Habibur Rahman, who is contesting from Bangladesh Jatiya Party, and Islami Andolon Bangladesh's mayoral candidate Shafiqul Islam alleged of a lack of level playing field in Rajshahi for candidates.

In his speech, the election commissioner warned officials of Rajshahi's administration, police and election commission of stern action if any allegations of bias were raised against any of them.

He said he saw many festoons and banners of the candidates that do not follow the rules, and asked candidates to remove their illegal campaign materials.

"We will not tolerate any exhibition of money and muscle power," he said, adding that he has directed everyone concerned not to allow a single incident of occupying vote centres and ballot stuffing.

He said at least 10 judicial magistrates, along with 450 BGB, 450 Rab, 1,400 police and 1,932 Ansar members will be deployed to ensure law and order during the election.
