

# 163 students get Prime Minister Gold Medal

A total of 163 students were awarded the Prime Minister Gold Medal, in recognition of securing highest marks/CGPA in their respective faculties.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday handed over the medals among the recipients of different public and private universities of the country during a ceremony held at the Shapla Hall of Prime Minister's Office.

Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid and Secretary of Secondary and Higher Education Division Md Soharab Hossain were present there as special guests.

Professor Abdul Mannan, chairman of UGC, presided over the ceremony while Prof Dr Dil Afroza Begum, member of UGC, delivered the welcome speech.

Prime Minister Gold Medal was introduced in 2005 as an effort to encourage the talented university students of the country.

Ministers; advisers to the prime minister; national professors; former UGC chairmen; secretaries of different ministries and parents and guardians of the awardees, among others, were present on the occasion.

## DSCC places Tk 3,599cr budget

Mayor promises free burial services, old home and more

Announcing burial services for Dhaka city residents free of cost, Dhaka South City Corporation (DSCC) Mayor Sayeed Khokon yesterday placed a Tk 3,598.7 crore budget for the fiscal 2018-19, about 7.82 percent higher than the outgoing fiscal.

The revised budget of the fiscal year 2017-18 was Tk 2014.31 crore.

"We will not take burial charge from any resident at the graveyards under DSCC," said Mayor Khokon while announcing the budget at Nagar Bhaban.

He said they are also going to introduce a hotline for the residents who want to avail themselves of burial facilities (ambulance facility, burial wash and other related facilities) from DSCC.

The mayor also announced to construct an old home for senior citizens who remain neglected in their family. "There are many old people who have to live on footpath or rail-

way stations after being abandoned by their family members, which is very unfortunate. We are going to construct a temporary old home in DSCC area for these people," he said.

To bring city traffic system under discipline, a committee will be formed by the government that will work for bus route rationalisation and running the city's buses under five companies, said the DSCC mayor in his budget speech.

"We are also going to construct 30 bus-bays or bus stoppages under a mega project, to reduce traffic congestion of Dhaka city; we have already started work of three," he added.

Khokon also said they are going to construct two modern animal slaughter houses at Hajaribagh and Kaptan Bazar, to ensure healthy meat for Dhaka residents.

About parks and playgrounds, the mayor said construction work to modernise 31 parks and playgrounds have already started, which

## Thrown in a canal to die

Bus supervisor confesses to mindless killing of NSU student

The supervisor of the Hanif Paribahan bus which NSU student Saidur Rahman Payel was travelling by before his 'mysterious' death, confessed yesterday to a mindless act of killing.

Mohammad Johny, the supervisor, said Payel was thrown into a nearby canal by the bus's driver, helper and himself, after the BBA 5th semester student at North South University was injured while getting back on the bus after relieving himself.

He made the disclosure in a confessional statement under Section 164 to senior judicial magistrate Md Jasim Uddin of Munshiganj Cognizance Court-5 at around 4:00pm yesterday.

Court inspector Hedayatul Islam Bhuiyan and Gazaria Police Station Officer-in-Charge (OC) Harunur Rashid said, according to Johny, a traffic jam formed near Bhatarchar at Gazaria on Dhaka-Chittagong Highway in the early hours of Sunday, where the bus that carried Payel got stuck. Payel got off the bus to relieve himself, and before he could board the bus set off as the traffic eased. He ran behind the bus, and the bus stopped, but he injured himself badly as the bus's automatic door opened on him, and fell unconscious.

The supervisor informed the matter to the driver. Driver Jamal Hossain, helper Faisal and supervisor Johny together decided to not take Payel back to the bus; instead, they carried the bloodied youth and threw him into a canal from over the Bhatarchar bridge. It was about 4:00am and the passengers were sleeping.

The OC said, Payel was alive when he was thrown into the water, which is evident by the fact that he ingested some 10 to 15kg water while drowning. There was water in his abdomen, as mentioned in inquest and post-mortem reports.

Police arrested Johny from Motijheel area in Dhaka on Tuesday night, and took him to Gazaria Police Station. He confessed to committing the crime to police that same night.

## 10th-grader kills herself over 'snatched exam paper'

Teacher arrested

A 10th-grade student of Shaheed Faruk Iqbal Girls' High School committed suicide by hanging herself with ceiling fan on Tuesday night, and blamed her teacher for her death.

The deceased was identified as Sumaiya Akhtar Maliha, 14, a resident of Gulbag, Shahjahanpur who took part in pre-test examination for SSC exam.

Police arrested the teacher, Rimi Akhtar, after a case was filed by her father, Mohammad Ali Bhuiyan over instigation to suicide.

A court later placed Rimi on a one-day remand for interrogation.

The victim's cousin Al-Amin said family members of Mailha found her hanging body around 10:00pm in her room, which she had locked from inside a few hours prior.

Her mother and younger sister were in another room of the house. They broke the door with help of neighbours when they did not get any response from inside after knocking the door again and again, he said.

A suicide note was found in her room, which read, "The only cause of my suicide is Rimi madam. She snatched my exam paper without any reason, and gave me low marks in the examination. If you

# Bigger tragedy averted

Say investigators; probe at final stage

The IS-inspired "Neo JMB" reserved a brigade at Kalyanpur den in a bid to carry out three simultaneous follow-up attacks, after they had successfully carried out the Gulshan café attack, investigators said yesterday.

A successful crackdown, code-named 'Operation Storm 26' at the "Jahaz building" in Kalyanpur on this day in 2016 deterred the militants from the attacks. Documents and information in the den subsequently helped law enforcers fight back against the country's rising terror network.

At least 15 persons, apart from the nine killed in the hideout, were involved in plotting the attacks -- two in the capital's Dhanmondi and Mirpur while another in Narayanganj.

"The militants even completed all groundwork and were scheduled to carry out the attack within a week," high officials of Counter-Terrorism and Transnational Crime (CTTC) unit, told The Daily Star.

The officials, requesting anonymity, further said the militants also rented a house in Narayanganj while another militant was trying to rent a house in Mirpur. Counterterrorism officials

revealed the information yesterday, as the investigation of the incident comes to its final stages.

"We are very close to completing our investigation and hope to submit the charge sheet soon, as all the necessary reports and evidence are in our hand," Mohibul Islam Khan, deputy commissioner of CTTC unit, told The Daily Star yesterday. Of the 15 militants involved in the attack plots, eight were also named in the charge sheet of the Holy Artisan café attack, that left 20 hostages, mostly foreigners, and two police official killed on July 1, 2016.

## 400 BRTC workers go on strike in capital

Allege of long-pending arrears; commuters suffer

Transport workers of BRTC's Joar Sahara depot in Dhaka yesterday went on an indefinite work abstention, to press home their demand for arrears, causing sufferings to passengers of several bus routes.

Locking the main gate of the depot since morning, more than 400 workers went on work abstention, hampering service of more than 80 buses including some double-deckers and AC buses, officials and workers said.

Of the buses, around 30 buses are allocated for staffers of government organisations, while the rest mainly ply Abdullahpur-Motijheel, Tongi-Motijheel and Gazipur-Motijheel routes, they said.
