STADIA 'TOO SMALL' FOR ZLATAN



Shohagi beats Shirin as Navy edge Army in medal's tally

in the 100m sprint by Shirin on the previous day, exacted revenge by clocked 25.10 seconds to win the gold medal. Shirin was 0.10 seconds slower while Sharifa Khatun of Bangladesh Army finished third with a timing of 25.40 seconds.

Shohagi had won the same event in last year's summer meet even though Shirin had won the gold in the National Athletics Championship later in the year.

Even though Shohagi was happy with beating the national champion, she was not satisfied with her overall effort as she felt she got tired towards the end of her dash.

"Even though I was leading considerably in the beginning, I eased up later, probably due to fatigue. I had to run 400m and 100m yesterday, so that probably had an impact on my performance. I would have been happier if my timing was a bit better," said the Navy sprinter.

"I will try to do well in the South Asian Games. It will be hard to compete against the best, but I want to improve on my timing," added Shohagi.

Meanwhile, promising athlete Zahir Raihan, who missed last year's national championship due to injury after making it to the semifinals of the World U-18 Championships, beat Shariful Islam by a distance to cruise to the title.

The 18-year-old BKSP student clocked 21.70 seconds while Shariful of Bangladesh Army took 0.50 seconds more to settle for the silver medal. Last year's national meet champion Abdur Rouf of Bangladesh Navy had to be content with a third-place finish after clocking 22.60 seconds.

Zahir, who won the 400m gold on the previous day, said he was confident after putting in a lot of effort in training.

"I was a bit worried after having been out of practice for a long time due to injury. But I trained hard and had the belief that I could do well," Zahir said.

"400m and 200m are my favourite events. I believe I can do well in next year's SA Games if I am provided the facilities and good training," said the boy from Sherpur.

Shohagi's gold in the 100m and her team's gold medal haul in the 4X100m relay in both men's and women's events helped Navy edge Bangladesh Army in the final tally of medals. Navy ended with 13 gold, 15 silver and 11 bronze for a total of 39 medals. Army, despite a four-gold haul by the meet's best athlete Sumi Akter, finished second with 11 gold, 14 silver and 13 bronze for a total of 38 medals. BKSP finished third with only three gold medals.

England central defender Harry Maguire's impressive performances at the World Cup has made him a prime target for Manchester United manager Jose Mourinho, according to British media reports on Saturday.

The 25-year-old is believed to want to secure the move although Leicester's Thai owners are reluctant to sell after another of their stars Algerian forward Riyad Mahrez moved to champions Manchester City last month for a club record fee of £60million (\$79million).

Maguire, who impressed alongside John Stones in England's run to the World Cup semi-finals, will cost £65million with part of the outlay being offset by selling Argentinian defender Marcos Rojo -- United value him at £30million -- and Italian fullback Matteo Darmian, the Daily Mirror claims.

Rojo is attracting interest from Premier League newboys Wolverhampton Wanderers whilst Darmian is coveted by both the Milan clubs.

According to the Daily Mail the injury-prone 28year-old Rojo -- who cost United £16million when he signed from Sporting Lisbon in 2014 -- has been removed from the club's branding by the marketing department for the upcoming season.

The Sun reports that Maguire's chances of moving to United could depend on whether Leicester are successful in buying Newcastle skipper Jamaal Lascelles, they are preparing a £35million bid for the player voted by the fans The Magpies player of last season.

Ozil shines on return

successful return to action at the end of a tumultuous week as the German midfielder

scored the opening goal for Arsenal in a 5-1 victory over a makeshift Paris St Germain side in a pre-season friendly in Singapore on Saturday.

Ozil sensationally quit the national side on Sunday citing "racism and disrespect" for his Turkish roots as he bore the brunt of criticism following Germany's disastrous World Cup, but he looked relaxed and focused against the French champions.

Arsenal fielded a strong team with Ozil installed as captain and the Premier League side soon took control against weakened opposition, given the time and space they will not be afforded when the domestic campaign kicks off in August. The German did not need long to

stamp his authority on the contest, side-footing past a stranded Gianluigi Buffon in the 13th minute after Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang had raced clear down the right and sent a pinpoint low cross into Ozil's path.

Mesut Ozil enjoyed a nant and should have added to their kick awarded on the advice of the tally, but Buffon showed the brilliance that earned him 176 caps for Italy, saving well to deny Alex Iwobi, Aubameyang and Henrikh Mkhitaryan when they were all clean through on goal.

The French champions offered little in a tepid first-half display, midfielder Azzedine Toufiqui twice curling shots wide of Bernd Leno's right-hand post before the German keeper stood firm to block Timothy Weah's powerful shot in the 34th minute.

Christopher Nkunku produced Paris St Germain's best moment of the half shortly before the break when the French midfielder jinked past three Arsenal defenders before sending a rising shot just over the Arsenal crossbar.

Paris St Germain made a much stronger start to the second half and Nkunku soon tested replacement goalkeeper Emiliano Martinez with a stinging free kick from the edge of the penalty area that

The 60th-minute strike was reward for Paris St Germain's endeavour but they were only level for seven minutes as substitute Alexandre Lacazette scooped a sublime finish over Buffon from close range to re-establish Arsenal's advantage.

The Frenchman needed just three more minutes to double his personal tally when Buffon missed a punch as Paris St Germain scrambled to clear, leaving an unmarked Lacazette to make it 3-1 with a free header that bounced in off the post.

Defender Rob Holding and striker Eddie Nketiah rounded out the scoring in the dying minutes as a rampant Arsenal more than made up for a disappointing penalty shootout defeat to Atletico Madrid in the tournament opener on Thursday.
