Protests flare up

Police beat up students demanding justice for death of two in Sunday's road accident; Road blocks severely disrupt traffic in the capital

Law enforcers beat up dozens of students in different areas of the capital yesterday, as several thousand school and college students took to the streets demanding safe road and justice for their two peers killed in Sunday's road crash.

At least 20 students, some of them

female, were injured in Kafrul alone as police baton-charged them in efforts to clear the roads. Several other students were injured in Uttara and Science Laboratory area in police Science Laboratory Intersection.

BNP surprised over Sylhet

It thought AL would take all; ruling party sees infiltration, organisational weakness behind poor show in the city

The election result that put the BNP mayoral hopeful ahead of the Awami League contestant in the Sylhet city polls came as a "surprise" to the party high-ups as they had feared the ruling party would take away all the three mayoral posts through irregularities.

Some AL leaders, however, said the Sylhet result is frustrating and it gives a signal that BNP-Jamaat men infiltrated into the party and they might betray it in the national polls.

BNP leaders say Rajshahi and Barisal had long been their strongholds but they lost those to the AL. The vote margins proved that there were widespread "irregularities" in those two cities, they added. As there were "irregularities" also in Sylhet, Ariful Haque

Chowdhury's taking the lead was unexpected to the party, SEE PAGE 2 COL 2
