# Bangalees face abuse, threats in Meghalaya

Fear, outrage grow over Assam citizen list

As fear and anger run deep over Assam's citizenship issue, many of those left off the final draft of National Registration of Citizens (NRC) complain of being harassed at different places of neighbouring state of Meghalaya.

"Centring the NRC, Bangalees are being tortured. Khasi people are intercepting them on different roads in Meghalaya," local daily Jugasankha reported yesterday.

It said activists under the banner of Khasi Students' Union (KSU) were forcing people to get down from vehicles to check their nationalities.

According to The Northeast Today, KSU has set up checkpoints in three districts and detected more than 1,000 "immigrants".

More than 200 "immigrants" were detected at the checkpoint at Pahammawlein, 20 Mile, in Ri Bhoi and were sent SEE PAGE 13 COL 4

### No worries over Assam NRC draft

Says Indian envoy in Dhaka; it won't affect Dhaka-Delhi ties

Amid concern over the controversial citizenship verification process which put a question mark on the status of over 4 million people living in Assam, India has said Bangladesh has nothing to worry about and it will have no impact on relations between the two countries.

"This is entirely an internal matter of India and the Supreme Court of India is monitoring the process. The National Register of Citizens [NRC] exercise is being carried out in a totally objective, transparent and meticulous manner," said

# UAE govt offers 3-month amnesty

In a landmark move, the United Arab Emirates yesterday launched a threemonth visa amnesty programme, hoping to resolve a "Catch-22" for foreign workers who are fined daily for overstaying their permits but prevented from leaving until they pay the penalties.

The government isn't releasing specific numbers, but said it expects "thousands" of people, primarily labourers from countries like Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Pakistan, Nepal and the Philippines, to take advantage of the amnesty through the end of October, reports AP.

Talking to The Daily Star by phone yesterday, Arman Ullah Chowdhury, counsellor at Bangladesh embassy in Abu Dhabi, said this was a huge opportunity for the Bangladeshis who had been undocumented for months or years and could not return home or regularise their immigration status.

There are around 7 lakh Bangladeshis working in the UAE. And, about 5,000 of them may be undocumented, he said.

"Those who want to go home can do it without paying any fines. The embassy will issue them outpasses [travel passes] at a discount rate. Generally, we charge 60 dirham [1 dirham=Tk 23] for issuing an outpass, but now we have brought it down to 20 dirham," Arman said.

The amnesty will continue for three months until October 30. Besides, SEE PAGE 13 COL 2

### Vietnam's Golden Bridge goes viral



US President Donald Trump yesterday called on Attorney General Jeff Sessions to end a federal investigation into Russian interference in the 2016 presidential election and whether there was any cooperation by his campaign with Moscow.

The Republican president, who has long complained about the criminal probe into his White House victory, said the idea that his campaign worked with Moscow was a

"TOTAL HOAX" in a series of tweets aimed at undermining the integrity of Special Counsel Robert Mueller's investigation.

In what appeared to be his most direct call for shutting down the probe, Trump wrote on Twitter: "This is a terrible situation and Attorney General Jeff Sessions should stop this Rigged Witch Hunt right now, before it continues to stain our country any further.

"Bob Mueller is totally conflicted," Trump continued. He provided no evidence SEE PAGE 13 COL 2


