

## CU students demand improved transport services

Students of Chittagong University (CU), in three separate programmes yesterday, demanded that safe transport facilities are ensured for its students, and that the number of shuttle train compartments is increased.

Under the banner of "General Students of CU", students of different departments formed a human chain at city's Sholoshohor Railway Station at 7:30am where they demanded that employment be provided to Rabiul Alam, a Masters student of Sociology department of CU who lost both his legs under the university's shuttle train on Wednesday morning.

While addressing the programme, the speakers thanked the university administration for promising to bear the medical expenses of the ill-fated student.

Meanwhile, another human chain was formed at the university's Central Shaheed Minar premises at 11:00am, organised by left-leaning student organisations including Chhatra Union and Chhatra Front, demanding an increase in the compartments of the CU shuttle train.

They claimed that though the transport crisis has been a major suffering for many years for students of the university, the decrease of shuttle train compartments in recent times has intensified their woes.

Their other demands include introduction of double rail line from Sholoshohor station to CU campus station, introduction of bus service from university's Gate No. 1 area to Zero Point area, ensuring security in the shuttle trains and appointment of manpower at all stations.

Later, they also staged a sit-in programme at the university's Bangabandhu Chattar.

Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) unit of CU also formed another human chain at Central Shaheed Minar at 12:30pm with the same demands. Around 500 activists along with a large number of general students took part in the programme.

They threatened to go for tougher programme if their demands are not met, and later brought out a procession to press home their demands.

## ADB to give \$100m infrastructure Students have shown how assistance at Rohingya camps in two months after ADB received a

The Asian Development Bank (ADB) is going to give a \$100 million grant in the first phase for development of basic infrastructure and service for the Rohingyas living in refugee camps in Cox's Bazar. Bangladesh government and the Asian Development Bank (ADB) signed an agreement in this regard yesterday.

The grant assistance forms part of an envisaged package totaling \$200 million, said an ADB statement.

Kazi Shofiqul Azam, Secretary, Economic Relations Division (ERD), and Manmohan Parkash, Country Director, ADB, signed the agreement on behalf of Bangladesh and ADB respectively at a ceremony at ERD.

"The grant assistance project has been prepared, processed and approved at an extraordinary speed

request for grant assistance from the Government of Bangladesh in May 2018," said Manmohan Parkash. "We are very happy that ADB's member countries quickly approved the fund as grant since ADB doesn't have a separate window for providing grant for displaced persons," Parkash added.

The grant will support the displaced people sheltered in camps in the Ukhia and Teknaf of Cox's Bazar, focusing on water supply and sanitation, disaster risk management, energy, and roads.

The ADB support will be aligned with the multi-sector Joint Response Plan prepared by the UN-led Inter Sector Coordination Group in coordination with the government. The project has been developed and will be implemented in close coordination with UN agencies, the World Bank, and

other donors and humanitarian agencies, according to the ADB statement.

ADB said the first phase of the project will spend \$100 million over about 2.5 years. In addition, the government will provide \$20 mil-

Bangladesh and the (ADB) yesterday signed two more loan agreements amounting \$250.44 million.

Of the amount, \$225 million is for overhauling secondary education and boosting education quality, access, and relevance. ADB said the assistance is the third and final tranche of the \$500 million Secondary Education Sector Investment Programme (SESIP) approved in 2013.

Another agreement was signed under which \$25.44 million in grant will be given to Bangladesh to spur off-grid solar photovoltaic (SPV) pumping for agricultural irrigation.

The motorcyclist was speeding away ignoring signal of traffic policemen

A youth died as a truck hit his motorbike while it was speeding away ignoring the signal of traffic policemen in Kurigram

yesterday. Khairuzzaman Khokan, 25, was joint convener of Shilkhuri union unit of Bangladesh Chhatra League, said Altaf Hossain, president of the union unit of

Awami League. Khokan, who was from Uttar Chhat Gopalpur village in Bhurungamari upazila, was going to Sonahat Land Port, said Bango Sonahat Union Parishad Chairman

Shahjahan Ali Molla. Traffic policemen signalled him to stop near Sonahat Degree College on Bhurungamari-Sonahat road, said police.

But, Khokan did not comply with the signal and rode away, said Imtiaz Kabir, officer-in-charge of Bhurungamari Police Station.

On his way, a truck hit him from the opposite direction, said the OC.

With head injuries, Khokan was rushed to Bhurungamari Upazila Health Complex where he was referred to Rangpur Medical College Hospital.

The Dhaka University authorities yesterday handed a student over to Shahbagh police as he allegedly made "derogatory" comments on Facebook about Awami League, BCL

and a member of Bangabandhu's family. Rafsan Ahmed, a first year student of the Institute of Education and Research (IER), posted, "It's my wish that would abolish the lineage of Chhatra League as well as Awami League. Then there would be no unrest."

Besides, he labelled Sheikh Kamal as a "Bank Robber", in a comment of another post marking the birthday of the son of Bangabandhu, said IER unit BCL president MR Mukul Islam.

After seeing the post, a group of BCL men led by Mukul Islam took him to the proctor's office.

Rafsan made such comments as he had anger towards AL as well as BCL, Mukul quoted him as saying.

Contacted, Proctor Prof AKM Golam Rabbani said the student has been handed over to police for quizzing under ICT Act. Officer-in-Charge Abul Hasan acknowledged the detention.

# DU student handed Court upholds Ragib Ali, son's jail terms

A special court in Sylhet yesterday upheld a lower court's verdict that sent industrialist Ragib Ali and his son Abdul Hye to jail in a case filed for grabbing the endowed property of Tarapur Tea Estate in Sylhet by forging title deeds.

The court of Special District and Sessions Judge Dilip Kumar Bhoumik passed the order upholding the verdict of Sylhet Chief Metropolitan Magistrate, after hearing the appeal of the convicts, said Nawshad Ahmed Choudhury, special public prosecutor of the court. The Sylhet CMM court sentenced the duo

to total fourteen years' rigorous imprisonment each in February last year, Public Prosecutor Nawshad said.

They were also fined Tk 10,000 each, in

default of which they will have to serve

another three months in jail. The special court ordered the duo to surrender before the lower court concerned by September 17 this year. Ragib Ali and

Abdul Hye are currently on bail. On August 25, 1999, the then parliamentary watchdog on land affairs found that Tarapur Tea Estate grabbed a vast area of an endowment property and set up several

establishments on the land illegally. Later, the subcommittee of the parliamentary watchdog recommended taking legal action against the illegal occupants.

SM Abdul Kadir, the then land commissioner of Sylhet Sadar, filed two cases against six people, including Ragib Ali, with Sylhet Kotwali Police Station on September 27, 2005.

Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) yesterday arrested a man and seized a large quantity of VoIP (Voice over Internet Protocol) equipment after raiding his rented flat in Bakalia area of

Chittagong city. Additional Superintendent of Police Sohel Mahmud of Rab-7 said the arrestee, Mohammad Shahdat, 35, runs a mobile phone and accessories business in the city's Riajuddin Bazar area.

"Upon secret information, Rab seized the huge quantity of VoIP equipment after raiding the top floor flat of a threestorey building on Old Bakalia Police Station Road around 5:00pm and detained Shahdat," he said.

Shahdat had been operating the illegal business from the rented flat for a long time, the official said, adding that he was handed over to Bakalia Police Station and a case was filed.
