the Sun's surface, it also hurls powerful plasma and energetic particles that can unleash geomagnetic space storms and disrupt Earth's power grid.

"The Parker Solar Probe will help us do a much better job of predicting when a disturbance in the solar wind could hit Earth," said Justin Kasper, one of the project scientists and a professor at the University of Michigan.

The probe is protected by an ultrapowerful heat shield that is just 4.5 inches thick (11.43 centimetres).

The shield should enable the spacecraft to survive its close shave with the centre of our solar system, coming within 3.83 million miles (6.16 million kilometres) of the Sun's surface.

The heat shield is built to withstand radiation equivalent up to about 500 times the Sun's radiation here on Earth.

Even in a region where temperatures can reach more than a million degrees Fahrenheit, the sunlight is expected to heat the shield to just around 2,500 degrees Fahrenheit (1,371 degrees Celsius).

Scorching, yes? But if all works as planned, the inside of the spacecraft should stay a cooler 85 F (29 C).

The goal for the Parker Solar Probe is to make 24 passes through the corona during its seven-year mission.

"The sun is full of mysteries," said Nicky Fox, project scientist at the Johns Hopkins University Applied Physics

Visiting Madhupur's Jalchhatra, the largest pineapple market in the region, on Friday, this correspondent saw that wholesalers from across the country were gathered there.

Ruhul Amin, a farmer from Jhatarbaid area, said that although the pineapple yield was good this season, the prices were lower than that of the

previous one. "I have sold nearly 400 pineapples with large ones priced Tk 20 to 25 and the small ones priced Tk 8 to Tk 10. On an average, the price of each fruit has

come down by Tk 5 to 10," he said. Several other growers echoed his

view on the matter. Motaleb Miah, a trader from Dhaka, said he was hoping to have good profit

by selling pineapples in the capital.

"I hope to sell large size pineapple in Dhaka for Tk 40" he said.

Several pineapple growers in Madhupur said they were not getting adequate prices for their produce as they lack proper marketing and preser-

vation facilities. Asked about the issue, Upazila Agriculture Officer Mahmudul Hasan said process was underway to export

pineapple to several European coun-"Local pineapple growers will get just prices if factories producing pineapple

jam, jelly and juice are set up in Madhupur," he said.

The agriculture officer also emphasised ensuring proper marketing and preservation facilities for the fruits.

With saplings brought from Meghalaya of India, local Garo leader Jevier Chishim first cultivated pineapple at Idilpur village in Madhupur in 1942. The production of the fruit became popular in the upazila gradually.

city road crash on July 29.

College students Dia Khanam Mim and Abdul Karim Rajib were killed on the spot as a Jabal-e-Noor bus ploughed through a crowd while competing with another bus of the same company. The accident triggered fury among the students, mostly in their mid-teens, who defied pouring rain to take to the streets of the capital with slogans "We want justice", bringing traffic to a standstill.

The movement turned violent as police and ruling party men swooped on the protesters triggering clashes. In the last two days of protests, the city saw brutal assaults on students who have been staging unprecedented demonstrations. Around 250 people, mostly protesters, were injured in

incidents of clashes and attacks. At least 12 journalists were also assaulted on August 5 by alleged ruling party men.

Strangely, police have made students accused in cases filed over the violence in the capital, leaving out the alleged ruling party men involved in the attacks on road safety demonstra-

tors and journalists. Over the incidents of violence, 29 cases have been filed under the Penal Code and 41 people, including 22 students of private universities, were arrested. All the 22 private university students were denied bail and sent to

Mahmood, who is leading a 15member delegation on a four-day visit, is scheduled to tour Northern Rakhine State this morning to see the preparations for repatriating more than 720,000 Rohingyas who have taken shelter in Bangladesh since August 25 last year to escape a brutal military crackdown.

Myanmar Minister for Labour, Immigration and Population Thein Swe and Minister for Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement Win Myat Aye were also present at yesterday's meeting.

Later, Myanmar State Counsellor's Office posted a press release on its official Facebook page, outlining the issues discussed at the meeting. However, Bangladesh foreign ministry didn't issue any statement as of 11:00pm yesterday.

The two countries discussed the implementation of the bilateral agreement -- the Arrangement on Return of Displaced Persons from Rakhine State -- signed on November 23 last year.

They agreed on eight points, including one on intensifying cooperation on counter-terrorism and the fight against drug trafficking through

exchange of intelligence, collaboration between border guard officials and coordinated border patrols. The two sides reached a consensus

on quick repatriation of the Rohingyas staying along the international border between Myanmar and Bangladesh, in particular the area between the international border and the fence put up on Myanmar territory. As per last year's agreement,

Myanmar has built two reception centres and a transit camp, according to the press release issued by Myanmar State Counsellor's Office. Bangladesh has confirmed progress

on the five transit camps; one is complete, another is under construction, and three are yet to be built, it mentioned.

Both parties agreed that the repatriation of the Rohingyas will be done in a voluntary, safe and dignified manner, and verification forms are to be distributed among them.

Signatures, fingerprints, and photo IDs are to be completed when the refugees fill out the forms by themselves. This needs to be done to indicate voluntary return and assist with Myanmar's verification process, it added.
