RMG workers' wage not sufficient for decent living

Views-exchange meeting told

It is possible to fix Tk 16,000 as minimum wage for garment workers if factory owners and international brands bring down the amount of profits they earn now, speakers said at a views-exchange meeting yesterday.

The current minimum wage is not sufficient at all to ensure a decent living for the workers, said Dr Khandaker Golam Moazzem, director (research wing) of the Centre for Policy Dialogue (CPD). Bangladesh Garment Sramik Sanghati organised the meeting at Jatiya

Press Club to publish their research paper on "Ki Kore Bache Sramik" (the living conditions of workers) and discuss the results, according to a press release. The research was carried out on 200 workers of six factories of the country. A garment worker earns only Tk 8,200 through salary, bonus and other

allowances, said President of the Sramik Sanghati Taslima Akhtar while disclosing the findings. On an average, the family of a garment worker having four members has

only two earners, and their incomes add up to only Tk 15,863 a month, she Around 61 percent of workers say their expenditure is higher than their

earning. To adjust the deficit, they have to take loans or cut spending on food and accommodation, said Taslima. Findings also show a garment worker has to do up to 60 hours of overtime

duties in a month on an average which deprives them of an adequate

as minimum wage and demanded Tk 16,000, Taslima said. Executive Director of Bangladesh Institute of Labour Studies Syed Sultan Uddin Ahmed said, "We have weakness in the bargaining capacity in the international market, and workers are being the sole victim of it."

But what works behind a child's mind is far from what the state

After the boy's success in the global competition which brought the country honour, fear gripped his parents. They sent their young son away from where he wanted to grow up in nature just like every other Bangalee boy.

"The artwork came out of a child's mind. I drew it with the hope of getting a world where people from every community would live in peace, but in reality, two years after the global contest, I was sent to Comilla Ispahani School and College from my village home Bhedbhedi in Rangamati for the fear of repression on indigenous communities," said Rebang, now 24.

After he entered university, Rebang was elected general secretary of Bangladesh Indigenous Students' Organisation. He hardly visits the place of his birth in fear that he might be just another victim of repression on indigenous people.

The youth said, "My parents fear that one day I may not return home like Kalpana Chakma (an indigenous rights leader) if I stay in the hills."

Kalpana, then organising secretary of the Hill Women's Federation, was abducted from her Rangamati home on June 11, 1996, never to return again.

The story of Rebang resonates with the plight of indigenous communities in Bangladesh.

On September 13, 2007, the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP) was adopted at the UN General Assembly. UNDRIP is a landmark accomplishment for the memberstates recognising the rights of the world's indigenous population. The declaration encourages harmonious and cooperative relations between the states and indigenous peoples.

Eleven years into the adoption of UNDRIP, Canada, which voted

against the declaration, recently reversed its position, and now supports the declaration while Bangladesh is one of the 11 countries that abstained from voting and has not changed its position yet. However, different governments have promised several times to work together with the indigenous communities for the implementation of UNDRIP.

In Bangladesh, indigenous communities are facing torture and discrimination over the years due to the state's refusal to identify them as "indigenous" in the constitution, lack of recognition of their traditional land rights, denial of access to justice, and lack of proper representation in decision-making levels, said Rebang.

The recent arson attacks in Longadu, alleged extrajudicial killing of Romel Chakma, the case of Santal farmers of Sahebganj-Bagda Farm in Gaibandha, rape and harassment of two Marma sisters,

and murder of fourth grader Kritika Tripura after rape are some of the vivid examples of what these minority communities live through.

There are around three million indigenous people in the plain lands and the hills in the country, according to Bangladesh Adivasi Forum. These ethnic communities saw a

ray of hope after the Chittagong Hill Tracts Peace Accord was signed in 1997, but major provisions of the agreement, involving land disputes resolution, withdrawal of temporary military camps, and devolution of power to the local bodies, are yet to be fulfilled, said the student leader.

Rebang once dreamt of becoming a painter. Now he wants to fight for indigenous people's rights to education, health, employment, and language for the rest of his life. He still believes what he believed as a child—the sun of friendship will rise one day.

KILLINGS OF TWO PERSONS

Two murder cases filed in Dinajpur

Two separate cases were filed over the killings of two people in Birganj upazila of Dinajpur on Thursday night.

Earlier in the day, a mob beat up and burned a 28-yearold man alive accusing him of killing a security guard and stabbing two others including a 5-year-old boy.

The killings took place beside Dinajpur-Panchagarh highway at Purba Jagdal village, police said. The security guard was Suruz Ali, 40, son of Abul

Kashem, and the man killed by villagers was Rabiul Islam, 28, son of Tara Mia. They were from Purba Jagdal village. Hamidul Alam, superintendent of police in Dinajpur,

said Suruz was stabbed to death while he was working near the highway early in the morning. Another security guard Shahid Hossain, 35, and his son Ekramul Haque, 5, were stabbed in Haatkhola area soon afterwards.

As the news spread, angry villagers blocked the highway at Purba Jagdal around 6:00am and burnt him to death, he said.

Suruz's sister Tara Banu filed a murder case with Birganj Police Station accusing five people, said Officer-in-Charge Shakila Parvin.

On the other hand, Atul Chandra Devnath, a member of village police, filed the other case against 300 unnamed people, she added.

Journalists demand justice for attacks on colleagues

Over 100 journalists from different news organisations yesterday formed a human chain in front of Bangladesh National Museum in Dhaka demanding exemplary punishment of goons who attacked on-duty journalists covering the student protest for safe roads.

The human chain condemned the attacks allegedly by ruling party men and the silent role of law enforcers.

Journalists said law enforcers are arresting student protesters who demanded safe roads while not doing anything about those who carried out brutal attacks on students and journalists.

School and college students began demonstrations demanding concrete government steps to improve road safety following the deaths of two of their peers in a city road crash on July 29.

Journalists were brutally attacked and harassed while covering the movement. Reporters and photographers were barred from taking photos or recording videos by thugs in front of law enforcers. Reporters of different private TV channels were also threatened.

Internationally recognised photographer Shahidul Alam was arrested after posting Facebook videos about the student protests in Bangladesh and giving an interview to Al Jazeera.
