Only 10km of planned 22km Bus Rapid Transit possible, that too not before 2024


- Airport-Keraniganj Bus Rapid Transit now partially implementable
- Arbitrarily built flyovers act as roadblocks to mass transport service

The rapid bus service, much touted as a way to ease the capital's chronic traffic congestion, may be implemented only in part, and that too not before 2024, as arbitrarily built flyovers block its proposed route, said officials and transport experts.

The city's transport master plan recommended the rapid bus service as a means to ease the perennial traffic jams. But the Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) implemented in part would not serve the purpose envisioned in the plan, they said.

PM vows to punish those responsible for death of 2 students in road crash

UNB, Dhaka

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday vowed to bring to book those responsible for the accident that took the lives of two students of Shaheed Ramiz Uddin Cantonment College.

"This is completely unforgivable because the driver was driving the bus defying all the [traffic] rules, resulting in the loss of two lives ... many students were also injured," she said.

The PM said this while speaking at a programme at Armed Forces Medical College ground after laying the foundation stone of an underpass at a road adjacent to Shaheed Ramiz Uddin Cantonment College in the

Hasina said the government would never spare the bus driver involved in the brutal accident. "We must ensure the due punishment to those involved in such accidents; we'll do that."

Students and villagers blocked Rangpur-: Kurigram road for nearly four hours after a · 10th grader was run over and killed by a speeding bus in Ghagatpara area of Rangpur yesterday morning.

Tanvir Ahmed Zion, 15, was going to school riding his bicycle around 11:00am when the bus hit him from behind killing him at the scene, his cousin Masud Rana told The Daily Star.

Driver Insan Ali Sanu, 38, who was arrested in the evening, didn't have the · license to drive heavy vehicles, said · Mizanur Rahman, superintendent of police in Rangpur.

BRTA armed with 8 more magistrates

To step up mobile court drive against traffic rules violation


The Bangladesh Road Transport Authority (BRTA) is going to strengthen its enforcement of traffic rules in Dhaka and Chittagong by deploying mobile courts three times the existing number.

Currently, only three mobile courts are carrying out operations in Dhaka and occasionally in Chittagong. The pubic administration ministry on Thursday issued an order posting eight more executive magistrates to BRTA offices in Dhaka and Chittagong to conduct mobile courts.

"With the new executive magistrates, we will be able to increase mobile court drives and strengthen enforcement of laws," Nur Mohammad Mazumder, director (enforcement) of BRTA, told The Daily Star yesterday.

Tragic death of 4 schoolboys

Drown in Dhaka, N'ganj while swimming

Four school students drowned in separate incidents in Ramna Lake in the capital and the Meghna river in Narayanganj yesterday.

Abdullah al Mahfuz and Naimuzzaman Chowdhury Adnan, both ninth grader at Willes Little Flower School & College, got into the lake for bathing after playing football in the park, said Arif Hossain, a friend of the victims.

Both plunged in the middle of the lake as Mahfuz tried to swim ashore with Adnan, who cannot swim, on his shoulder around 3:45pm, he said.

A frightened Adnan held Mahfuz tightly, eventually sending both under water, Arif told reporters at Dhaka Medical College Hospital. They were rescued by bystanders and rushed to the

DMCH where doctors declared them dead, said subinspector Bachchu Mia of the DMCH police outpost. Abul Hossain, principal of the college, told The Daily

Star the two did not attend class yesterday.

In Narayanganj, two students drowned as one tried to save his cousin from drowning in the Meghna at Sonargaon around 12:30pm. SEE PAGE 2 COL 5
