

His first namaz-ejanaza was held after the Asr prayers on Monday at the south plaza of the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban.

The second one was held on Kurigram Central Eidgah ground at 3:00pm yesterday.

Also the opposition chief whip, Tajul died at the capital's United Hospital at 11:41pm on Monday after he was admitted to the hospital with heart complications on August 12.

A resident of Sabujpara in Kurigram Sadar and presidium member of JP, Tajul became MP seven times. He left behind his wife, two sons and a daughter.

#### CMP traffic week: 11,712 cases filed

A total of 11,712 cases were filed and 945 vehicles were seized in 10 days of the extended traffic week in Chittagong city that ended on Tuesday, police said yesterday.

According to an email from the traffic division of Chittagong Metropolitan Police (CMP), more than Tk 35 lakh in fines were realised during the special drive.

Against the backdrop of recent student protests demanding safe roads, the traffic week was launched following a dirctive of Bangladesh Police Headquarters.

The drive, which was supposed to end on August 11, was later extended by three days.

#### Police constable among three held with yaba

Three persons including a police constable were held with yaba pills in their possession from a hotel in Khulna city on Tuesday, law enforcers said.

The arrestees were identified as Constable Pritom Roy, posted in Khulna Police Lines, and his cohorts Sumon Mondal, and Shawon Roy.

On information, a team of police entered the Mid Night Residential Hotel and arrested the trio from a room and recovered nine yaba pills, Humayun Kabir, officer-in-charge of Khulna Sadar Police Station said. A case has been filed against them, the OC added.

### 32 gold bars seized from Biman aircraft

Customs officials seized 32 unclaimed gold bars, weighing around 3.7 kilograms, on an aircraft of Biman Bangladesh Airlines at Shah Amanat International Airport yesterday morning.

Officials of Chittagong customs and Customs Intelligence and Investigation Directorate (CIID) found the gold after searching a carry-on bag in the onboard luggage compartment of the aircraft after it arrived at the airport from Dubai.

No one, however, was arrested in this connection.

Mahbubur Rahman, assistant commissioner at Chittagong Customs House, said CIID and customs officials searched the aircraft based on secret information that Biman's BG 148 flight, that reached Chittagong from Dubai around 8:00am, had a consignment of smuggled gold on board. "After searching the hand luggage shelf on the plane, the

32 pieces of gold bars, weighing around 3.7 kilograms, were found in a hand bag," said CIID Assistant Director Abu Hanif Mohammed Abdul Ahad.

The ownership of the bag was not claimed by any one and the matter was under investigation, he added. Since January 2018 till date, over 297 pieces of gold bars have been seized from Chittagong Shah Amanat

#### Road accidents kill four

At least four persons were killed in separate road accidents in three districts yesterday.

In Kishoreganj, three persons died on the spot on Bhairab-Kishoreganj road after a Kishoreganj-bound CNGrun auto-rickshaw was hit by a bus coming from the opposite direction in Kuliarchar upazila, reports our correspondent.

The identities of the deceased could not be known immediately, said police.

On information, law enforcers seized the vehicles but the bus driver managed to flee.

Meanwhile in Mymensingh, Khandaker Shamim Hossain, 20, died on the spot when a pick-up van skidded off the road and overturned on Dhaka-Mymensingh highway in Bhaluka upazila, police said.

No further details could be known immediately.

## Prepare list of vulnerable buildings in Dhaka

HC asks govt

The High Court has directed the government to identify the vulnerable buildings in Dhaka and submit a list of those before the court by November 22. Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha

(Rajuk), Ministry of Housing and Public Works, and Bangladesh Fire Service and Civil Defence were asked to implement the directive.

In response to a writ petition, the court on Monday issued a rule asking the authorities to explain why they should not be directed to ensure safety of the vulnerable buildings.

The court also asked why they should not be ordered to demolish the six-story building of Gulshan Shopping Centre after disconnecting its electricity and gas supply lines, as the structure has been declared unfit for use.

The bench of Justice Moyeenul Islam Chowdhury and Justice Md Ashraful Kamal came up with the order and rule following the writ petition filed by Swadesh, a rights organisation, seeking necessary orders. Petitioner's lawyer Barrister

Defence declared the six-story Gulshan Shopping Centre "unfit for use" earlier this year as per the Fire Prevention Act, 2003. But the owner is still using the building where around 4,000 people

## Fire destroys

## Golam Sarwar's janaza held at Barisal home

A namaz-e-janaza of journalist Golam Sarwar was held at his village home in

Banaripara upazila of Barisal yesterday. He was also given a guard of honour as freedom fighter by police on the playground of Banaripara Model Union Institution where the janaza was held.

Golam Sarwar, editor of the daily Samakal, passed away in Singapore General Hospital on Monday night, at age 75. His body arrived in Dhaka the next day.

Today his body will lie in state at Central Shaheed Minar in Dhaka from 11:00am to 12:00pm for people from all walks of life to pay their tributes.

The body of the journalist was flown by helicopter to his village Jumadi around 2:30pm yesterday. Before the janaza, family members, relatives, eminent local personalities, and socio-political and cultural organisations paid their respects to him

Awami League lawmaker Talukdar Md Yunus, Workers Party lawmaker Sheikh Tipu Sultan, Banaripara upazila AL General Secretary Maolad Hossain Sana, freedom fighter Mahabubuddin Bir Bikram, Barisal mayor-elect Serniabad Sadiq Abdullah, Banaripara upazila Chairman Golam Faruk, Banaripara municipality Mayor Suvash Chandra Shil, Superintendent of Police in Barisal Saiful Islam were present on the occasion.

The coffin was taken to his home before it

was flown back to Dhaka at 4:00pm. At 10:00am today, another janaza will be held at the Osmani Hall playground of Bangladesh University of Textile, near the office of Samakal, in Tejgaon, says a press release. Then his body will be taken to Central Shaheed Minar. From there, it will be taken to Jatiya Press Club for another janaza after Zohr prayers. The veteran journalist will be laid to rest at Martyred Intellectuals' Graveyard in Mirpur after Asr prayers today.

## Pvt university student 'abducted

A private university student, traceless since Tuesday, was abducted for Tk 10 lakh ransom, alleged his family yesterday.

Enamul Haque Olen, 23, an Electrical and Electronics Engineering student at United International University (UIU), went out of his house at Mohammadpur in the morning on Tuesday and did not contact his family ever since, said his mother Fatema Chowdhury, whose husband is an expatriate in Saudi Arabia.

Enamul's cellphone was found unreachable since then, she said, adding that they received a call from his phone that night around 10:00pm when an unknown caller demanded Tk 10 lakh ransom for her son's release.

Yesterday, Fatema filed a general diary (GD) with Badda Police Station. Rafiqul Islam, officer-in-charge of the

police station, told The Daily Star that they were conducting drives to rescue Enamul and arrest his abductors.

## Two CMP cops suspended over escape of accused

Two policemen of Chittagong Metropolitan Police (CMP) were suspended yesterday over the escape of an accused from their custody. Sub-inspector Fakhrul Islam of

Akbar Shah Police Station and constable Khokon of Chittagong Court prosecution were suspended on charges of negligence of duty, said CMP Commissioner Mahbubur Rahman.

CMP Deputy Commissioner (West) Farukul Islam and CMP Deputy Commissioner (North) Hasan Mohammad Shawkat Ali issued the suspension orders.

Arrestee Masud Rana of Patwaribari in Kabirhat of Noakhali

district, who was an accused drug dealer, escaped from police custody when he was brought to the district court for hearing on Tuesday. Akbar Shah Police Station
