Justice remains elusive for women

Say activists, lawyers at roundtable by Amrai Pari

Two years have passed since a stalker murdered their beloved daughter Suraiya Akhter Risha but justice remains elusive in the cobweb of legal procedure.

Parents of Risha, 14, a student of Willes Little Flower School, broke down in tears at a roundtable yesterday when they spoke of their loss and the legal battle in a system that fails to deliver justice to many female victims in the country.

The dialogue on "Judicial system for women: Bangladesh perspective" was organised by Amrai Pari (We Can), an alliance to end violence against women, at The Daily Star Centre, with Rokeya Kabir, national committee mem-

Mugger 'welfare' fund!

As strange as the headline may sound, it is in fact, for real.

A group of muggers apparently deposit a part of their "earnings" in a fund -- to use the money for fighting legal battles to free their arrested fellows or for treating those who got injured by mob beating during a mugging incident.

The story came to light yesterday after detectives arrested eight members of a gang from Jatrabari and New Market on Friday night.

"Detectives seized Tk 8 lakh of the fund money from the arrestees' possession. It was collected by mugging," said Abdul Baten, additional commissioner of the detective branch of Dhaka Metropolitan Police, at a press briefing at DMP media centre in Dhaka. Baten said the gang used to

fetch Tk 3 lakh to 5 lakh per month by mugging people. They used to deposit some of the looted money

for the fund and share the rest among themselves. SEE PAGE 4 COL 5


