Aubergine farmers all smiles

Aubergine cultivation has been bringing good profit for growers in different villages under Krishnapur union of Sadarpur upazila for 15 years due to low production and labour cost.

"Two hundred and ninety hectares of land have been

brought under brinjal cultivation in the upazila this year. BP hybrids, Iret, Sinduri, white brinjal are cultivated here," said Upazila Agriculture Officer Bidhan Roy. Abul Bashar, 35, a brinjal farmer of Shoildubi village, said he has been cultivating aubergine on 40 decimals of

land for three years. It is more profitable than other crops, he said, adding that the soil of the region is suitable for its cultivation. Shahed Ali Mollah, 30, of Math Shoildubi village, said he

cultivated brinjal on one bigha of land spending Tk 45,000 this year. He hopes to get 120 maunds to 140 maunds of the crop this year. The price is Tk 800 to Tk 1,200 per maund, he added. He expects to earn profit a profit of Tk 1 lakh this year, he

Wholesaler Amzad Hossain said he buys aubergine from the farmers at Tk 800 to Tk 1,200 per maund and sells it at different markets at Tk 1,200 to Tk 1,500.

"We arranged training and conducted campaigns for brinjal farmers. Cultivation of brinjal is profitable as it requires low production cost and less labour," added

"I bought the ticket at the increased price. What could I do? I have to join my office on Sunday," he added.

Another Dhaka-bound passenger Mohammad Ali, who works at a private organisation in the capital, was waiting for a bus of Soniya AC Bus Service. He said he bought an AC ticket for Tk 400 while the normal fare was Tk 250.

Sokal Sondhya, Dhaleswari and Jhatika bus services were also realising almost double the normal fare from the passengers.

Before Eid, the government had buses returning empty," he added.

declared that no additional bus fare would be realised from the passengers and action would be taken against those who realised additional fare. But the transport owners and workers did not care about the declaration and harassed the passengers for additional fare, several passengers alleged.

VILLAGERS CLASH

2 killed, 30 injured in Habiganj, Kishoreganj

Two people were killed and at least 30 others injured in clashes between rival villagers in Habiganj and Kishoreganj yesterday and on Friday.

Our Moulvibazar correspondent reports: A man was killed and at least 20 others were injured in a clash between two groups of villagers over establishing supremacy in the panchayet (village committee) in Bahubal upazila of Habiganj on Friday.

The deceased, Juned Mia, 30, was a resident of Khagaura village.

Habiganj Additional Superintendent of Police Pervez Alam Chowdhury said there had been a longstanding feud between one Saikat Mia and Snanghat Union Parishad (UP) Member Rahim Mia over establishing

supremacy in the village committee. As a sequel to the enmity, they filed separate cases against each other earlier while an altercation took place between their sup-

porters around 9:00pm on Friday. UP member Rahim said, at one stage, Saikat's men stabbed one of his supporters Juned with a sharp weapon, which triggered a clash between the two groups that left 20 others from the two sides injured.

Officer-in-Charge (OC) of Bahubal Police Station Golam Dostagir said seriously injured Juned was first taken to Habiganj Sadar Hospital and then referred to Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College Hospital as his condition deteriorated.

Juned died on way to the hospital around 10:00pm, the OC said, adding that the injured took treatment at different hospitals and clinics.

In Kishoreganj, a youth was killed and at least 10 others were injured in a clash over land dispute in Mithamoin upazila yesterday,

our Mymensingh correspondent reports. The deceased, Babul Mia, 30, was son of late Murshid Mia of Bhajakpur village.

Quoting locals, police said there had been a rivalry between Babul and one of his neighbours Dulal Mia over the ownership of a disputed land.

As a sequel, Dulal's men attacked Babul and his supporters with sharp weapons that left at least 11 people including Babul injured.

Critically injured Babul was rushed to Kishoreganj General Hospital where the doctors declared him dead, police said.
