

Youths don't want politics of violence

Says Mahi B Chowdhury, Projonmo Bangladesh launches 'Plan B' campaign

Projonmo Bangladesh, a platform of youths, yesterday launched a campaign titled "Plan-B" to introduce a new culture in politics, which would be non-violent and corruption-free.

Led by Bikalpa Dhara Bangladesh (BDB) Joint Secretary General Mahi B Chowdhury, the campaign will be carried out through various activities -- dialogue, workshop, blood donation drive and social media promotion -- in the next couple of months.

It was launched at a programme held at Krishibid Institute Bangladesh (KIB) in Dhaka.

The major objectives of the campaign are to attract the youths in politics, ensure their leadership and pursue politics of peace instead of following the path of muscle power and violence, said its organisers.

A number of workshops will be held between September 10 and 12; a month-long blood donation camp and dialogue with students and professionals will begin from September 28, they added.

"People's expectations have not been fulfilled... We want both development and democracy. We want freedom of speech," he said, adding that a reasonable government is a must to overcome the current situation.

"A new era in the country's politics will not begin if the new generation doesn't get involved," said Mahi.

"Politics of muscle power must change... Politics is now hostage to corruption and terrorism. How would decent young people get involved?" he said.

Mahi also said they will not allow anti-liberation forces, like Jamaat, to be the determinants of the country's politics.

Expressing solidarity with the campaign's objectives, Nagorik Oikya Convener Mahmudur Rahman Manna said, "A sense of fear has gripped the country due to oppression of the current government."

6 hospitals fined for irregularities

A mobile court of Rapid Action Battalion in Savar fined six private hospitals Tk 23.8 lakh and sealed off one of them for various irregularities on Saturday and yesterday.

Goni General Hospital was fined Tk 4.05 lakh and its pharmacy Tk 75,000; Habib Clinic Tk 5 lakh; Momtaz General Hospital Tk 5 lakh, said Executive Magistrate Sarwoer Alam, who led the drive.

Besides, Palash Diagnostic Centre and Hospital was fined Tk 5 lakh; Ruposhi Bangla Hospital Tk 1.5 lakh and Shema General Hospital Tk 2.5 lakh.

Goni General Hospital was sealed off while pathology units of Habib Clinic and Palash Diagnostic Centre and Hospital were shut down, said the executive magistrate.

The fines were realised on the spot.

Travelettes of Bangladesh tour through southern region

Four members of the Travelettes of Bangladesh, a Facebook-based group of female travellers, concluded their tour of Barisal region on Saturday, visiting historical places and raising awareness among schoolgirls.

Members of this group have so far visited 26 districts of the country starting from April 6, and the southern region was their latest leg. Riding on scooters, they completed the tour of Patuakhali, Barguna, Pirojpur, Jhalakathi and Barisal in six days.

The women-only group, nicknamed Bhromon Konya (female travellers), aims to cover the entire country, an initiative they call "Bangladesh through the eyes of women". Through this, they promote the independence of women.

Five members of this group led by Sakia Haque and Manoshi Saha Tuli, two interns at Dhaka Medical College (DMC), also president and general secretary of the group, was on this trip. The rest are Zannatul Ferdous Shova, a primary school teacher; Shamsun Nahar Shuma, a Dhaka University student; and Musfiqa Rahman

Nijhum, a secondary school student. Nijhum, however, went back to Dhaka after visiting Patuakhali and Barguna.

During the tour, they visited Kuakata sea beach, Rakhine village, guava garden, Kirtipasha Zamindar Bari among others.

On Saturday noon, at the end of their visit, the group exchanged views with the students at Halima Khatun Secondary School of Barisal city.

Sakia said, "We told them about women empowerment, asked them to raise their voices, speak out, and go see the beauty of the country through their own eyes."

"We discussed the Liberation War of Bangladesh, early marriage, health and nutrition, and the problems adolescent girls are facing," she added.

Shuva, a student of class VI, said, "This kind of programme gives us courage to face our personal and social problems."

Her classmate Beethi added, "We learnt about many issues related to adolescence, which was not told to us before."

The team reached Barisal on August 31 after starting from Dhaka on August 27. On their way back, they visited Madaripur and Shariatpur.

after this no parliament member will have any official power. There is no question regarding this," said Quader, who was the chief guest at the rally.

government led by then prime minister Hossain Shahid Suhrawardi. His contribution to the development of East Bengal through various initiatives, especially in industrialisation, is undeniable.

Among his famous satirical novels, "Aina", "Asmani Parda", "Gulliver Safarnama" and "Food Conference" are notable. Two of his autobiographies are "Atma Katha" and "Amar Dekha Rajnir Panchash Bachhar", which, while bringing out his own personal struggles, depict the historical and social challenges faced by the common people of that period.

His role in the initial days of Pakistan was extremely important in highlighting issues of the economic and cultural rights of the people of East Pakistan. He was one of the earliest proponents of Bangla being the national language of the country.

He had written extensively about the issues of national language since the beginning of the '40s and also contributed actively to the Language Movement as the editor of Ittehad. Abul Mansur Ahmad was the author of the famous 21-point manifesto for the United Front in the 1954 election, which saw the demise of Muslim League from power and from the politics of East Pakistan. The manifesto was a historic document that first portrayed the political, economic, and cultural aspirations of the suppressed Bengalis.

As a result of his political activities in the late '50s and early '60s, Abul Mansur Ahmad was jailed several times, by the military administration of Ayub Khan.

Bangla Academy has published three volumes of Abul Mansur Ahmad's collected works. There are three more volumes to be published. A collection of memorial books on Abul Mansur Ahmad was recently published by Prothoma. Star Books has also published "Abul Mansur Ahmader Shreshtho Golpo".

Roma Chowdhury shifted to ICU again

Freedom fighter Roma Chowdhury was shifted to the intensive care unit (ICU) of Chittagong Medical College Hospital again yesterday evening.

She has been undergoing treatment at the hospital since January.

A medical board led by Prof Ashok Dutta, head of the medicine department has been formed for her treatment.

Dr Kazi Md Abrar Hasan, coordinator of the nine-member board, said her blood pressure was fluctuating, that was why she was shifted. "We're monitoring her condition."

Roma suffered a fractured waist in January this year, and was admitted to Chittagong Medical College Hospital.

The freedom fighter has written 18 books including a chronicle of her days in 1971 named "Ekattorer Janani".

state of the Association of South East Asian Nations (Asean), the Bangladesh foreign ministry should have launched efforts to engage other Asean member states to resolve the issue, he added.

Prof Salimullah Khan, director, Centre of Advance Theory of University of Liberal Arts Bangladesh, said Rohingya persecution has been taking place over the decades and there has been a complete denial of their citizenship in the process. International recognition of a "Rohingya state" is a prerequisite to resolve the crisis, he said.

Praising Bangladesh government's efforts in giving shelter to Rohingyas, Papa Kysma Sylla, deputy representative of UNHCR, said to resolve the crisis its challenges have to be addressed properly.

Prof Zia Rahman, chairman of DU's criminology department, moderated the session.

PASSENGER PUSHED OFF MINIBUS

Bus helper remanded

A Chittagong court yesterday placed bus helper Mohammad Manik on a three-day remand in a case filed for allegedly pushing a passenger off a running minibus on August 27.

Metropolitan Magistrate Al Imran passed the order after Police Bureau of Investigation (PBI) produced him before the court, said Additional Deputy Commissioner (ADC) (prosecution) Nirmalendu Bikash Chawakraborty of Chittagong Metropolitan Police (CMP).

PBI officials arrested Manik in Ramgati upazila of Laxmipur district on Saturday.

On August 27, Manik pushed a passenger off the minibus following an altercation over bus fare in City Gate area near the port city.

The bus ran over and killed Rezaul Karim Roni, 35, who was a businessman.

The death sparked protests among locals who barricaded the Dhaka-Chittagong highway in the area for nearly an hour.

A case was lodged with Akbar Shah Police Station accusing the bus driver and the helper.

issues, will be discussed at the summit.

The two sides will also sign a "joint record of discussions" on September 7.

As per a decision taken by the home secretaries of India and Bangladesh at a meeting in Dhaka in October 1993, the two sides agreed that the director general-level meetings between BGB and BSF are going to be a biannual event.

Accordingly, the director generals have been holding border coordination meetings in New Delhi and Dhaka.

The DGs are also expected to call on Indian Home Minister Rajnath Singh.
