An EC has to be perceived neutral

Former chief election commissioner Mohammad Abu Hena yesterday said an election commission should demonstrate neutrality through holding dialogue with all political parties and stakeholders.

"You have to be perceived as neutral through your work and communicate with every political party. Dialogue should be held with all stakeholders of an election. Their problems should be heard and resolved. Otherwise, confidence cannot be earned," said Abu Hena, recalling his role as the CEC during the 1996 election.

'Will apply as much strength as needed during nat'l polls'

Says BGB chief

Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) will apply as much strength as possible during the upcoming national election to maintain law and order across the country and they have also taken extra initiative to tackle arms smuggling ahead of the polls, the director general of BGB said yesterday. "We will put the training programmes on hold during

the national election. No officials will be allowed to take leave except for emergencies, and all other workloads will be minimised," Maj Gen Shafeenul Islam, the BGB director general, told a press conference at the BGB headquarters.

The BGB chief said they have also sought cooperation from India and Myanmar to protect the border during the upcoming national election, as many BGB members will be on poll-duty.

"We have already made plans regarding these matters," he said, adding that BGB will abide by the instructions of the government about the election-specific matters.

Asked about the unguarded areas of the border with India and arms smuggling, the BGB official said they have taken extra efforts to tackle arms smuggling three months ago.

"In line with our efforts, we have also recovered 53 firearms between January and September 9," he added.

Reckless traffic sergeant hits and injures bicyclist

A traffic sergeant, while driving his motorcycle on the wrong side of the road, hit and injured a bicycle rider in the capital's Gulshan area yesterday morning.

The traffic rule violation by Sergeant Pijush led to the accident at a time when Dhaka Metropolitan Police is observing a month-long traffic awareness campaign that started on September 5.

The injured cyclist Abdur Rahman, 19, received treatment at Kurmitola General Hospital and was later dropped off at his home by police.

ENTRY INTO CIVIL SERVICE JS body

recommends extending age limit to 35yrs

A parliamentary body yesterday again recommended that the government raise the age limit for entering civil service to 35 years, a longstanding demand of students.

The parliamentary standing committee on public administration in a meeting at the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban also asked the concerned ministry to further increase the age limit for retirement from government services.

Currently, age limit for entering the public service is 30 years, while retirement age is 59 years. Retirement age of freedom fighters is 60 years.

Earlier in June, the parliamentary committee on public administration had recommended to increase the age limit for entering civil service to 35 years.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina on January 31 told the parliament that her government has no plans to increase the existing retirement age in SEE PAGE 5 COL 5


