Clean up after oneself to clean Bangladesh

Poriborton Chai's cleaning campaign

Wearing gloves and masks and holding brooms in hands, several hundred students yesterday carried out a cleaning campaign at Rabindra Sarobar in Dhaka's Dhanmondi area to generate public awareness for keeping the country clean.

The students, from different educational institutions in the capital, collected trash including plastic bottles, polythene bags and paper from 20 spots, and dumped those into a designated place.

"Poriborton Chai", a social platform,

organised the two-hour campaign that started at 11:00am as a central programme to observe "Let's Clean up the Country Day 2018". The platform organised the campaign at

164 locations across the country with more than one lakh people voluntarily taking part. The organisers claim to have arranged the biggest cleaning campaign so far in the city clean.

Islami University student Jannatul Mawa occasion. Tonni said, "If we dump our own garbage at designated places properly and encourage others to do so, the country will remain

clean always."

Hasina looks at next generation, BNP at election: Quader

Awami League General Secretary Obaidul Quader yesterday said BNP does not understand anything but power and such political parties are disastrous for the country.

"Sheikh Hasina's target is the next generation while BNP's target is the next election. They [BNP] don't understand anything except power," he said.

Quader, also road transport and bridges minister, came up with the observation while speaking at the inaugural programme of Awami League's Science and Technology Sub-Committee website at the Institution of Engineers, Bangladesh (IEB).

Resist Digital Security Bill: Rizvi

Terming it a dangerous "black law", BNP yesterday urged people from all walks of life to put up a strong resistance against the Digital Security Bill, 2018.

"A parliamentary standing committee finalised a report on the much-talked-about Digital Security Bill, ignoring the opinions of people from all sections. It's a dangerous black law which will be passed to establish Awami League's full control over the state power," said BNP's Senior Joint Secretary General Ruhul Kabir Rizvi.

Speaking at a press conference at BNP's Nayapaltan central office, he further said, "Freedom of the press and journalists will be at stake if the bill is passed. We urge all, irrespective of party and opinion, to

create a united resistance against this black law."

On Tuesday, the parliamentary standing committee on Post, Telecom and ICT Ministry finalised its report on the bill.

About the medical board formed by the government for BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia's treatment, Rizvi said the doctors who are active in Awami League politics are there on the board but her (Khaleda's) personal physicians were left out.

He alleged that such a medical board was formed to give a report on Khaleda's health condition as per the directives of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina.

MN Larma's dream of a secular country unrealised

Speakers tell discussion marking his 79th birth anniv; call for full implementation of CHT accord

Manabendra Narayan Larma was not just a leader of the indigenous people but also a national and revolutionary leader who dreamt of a secular Bangladesh and fought to establish it, said speakers at a discussion

yesterday. Bangladesh Adivasi Forum organised the programme at Bishwo Shahitto Kendro in Dhaka, marking his 79th birth anniversary.

MN Larma was born on September 15, 1939. He was assassinated on November 10, 1983. During his lifetime, MN Larma fought for establishing rights of indigenous communities in Chittagong Hill Tracts, said speakers. With that in mind, he formed the Parbatya Chattagram Jana Sanghati Samiti (PCJSS).

The historic CHT Peace Accord signed between the government and PCJSS in 1997

was also an outcome of his struggle, they said. Speaking at the programme, noted columnist Syed Abul Maksud said, "Throughout his [Larma] life, he wanted to establish a society free from disparity and oppression."

He believed in nationalism that recognises ethnic minorities along with Bengalis, Abul Maksud said, adding that his honesty and humanitarian qualities are nowadays rare among politicians.

Oikya Nap President Pankaj Bhattacharya said, "MN Larma was a leader of all deprived people. He deserved to be honoured as a national leader."

ponent that is registered with the Election

Commission (EC).

The other alliance members are: Bangladesh Islamic Party, Bangladesh National Awami Party (NAP-Bhashani), Bangladesh Democratic Front, Bangladesh Jamiate Darussunnah, Bangladesh Islami Democratic Forum, Bangladesh Gono Kafela, Bangladesh Jonosheba Andolon, Bangladesh Peoples Democratic Party, Bangladesh Islami Peshajibi Parishad, Islami Union Bangladesh, Bangladesh Manabadhikar Andolon, and National Labour Party.

At the press conference, the alliance members said they will work for continuation of the government's development activities.

Reading out a written statement, Awal, also spokesperson of IDA, said they will work to strengthen the 14-party alliance.

IDA will further work to create mass support for the ruling alliance ahead of the election, he said.
