Messi sinks PSV

Late strikes condemn Inter

Lionel Messi scored a sensational hattrick as Barcelona kickstarted their Champions League campaign with a 4-0 win at home to Dutch champions PSV Eindhoven on

Tuesday although they had defender Samuel Umtiti sent off in the second half.

Barca's all-time top scorer Messi broke the deadlock in the 32nd minute at the Nou Camp with an immaculately struck free kick, curling the ball over the wall and right into the top near corner.

Coached by former Barca and Netherlands midfielder Mark van Bommel, PSV had produced an admirable performance in their first visit to the Nou Camp in 21 years until they began to tire late in the second half.

The Spanish champions doubled their lead in the 75th minute through a lovely curling strike from in-form French forward Ousmane Dembele. Messi got his second two minutes later, turning Ivan Rakitic's dinked pass into the near corner with one flick of his boot and completed his treble in the 87th by ruthlessly smashing home.

The mood was briefly dampened when France defender Umtiti was dismissed in the 79th minute for a second yellow card, ruling him out of Barca's next Champions League game away to Tottenham Hotspur on Oct. 3.


Inter Milan struck twice late on to secure a stunning 2-1 victory over a crestfallen Tottenham Hotspur in their Group B opener at the San Siro in Milan.

Mauro Icardi's superb volley levelled the scores in the 86th minute and Matias Vecino headed a stoppage-time winner to give Inter a victory that for most of the night looked unlikely.

Spurs had taken the lead in the 53rd minute with Christian Eriksen's deflected effort off Inter's Miranda and looked comfortable as the full-time whistle approached.

The match was turned on its head though in dramatic fashion as Tottenham suffered a third straight loss in all competitions.

Inter are level on three points with Barcelona, who cruised to a 4-0 victory over PSV Eindhoven to move top of the group.

Goalkeeper Shahidul Alam Sohel has not been included in the 31-member preliminary squad of the Bangladesh football team for the Bangabandhu Gold Cup, which is scheduled to get underway from October 1 in Sylhet.

Sohel made a silly mistake to concede the opening goal against Nepal in their last group match of the SAFF Championship earlier this month, and that mistake literally knocked the hosts out of the competition. The veteran, who came under heavy criticism from all quarters, paid the price by being axed from the national team.

English coach Jamie Day, who defended Sohel despite the mistake, said the goalkeeper needed rest to recover from the trauma of that defeat against Nepal.

"I think Sohel probably needs a break mentally from what has gone on since the SAFF [Championship] and he will come back stronger," Day said explaining the exclusion of Sohel.

The 31-member squad features four goalkeepers including Ashraful Islam Rana, Anisur Rahman Ziko, Mahfuz Hasan Priton and Rasel Mahmud Liton, the latter being called up after a long gap. The coach also recalled veteran defenders Yeasin Khan and Ariful Islam and promising forward Javed Khan apart from the players who had been in training over the last three months.

"The other additions are for me to have a look at over the next few days and see if they fit into what we are trying to do," Day said. "The squad will be narrowed down, so with 31 keeps everyone on their toes and fighting for the final squad selection."

Hosts Bangladesh will look for a more synchronised performance when they take on Lebanon in

the their second Group F encounter of the AFC U-16 Women's Championship Qualifiers at the Birshreshtha Shaheed Mostafa Kamal Stadium in Kamalapur today.

The match will start at 11:30am before Vietnam play against Bahrain in the day's second match at 3:30pm.

The match against Lebanon is being considered as a tough test for the girls in red and green, who notched a massive 10-0 win over Bahrain despite looking a bit disorganised in the first half before settling down after the break.

Lebanon have already showed their intention of getting out the qualification round by handing an 8-0 defeat to Bahrain and 6-3 defeat to UAE and they can pose a threat to the charges of Golam Rabbani Choton.

"I believe the girls will show good perfor-

Choton admitted that Lebanon are a good side and they have some good players like Nathalie Alabed, Zahraa Assaf and Syntia Salha, but the coach believes Bangladeshi girls are ahead in terms of pace, strength and experience.

"The girls will have to give their full effort if we want to win the match. We have to beat all teams if we want to become group champions to go to the next round and we will definitely go there for full points," said Choton.

No player owns as many Champions League titles as Cristiano Ronaldo but a sixth with Juventus would surely be his best of the lot.

Ronaldo played the lead

role in all of those five previous triumphs, from his towering header for Manchester United against Chelsea in 2008 to the tieclinching, 97th-minute penalty against Juventus last season in the quarters.

In between, there were the 17 goals he scored in every game but one en route to the trophy in 2014, the title-winning penalty against Atletico Madrid in 2016 and the hattrick against the same opposition, this time in the last four, a year later. He would also

score twice against Juventus in the final. It was to become the beneficiaries, rather than victims, of these match-winning moments, that Juve seemingly decided last summer the only way to win the

Champions League before Ronaldo retires is to have Ronaldo on your team. They begin that assault on Wednesday,

when the 33-year-old will kick a ball competitively in Spain for the first time since his dizzying 100 million-euro move from Madrid.

Valencia are the obstacle at the Mestalla, where he scored twice, both penalties, for his former team last term.

Many were shocked when Ronaldo drew a line under his time in the Spanish capital. More trophies and records would inevitably have followed at Madrid but instead he started again, risking his reputation for somewhere new.

The club's pursuit of a first Champions League success since 1996 has become an obsession and Ronaldo is supposed to be the last piece in the puzzle.

Real Madrid may claim to be more of a team without him but so, perhaps, were Juve and it was only enough to reach two finals in four years, and lose them both.
