Greater unity taking shape

BNP, 9 of its allies share stage with Dr Kamal's Oikya Prokriya and B Chowdhury's Juktofront at citizens' rally to press for common demands

GOVT ASKED TO MEET 3 **DEMANDS** BY SEPT 30

- Formation of a polls-time neutral govt thru' talks with political parties
- Taking effective steps for reconstituting the **Election Commission**
- Dissolution of parliament before the announcement of election schedule

Several top BNP leaders shared the stage with Dr Kamal Hossain and Prof Badruddoza Chowdhury at a citizens' rally in the capital yesterday and extended full support to Jatiya Oikya Prokriya's threepoint demand including formation of a polls-time neutral government.

The Jatiya Oikya Prokriya, a platform led by Dr Kamal, issued an ultimatum from the rally for the demands to be met by September 30.

The other two demands are effective steps for reconstituting the Election Commission and dissolution of parliament before the announcement of the election schedule.

The rally was also joined by leaders of nine other components of the BNP-led 20party alliance, Juktafront led by Badruddoza Chowdhury, Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal led by ASM Abdur Rab, Nagorik Oikya led by Mahmudur Rahman Manna and left leaning Ganosamhati Andolon.

This was the first time since the 2014 general election that they were seen together on one stage. The development came three months before the next parliamentary polls.

The leaders voiced support for the demands and held their joined hands aloft, urging a greater national unity among all democratic forces.

Impossible to meet their demands

Says Tofail

Awami League leader Tofail Ahmed yesterday said the three demands made by Dr Kamal Hossain-led Jatiya Oikya Prokriya were "unconstitutional".

Jatiya Oikya Prokriya [national unity process] yesterday issued a September-30 deadline for the government to meet its three-point demand, which include steps for formation of an election-time neutral government.

"What they [Jatiya Oikya Prokriya demanded is absolutely unconstitutional and it is totally impossible to fulfill. The next election will be held in accordance with the constitution," he told The Daily Star over the phone last night.

Tofail, also the commerce minister, outright rejected the notion of dissolving parliament or "resignation of the government".

A polls-time cabinet would be formed under the leadership of Prime

Terror hits Iran's pride

29 killed, more than 60 injured in attack on military parade of Revolutionary Guards; Khamenei blames Gulf states, US allies; president vows 'crushing' response; IS, regional group claim responsibility

Iranian Supreme leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei yesterday accused US-backed Gulf Arab states of carrying out an attack on a military parade that killed 29 people, almost half of them members of the country's elite Revolutionary Guards.

Khamenei said the terrorist attack in the southwestern Iranian city of Ahvaz was the continuation of plots

hatched by US stooges in the region to create insecurity in the country, reported PressTV.

Khamenei ordered security forces to bring to justice the "criminals" behind one of the worst attacks ever against the Revolutionary Guards, who answer to him.

The allegation will almost certainly ratchet up tensions with Iran's regional rival Saudi Arabia and its Gulf allies, who along with the United States have

been working to isolate the Islamic Republic. "This crime is a continuation of the plots of the regional states that are puppets of the United States, and their goal

is to create insecurity in our dear country," Khamenei said in a statement published on his website.

He did not name the regional states he believed were to blame. Israel is also a key US ally opposed to Tehran.

State television said the assault, which wounded more than 60 people, targeted a stand where Iranian officials had gathered in the city of Ahvaz to watch an annual event marking the start of the Islamic Republic's 1980-88 war with Iraq.

An Iranian ethnic Arab opposition movement called the Ahvaz National Resistance, which seeks a separate state in oil-rich Khuzestan province, claimed responsibility for

the attack.

Islamic State militants also claimed responsibility. Neither claim provided evidence. All four attackers were killed. Women and children also died

in the assault, state news IRNA agency reported. Brigadier General Abolfazl

Shekarchi, a senior spokesman for Iran's armed forces, said the attackers had hidden weapons in an area

near the parade route several days in advance. "All four terrorists were quickly neutralised by security

forces," Shekarchi told state television. "A four-year-old girl and a wheelchair-bound war veteran were among the

Attacks on the military are rare in Iran.
