Asia Cup yesterday. However, the victory at the Zahur Ahmed Chowdhury Stadium was not a good enough reason for the hosts to start celebrating, they had to wait for Sri Lanka to beat Pakistan at the MA Aziz Stadium.

Sri Lanka defended their total of 200 to secure a 23-run win as Pakistan could only get 177 for eight. The result ensured there were no run-rate equations which could have ended the host's campaign in the tournament.

Bangladesh lost their opening match against Sri Lanka but bounced back in their second match against Pakistan to keep their semifinal hopes alive. "We reached the semifinal but I am not

satisfied with our performance. The bowlers performed very well so far but our batting was still not up to the mark," said Bangladesh captain Towhid Hridoy.

Leg-spinner Rishad Hossain was once again the pick of Bangladesh's bowlers as his

three-wicket haul helped bundle out Hong Kong for 91 runs in 46.5 overs and also brought him the man-of-the-match award.

In their chase, the hosts' top order again faltered as they lost four wickets for 40 runs.

But Akbar Ali and Mahmudul Hasan Joy added 58 runs for the fifth wicket, guiding the home side to the target in just 11.2 overs with five wickets to spare.

Ali struck 25 runs of 19 balls while Joy was unbeaten on 32 after his 20-ball knock.

# Asia Cup snub fuelled a fire

#### HIGHLIGHTS

Although he did not feature in any of Bangladesh's matches in the recently concluded Asia Cup, Ariful Haque grabbed an opportunity in the domestic circuit as he smashed his maiden double hundred, which was also the first of the season. It was also the 48th first-class double hundred in the domestic competition.

He may have played his last Test match for Bangladesh five years ago but left-arm spinner Enamul Haque Jr. has been a prolific wicket taker in the domestic circuit. The 31-year-old bagged yet another six wickets in an innings to take his tally of first-class five-wicket hauls to 33.

In recent years, Rony Talukdar has become a name which is up there with the top ten run getters in domestic competitions. The right-hander once again began the season with yet another hundred, which was his ninth first-class ton.

Opening batsman Mizanur Rahman has been scoring centuries quite regularly in the recent first-class competitions. The right-hander struck three in the previous edition of the National League and followed that up with another two in the Bangladesh Cricket League. Mizanur struck his first hundred of the league and 10th firstclass century overall.

Less than 24 hours after Ariful Haque returned from the UAE, where he warmed

the bench for Bangladesh in the Asia Cup, the right-hander smashed a hundred for Rangpur on the opening day of the National Cricket League and went on to complete his maiden double century in the Tier-1 encounter against Barishal at the Shaheed Chandu Stadium in Bogura yesterday.

Ariful, resuming the second day on 117, was eventually dismissed on 231 runs off 325 balls, featuring 21 fours and four sixes, as Rangpur posted 502 all out in the first innings.

"As I was batting with the tailenders on the second day, I tried to keep the strike. I looked for boundaries off almost every fourth ball and also looked for singles off the last ball of each over to take the strike for the next over," Ariful told The Daily Star after the day's play.

"There were times in the Asia Cup where I heard that I might play the next match but eventually, I found out that I won't. That was mentally challenging

for me but it made me more determined. This double hundred will boost my confidence," he added.

In reply, Barishal ended the day on 91 for 1 with Rafsan Al Mahmud set to resume on 53 runs.



# Silva wins it for Man City with late strike

Dybala drubs Young Boys



A late David Silva goal sealed Manchester City's 2-1 victory against Hoffenheim on Tuesday as Pep Guardiola's side got their Champions League campaign back on track in Germany.

After suffering a shock 2-1 defeat at home to Lyon a fortnight ago, the Premier League champions badly needed the three points to move off the bottom of Group F.

Silva poached the winner on 87 minutes when he reacted quickest to nick the ball off Hoffenheim defender Stefan Posch on the penalty spot and fire home.

The away win was thoroughly deserved as City were finally rewarded for their patience after dominating a determined Hoffenheim defence for long spells.

However, City got off to a disastrous start at the Rhein-Neckar Arena as Hoffenheim shocked the English side by taking the lead after just 44 seconds.

When central midfielder Kerem Demirbay spotted a hole in the City defence, his pass put Ishak Belfodil clear to fire past goalkeeper Ederson to the delight of the home fans.

City hit back almost immediately when Silva's pass split the Hoffenheim defence and found Leroy Sane who put Aguero into space to tap home the equaliser on eight minutes.

From that point on, City were repeatedly thwarted in their efforts to grab a second goal against a dogged Hoffenheim side until Silva struck.

Meanwhile in Turin, Paulo Dybala scored a hattrick as luventus carried their winning streak into the Champions League with a 3-0 victory over ten-man Young Boys on

### CR7 denies rape claim

Police said Monday they had reopened an investigation into a rape accusation made by a former model who says soccer star Cristiano Ronaldo attacked her in his Las Vegas hotel penthouse suite in 2009.

Ronaldo rejected the charges as "fake news" during a live chat on Instagram.

"What they said today, fake -- fake news," the 33year-old star said in a post that was later deleted.

Kathryn Mayorga, 34, accused Ronaldo, in a 32page complaint filed last month with a district court in Nevada, of raping her on June 13, 2009. The Las Vegas Police

Department in a statement that didn't name the superstar it had responded to a call of a sexual assault on that date. "At the time the report was taken, the victim did not

provide detectives with the location of the incident or suspect description. A medical exam was conducted," it said. "As of September 2018, the case has been reopened

## Don't know how many I killed: Grobbelaar

Former Liverpool goalkeeper Bruce Grobbelaar has spoken about how football "saved" him after his horrific experiences as a soldier in the Rhodesian army, also recounting the trauma of the Heysel and Hillsborough disasters during his playing days.

The 60-year-old told Britain's Guardian newspaper in a frank interview that the impact of the fighting in Zimbabwe's war of independence in the 1970s was such that two soldiers took their own lives when they were told to do another tour of duty.

The 60-year-old also described the moment he first killed a man.

"My first time was at dusk. As the sun sinks you're seeing shadows in the bush. You cannot recognise much until you see the whites of their eyes. It's you or them.

"You shoot, you drop and there's overwhelming gunfire. You hear voices on your side: 'Hey, corporal, I'm hit.' You whistle to shut them up otherwise we're all getting killed.

"When it's finished you see bodies everywhere. The first time everything in your stomach comes up through your mouth."

When asked how many people he

killed, he replied: "I couldn't tell you."

The Zimbabwean was at Liverpool during the most successful spell in the club's history but the 1980s were also marked by two tragedies -- the 1985 Heysel disaster, when 39 Juventus fans died before the European Cup final and the Hillsborough disaster in 1989, which resulted in the deaths of 96 Liverpool supporters.

"It [Heysel] was worse [than war]," said Grobbelaar. "In the bush you knew what could happen. At Heysel it was innocent people. To hear the crumbling wall and the falling bodies was terrible."

Grobbelaar was also hit hard by the tragedy at Hillsborough, where he was close to the Liverpool fans' end.

"I was near gate number 13 and there was this soft sound -- like air coming out," he said. "I saw the faces squashed against the fence. I went to get the ball and shouted to the policewoman: 'Open the effing gate.' She said: 'I haven't got the key'. When the ball came back a second time, I shouted again.

"I saw they had a key and people spilled onto the ground.

"I kicked the ball out and ran to the referee. That's when the barrier went over and the bodies came down. I could hear the air coming out of them."
