yesterday, one of the boys -- all class-IX students of Bhelarhat High School -- said they rescued the girl as Liton stopped her and held her hand in Paikarpara village of the upazila. The girl, along with three of her classmates, was on her way to school.

Abdul should have punished Liton but he "shaved our heads instead", the boy said, adding, the teacher did not "listen to anybody" during the arbitration, attended by two other teachers, parents of the five and office assistants, inside a room of Barrister Jamiruddin Sircar High School in Akhanagar village.

"With our heads shaved, we are so ashamed that we can't get out of our home," said the boy.

The girl alleged that Liton had been harassing her on way to school for a long time and that the five were innocent. During the arbitration, Liton remained silent when he was asked whether he harassed her, she said.

Anwarul Islam, elder brother of one of the boys, said Abdul had their heads shaved without any reason. "We want answers for it".

Wishing not to be named, a school staffer who attended the arbitration said Abdul even roughed up the five when they tried to say they were innocent.

This correspondent called the headmaster several times over his phone but he did not answer. The reporter went to the school yesterday

but also did not find him there. However, talking to another journalist over phone yesterday morning, Abdul said he would not comment on the matter.

Contacted, Rukhshedul Haque Swapan Chowdhury, president of the managing committee of Bhelarhat High School, said two students from Barrister Jamiruddin Sircar High School had recently harassed two female students of Bhelarhat High School on the school

premises. The two boys were caught and when Abdul went there to have them released, a teacher from Bhelarhat High School slapped the

two boys in front of the headmaster. "Abdul might have shaved the heads of our five students to avenge

the insult," Rukhshedul said. Liton was not available for com-

ments. Local journalists visited his house yesterday but he was not there. Upazila Secondary Education

Officer Mosharaf Hossain, said, "We will take action after receiving information.

Prodip Kumar Roy, officer-in-

charge of Ruhea Police Station, said, "We are yet to receive any complaint from the school authorities. We will definitely take action if needed."

The cabinet approval comes in the wake of months-long quota reform demonstrations that saw arrests of leaders of the quota movement and attacks on students. On September 17, the quota review

committee, headed by the cabinet secretary, recommended scrapping the quota system for class-I and II jobs (from 9th to 13th grade) and submitted its report to the PM. Quota movement leaders wel-

comed the move, but said they would not comment until the gazette notification on abolition of the quota system is published.

"We cannot say anything right now as there are still some ambiguities regarding the quota issue. There should not be any vagueness here," Bin Yeamin Molla, a joint convener of the quota reform movement, told this newspaper.

He urged the government to meet their two demands -- withdrawal of all cases against protesters and punishment of those who attacked demonstrators.

Meanwhile, at a press conference at the Gono Bhaban yesterday, the PM said when she had announced that there would be no quota, a new demand was raised for reforming the quota system instead of abolishing it.

"If anyone wants quota now, he will have to wage a movement for it. And if the movement turns out to be successful, we will think about it," she said.

At present, about 56 percent of government jobs are reserved for candidates from various quotas. Of this, 30 percent are for freedom fighters' children and grandchildren, 10 percent for women, 10 percent for people of underdeveloped districts, five percent for members of indigenous communities and one percent for physically challenged people.

The quota system was introduced through an executive order in 1972 and was amended several times. From 1972 to 1976, 20 percent was recruited on the basis of merit. Merit-based recruitment was increased to 40 percent in 1976 which continued until 1985 when the percentage of meritbased recruitment was upped to 45 percent.

But in 2012, one percent quota was introduced for physically challenged people, reducing merit-based recruitment to 44 percent.

Briefing reporters at the secretariat, Shafiul said the committee's report, placed at yesterday's cabinet meeting at the PMO, made three recommendations.

The first one was merit-based recruitment from grade-9 to 13, and the second one was scrapping the existing quota system in those grades.

The third one was that the government will make necessary decisions in the future if it feels quota is needed for the disadvantaged communities, he

The cabinet approved all the three recommendations, Shafiul said. "The summary of the first two rec-

ommendations is that all the recruitment to class-I and class-II jobs will be made directly on the basis of merit."

A gazette notification will be issued

in two to three days, he mentioned. "We will convey the cabinet's decision to the public administration ministry today or tomorrow. They will

issue a gazette notification," he said. Once the gazette notification is issued, it will come into effect, said the cabinet secretary, adding that it will

EU officials believe the formal threat of losing tariff-free access would quickly hit foreign investment in the apparel industry, where European manufacturers take advantage of relatively low labour costs in Myanmar.

"Removing this duty-free access is a measure of last resort, but we must act if other measures are not delivering," said one EU official involved in the discussions.

"In light of the deteriorating situation on the ground, the Commission is currently assessing possible ways of escalating its political and economic response," a Commission source said

The cabinet secretary said the amount of gold one could bring into the country in his or her luggage, under baggage rules, could be increased.

EASING GOLD IMPORT

To ease gold import, 11 measures have been laid out in the policy.

Bangladesh Bank would appoint dealers for importing gold bars. The dealers could be an authorised bank or an individual-owned firm, or a joint venture or a limited company. Bangladesh Bank would formulate a guideline for the dealers who would import gold bars directly.

Manufacturers of ornaments would not be able to buy gold from others, apart from those dealers.

The dealers would be allowed to import gold through bonds, but for that they would have to get bond licences. They would also have to inform Bangladesh Bank about their requirement of foreign currency and have to obtain no-objection certificate from it.

The central bank would issue NOC within 15 days upon receipt of a dealer's application.

Jewellers would inform dealers of their demand and pay them 5 percent in advance.

In case a jeweller buys recycled gold from a customer, the jeweller has to preserve a copy of the national identity card or passport, and address of the customer.

**BOOSTING EXPORT** 

The draft policy proposes several incentives for increasing export of gold ornaments, including tax benefits, especially for handcrafted gold ornaments.

Gold ornament makers would also be given subsidies for exporting gold items, be it handcrafted or machine made.

Duty benefits would be given to exporters who would import bars and then export gold ornaments.

Land would also be allotted to exporters for setting up factories in special economic zones.

Bangladesh Bank would set up a central information bureau that would keep information on the annual demand for gold, its local trade, import and export, revenue collection, seizure of gold, its sale on auction, and other relevant data.

MAKING OF POLICY The finance ministry last year

requested the Transparency International Bangladesh (TIB) to come up with recommendations for formulating a gold policy. Later, the finance ministry sent the recommendations to the com-

merce ministry that formed a nine-

member committee with representatives from the Federation of Bangladesh Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FBCCI), the TIB, gold traders, and related ministries and agencies. The committee then formulated

the draft policy and in May the cabinet committee on economic affairs approved and forwarded it to the cabinet.

CABINET DECISIONS

The cabinet yesterday also approved Customs Act, 2018, and the National Environment Policy, 2018.

The cabinet secretary said in 1992 the first National Environment Policy was enacted where 15 sectors were identified for preservation. The number now has been increased to 24, including land management, water resource management, hill preservation, protection of environment through public private partnership initiative.
