



TERRY-HENRY TO MANAGE VILLA?

Thierry Henry has emerged as the leading contender to become Aston Villa's new manager, with John Terry tipped to be his number two. The Arsenal legend revealed in the summer he was preparing to enter management after ending his time as a pundit for Sky Sports. He had been combining his work in the media with his role as part of Roberto Martinez's backroom staff with the Belgium national team since 2016. Now Henry is poised to get his chance at Villa Park, with reports that he has been offered the chance to succeed Steve Bruce. Bruce was axed by the Championship club earlier this week after a woeful run of just one win from ten games. His reported number two, Terry, made 32 appearances for Villa last season after his 19-year spell at Stamford Bridge came to an end and helped them reach the Championship play-off final, where they lost to Fulham.

Mahrez costs City 2 points

Manchester City's record signing Riyad Mahrez blazed

an 86th-minute penalty over the bar to preserve Liverpool's unbeaten Premier League record as both sides failed to lay down an early marker in the title race with a disappointing 0-0 draw at Anfield.

City remain top of the table on goal difference, but both teams are now locked with Chelsea -- who cantered to a 3-0 win earlier at Southampton -- on 20 points from eight games.

Unlike the four enthralling encounters between the two last season when Liverpool beat the English champions three times, a highly-anticipated clash fell flat with neither side managing to register a shot on target until after the hour mark.

City had the golden chance four minutes from time when substitute Leroy Sane was upended by Virgil van Dijk and referee Martin Atkinson pointed to the spot after waving away two earlier strong appeals from the visitors for a penalty.

"It is not smart to dive in there," Van Dijk told Sky Sports. "It was a penalty and it shouldn't have happened, but I'm very happy we didn't concede."

"We were unlucky not to score, and lucky not to concede as well, so I think we cancelled each other out. It was a tough game against the champions and I'm happy we kept the clean sheet," he added.

With Sergio Aguero replaced on the hour mark, Mahrez, a £60-million signing from Leicester in July, took responsi-

Kovac rues mistakes

Bayern now winless in four

Head coach Niko Kovac said individual mistakes are at the heart of Bayern Munich's slump after they crashed to a 3-0 Bundesliga defeat at home to Borussia Moenchengladbach, leaving them fifth in the table.

After losing 2-0 at Hertha Berlin a week ago and drawing 1at home to Ajax in the Champions League on Wednesday, Bayern are winless in their last four matches in all competitions. The defending champions were 2-0 down against

Gladbach after 16 minutes, leaking early goals to Alassane Plea and club captain Lars Stindl, before Patrick Herrmann added a late third on Saturday. Kovac is under pressure with Bayern now four points

behind league leaders Borussia Dortmund and out of the Champions League places, which will displease chairman Karl-Heinz Rummenigge and president Uli Hoeness. "I had their support after the first seven games (when

Bayern were undefeated), so I assume I still have it, but at the end, I am not the one who can answer that," said Kovac. "I have said a few words to the team, but that should stay in the dressing room. We are making too many individual mistakes. "Everyone is trying, but at the moment we are not bring-

ing it together on the pitch. You have to act as a unit, but we conceded three goals from their three goals."

To compound Bayern's problems, left-back and dead-ball specialist David Alaba limped off in the second half with a leg injury. "It could be a tear, from what he signalled," said Kovac.

With Juan Bernat having been sold to Paris Saint-Germain and Rafinha out injured, Bayern are down to just one fit wing-back in Joshua Kimmich. "This is exactly what I feared would happen," admitted Kovac.

Bayern captain Manuel Neuer was at a loss to explain the slump. "We started well, but conceded two goals and ended up chasing the game," he said. "You can see that we all want it, but we didn't take the big chances which came our way."

Zinedine Zidane is unlikely to be the next Manchester United manager as the Premier League does not appeal to him, according to his agent.

The former Real Madrid boss, who won three consecutive Champions Leagues at the Santiago Bernabeu, is widely considered the favourite to succeed Jose Mourinho if he leaves Old Trafford.

Reports in England have claimed Zidane has been in touch with United executives and may even have been asked to snub any other job opportunities in order to wait for the chance to replace Mourinho. However, his representative, who described the former

France star as "mentally exhausted" following his time at Madrid, does not expect him to move to England's top flight. "I don't think he will manage in England," Alain

Migliaccio told Le Journal Du Dimanche. "It doesn't fit his style. "I talked to him. It doesn't really appeal to him. He decided to take a sabbatical year. He will not get into man-




