'VERBALLY' INVITE THEM

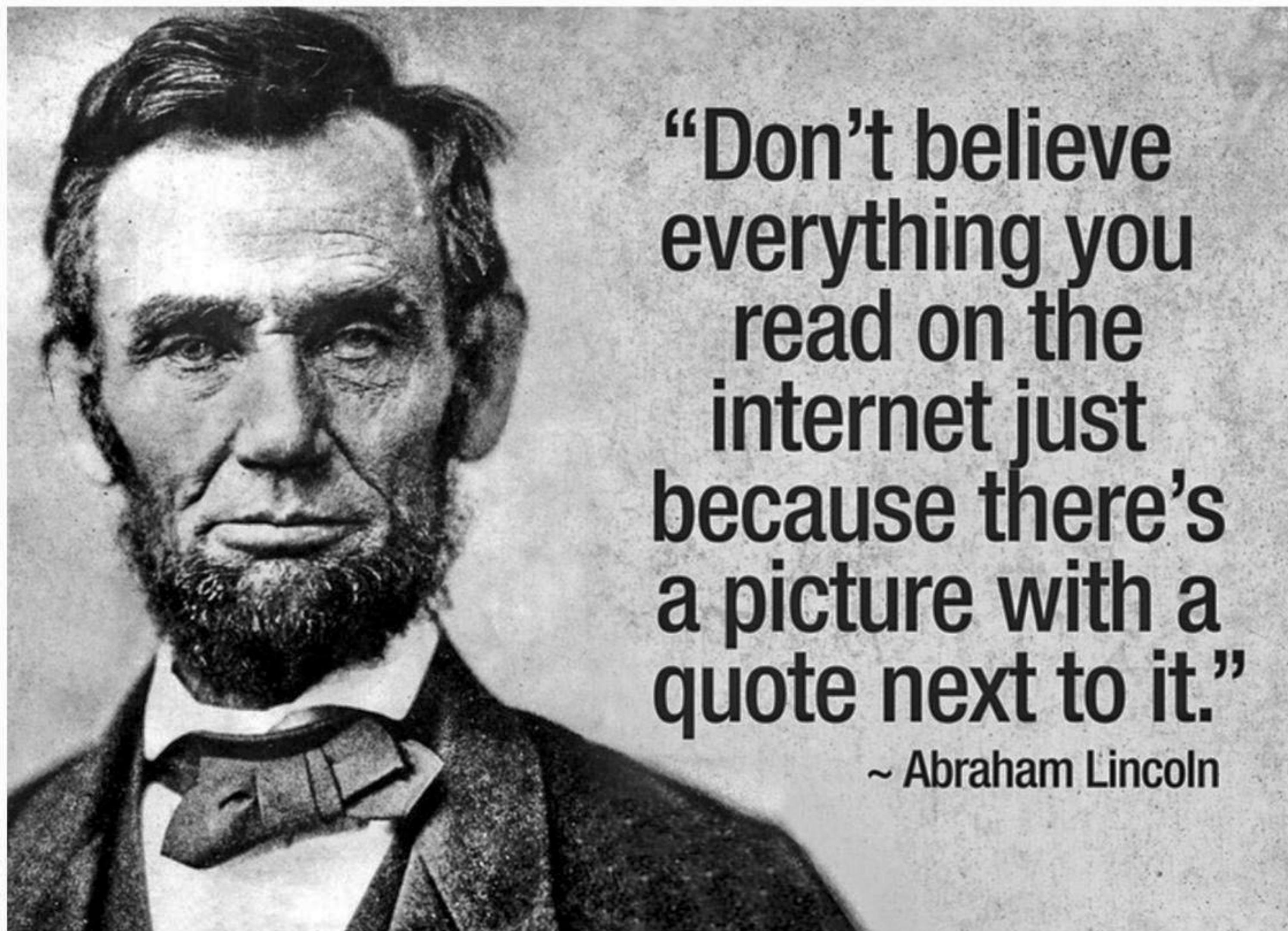
