Held at the Galerie Zoom in Alliance Francaise de Dhaka, the exhibition is open to all till October 19. It is a resultant of a 21-day workshop conducted by artist Shadia Sharmin at the art academy. The children of Moonsez Art Academy were able to experience Bangladesh in a very different yet familiar way by looking at the stamps and be inspired to construct their own versions of the stamps. Participants also received recognition for their work.


